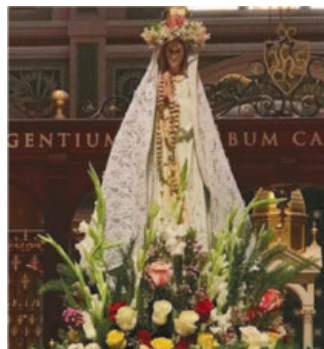

Pilgrims of Hope: Alleluia! Resurrexit Sicut Dixit! Alleluia!

Jesus' appearances after His resurrection are not just a proof of God's power in raising Jesus from the dead. They are also a sign to us that someday OUR bodies will be raised from the dead. 1 Corinthians 15:20-22 says, "Christ is now raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. ... For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life." The risen Christ gives hope to all of us that someday He will come again, judge all people, and we will be raised in body and soul. Instead of just showing His power in a grand and obvious way, God showed His almighty power by humbling His Son more than any other man. (See CCC 272.) The way in which God chose to reveal His power teaches us all that we should trust in His promises, even when it appears that He is not working in the way we expect. By remembering that God fulfilled His promise in Jesus, we can all trust that God will fulfill His promise in us.

Focus of the Gospel:

The Mass Readings for Divine Mercy Sunday Year C highlight Jesus' incredible love and mercy for humanity. The readings emphasize the power of God working through His children, the need to let go of doubts and embrace the mysteries of God, and the importance of sharing the message of Jesus' love and mercy with others. In the Gospel, John describes how the disciples are locked away in an upper room, "for fear of the Jews." Jesus appears to them, offering peace and showing his wounds. They are empowered by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost) and are given the authority to forgive sins, and they are filled with joy. Thomas, however, was not with them, and doubted the testimony of the disciples. Jesus appears again to them, and gives Thomas the opportunity to touch and see that what was said of Him was true, leading to Thomas to make a proclamation of faith, "My Lord and my God!" We are challenged to live out the mercy we receive from God. By trusting in Jesus, seeking forgiveness, and loving one another, we can be signs of God's loving mercy in our world.

Enfoque del evangelio:

Las Lecturas de la Misa del Domingo de la Divina Misericordia Año C destacan el increíble amor y misericordia de Jesús por la humanidad. Las lecturas subrayan el poder de Dios que actúa a través de sus hijos, la necesidad de abandonar las dudas y abrazar los misterios de Dios, y la importancia de compartir el mensaje del amor y la misericordia de Jesús con los demás. En el Evangelio, Juan describe cómo los discípulos están encerrados en un aposento alto, «por miedo a los judíos». Jesús se les aparece, ofreciéndoles melocotón y mostrando sus heridas. Reciben la efusión del Espíritu Santo (Pentecostés) y la autoridad para perdonar pecados, y se llenan de alegría. Tomás, sin embargo, no está con ellos y duda del testimonio de los discípulos. Jesús se les aparece de nuevo, y le da a Tomás la oportunidad de tocar y ver que lo que se decía de Él era verdad, lo que lleva a Tomás a hacer una proclamación de fe: «¡Señor mío y Dios mío!». Se nos desafía a vivir la misericordia que recibimos de Dios. Confiando en Jesús, buscando el perdón y amándonos los unos a los otros, podemos ser signos de la misericordia amorosa de Dios en nuestro mundo.

OCIA: Beyond Easter

A Time of Mystagogy

This weekend we celebrate the new life given to thirteen souls who were baptized at Easter Vigil and another twelve fully received into the Catholic Church. Many times we are tempted to look at these stages as a "completion" but in reality they are a new beginning. As they enter a new phase of formation, they are called "neophytes", or "newly planted" in their faith. Over the next year they will continue to grow and unpack what has begun in them last night. Between now and Pentecost in particular, we will journey in a period of "mystagogy", or a teaching of the mysteries that they have experienced. Our faith is a sacred ground, with its truths shrouded in mysteries that cannot fully be explained, but only over time is revealed to us.

The distinctive spirit and power of the period of mystagogy derive from the new, personal experience of the sacraments and of the community.

READING 1 ACTS 10:34A, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said:

“You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. 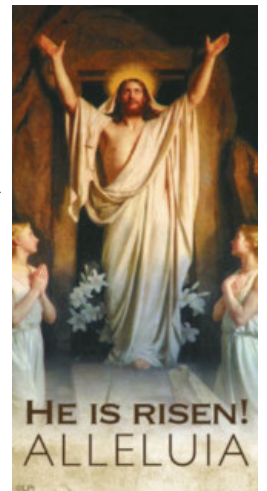

GOSPEL JN 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, “They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him.” So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.
