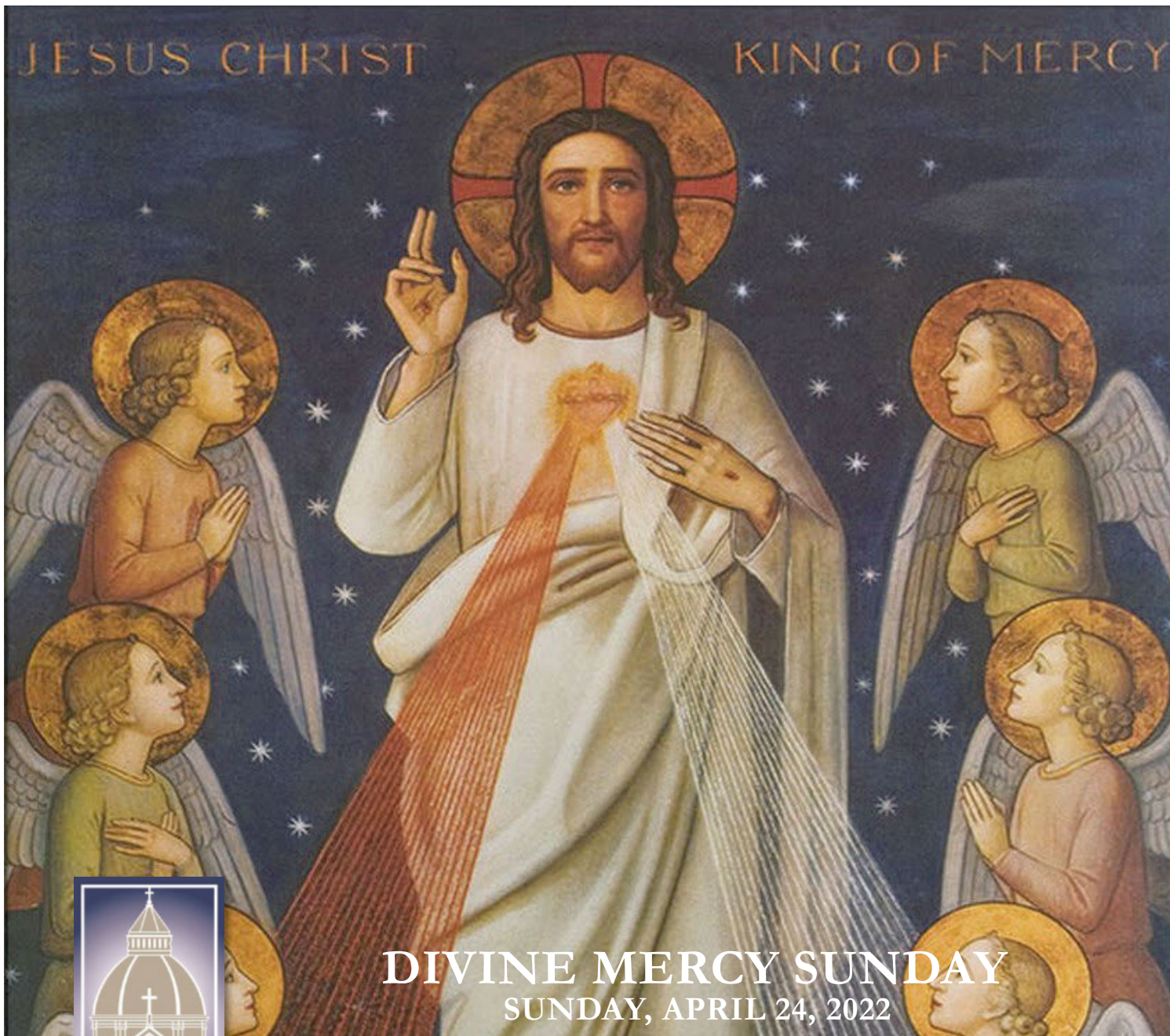

## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today, the Second Sunday of Easter, is Divine Mercy Sunday. Our Gospel reading from St. John is often called the story of “Doubting Thomas” but the passage involves so much more than the encounter with the skeptical apostle. It is rich with lessons of Christ’s mercy to all, including an encouraging word from our Lord especially for us, His modern-day disciples.


While Thomas traditionally takes all the bad rap for his doubts, we see that none of the Apostles were at their best when Christ first appeared to them after His resurrection. They were actually in hiding, cowering behind a locked door, paralyzed by fear and doubt.

But Jesus appeared right in their midst in spite of the lock on the door. Was it to rebuke them for their lack of faith? Quite the contrary.

He comes on a mission of mercy. He comes to offer them peace and the restoration of their relationship with Him. And even more, He commissions them to become ministers of His mercy, by giving them authority to forgive sins. At that moment Christ gives to all of us the supreme gift of mercy — the sacrament of Reconciliation. What a precious and powerful gift!


This Sunday is a perfect time to reflect on how well we make use of this gift. Do we really appreciate its healing power? Could we become better stewards of this gift by going to Confession more often? We must also reflect on how well we extend mercy to others as Jesus did to Thomas that day.

Let’s commit ourselves to becoming faithful disciples and stewards of Christ’s mercy. We will be those very ones to whom Jesus gave a “shout out” during His encounter with Thomas: “Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed” — in His merciful love.

## Divine Mercy Sunday April 24

The Sunday after Easter is Divine Mercy Sunday. In 1931, Sister Faustina saw a vision of Jesus with light streaming out of His heart. He told her to have a painting made of what she saw with the words "Jesus I trust in You," and that the Sunday after Easter should be devoted to His mercy, He taught her a prayer called the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

# PASTOR'S CORNER

*“Blessed are those  
who have not seen  
and have believed.”*

*John 20:29*

As I write this, it is Holy Thursday and I and members of the parish are in adoration as we conclude this first day of the Triduum and prepare to repose the Blessed Sacrament in a room away from the world. We are entering more deeply into the darkness that will be tomorrow. Good Friday hardly seems to be “good”. We clearly see how “not good” we are. We see how blind and selfish we can be when faced with the truth that is Christ. We might like to think that the darkness of Good Friday was some distant event that took place almost two thousand years ago. Yet today, we still don’t admit our own human weakness nor accept the greatness of God. We still desire to kill God and to become gods. Good Friday must always be one of the most important days of our year.

As you read this, it is Divine Mercy Sunday and the Second Sunday of the Season of Easter. We have passed through the most solemn days of the Triduum and arrive at this great time of resurrection and new life. Christ’s mercy is truly upon us as we admit how undeserving we are and how gracious He is. However, we can never fully understand the depth of Christ’s love for us. It takes our awareness of the darkness of Good Friday to shed light on the beauty of Divine Mercy.

It is becoming the practice that a novena for Divine Mercy begins on Good Friday. I believe this is an error. To continue this practice diminished the awareness of these most solemn days of the Triduum and makes Divine Mercy Sunday the end result when of course, the entire Easter season and Pentecost are the end result.

I’m sure the church over the years will work these things out, in the meantime, we need to keep our understanding of these important days free of novenas and rushing around for indulgences. Rather, let us simply celebrate the mercy of Jesus that is ever-present.

Mientras escribo esto, es Jueves Santo y yo y los miembros de la parroquia estamos en adoración mientras concluimos este primer día del Triduo y nos preparamos para reposar el Santísimo Sacramento en una habitación lejos del mundo. Estamos entrando más profundamente en la oscuridad que será mañana. El Viernes Santo difícilmente parece ser “bueno”. Vemos claramente lo “no bueno” que somos. Vemos cuán ciegos y egoístas podemos ser frente a la verdad que es Cristo. Nos gustaría pensar que la oscuridad del Viernes Santo fue algún evento lejano que tuvo lugar hace casi dos mil años. Sin embargo, hoy todavía no admitimos nuestra propia debilidad humana ni aceptamos la grandeza de Dios. Todavía deseamos matar a Dios y convertirnos en dioses. El Viernes Santo debe ser siempre uno de los días más importantes de nuestro año.

Mientras lees esto, es el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia y el Segundo Domingo del Tiempo de Pascua. Hemos pasado por los días más solemnes del Triduo y llegamos a este gran tiempo de resurrección y vida nueva. La misericordia de Cristo está verdaderamente sobre nosotros cuando admitimos cuán indignos somos y cuán misericordioso es Él. Sin embargo, nunca podremos comprender completamente la profundidad del amor de Cristo por nosotros. Se necesita nuestra conciencia de la oscuridad del Viernes Santo para arrojar luz sobre la belleza de la Divina Misericordia.

Se está convirtiendo en práctica que una novena a la Divina Misericordia comience el Viernes Santo. Creo que esto es un error. Continuar con esta práctica disminuyó la conciencia de estos días tan solemnes del Triduo y hace que el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia sea el resultado final cuando, por supuesto, todo el tiempo de Pascua y Pentecostés son el resultado final.

Estoy seguro de que la iglesia a lo largo de los años resolverá estas cosas, mientras tanto, debemos mantener nuestra comprensión de estos días importantes libres de novenas y prisas por las indulgencias. Más bien, simplemente celebremos la misericordia de Jesús que está siempre presente.

## Divine Mercy

In today's Gospel we hear about the first time that Jesus came to the Apostles after He rose from the dead. He breathed on them and told them that they had the power to forgive sins. Jesus had just given us the Sacrament of Confession- now a priest could take God's place to hear our sins and tell us that we are forgiven.

Today, the second Sunday of Easter, is also the feast of Divine Mercy. Mercy means being treated well even though we don't deserve it. God is so merciful that He wants to forgive ALL our sins, no matter how bad. All we have to do is be sorry and go to Confession.

God's Divine Mercy is so great that even the worst sinner in the world can be saved from Hell if he asks for it. But even our little sins hurt Jesus, so we need to ask God for mercy too. Don't ever imagine that God can't forgive you when you are sorry- remember, Jesus died on the cross so that you would be able to go to Heaven!

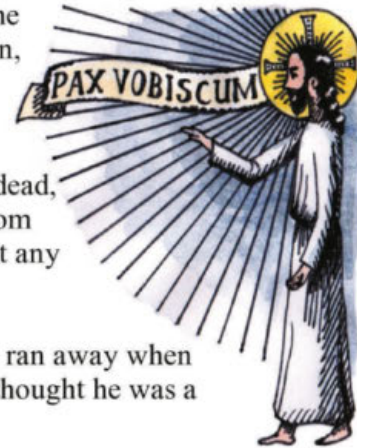

A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 19

Has anyone found out that many Christians do not have any differences after hearing the gospel? One of the main reasons is that the message goes in the left ear and immediately goes out through the right ear. As a result, the precious message of Jesus is not kept in the heart.

The death and resurrection of Jesus is not about drinking a cup of coffee and eating a piece of cake, rather, about people's eternal life.

In fact, the disciples did not pay attention to the words of Jesus when he said: "the Son of man will be delivered to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death, and deliver him to the Gentiles to be mocked and scourged and crucified, and he will be raised on the third day."

After speaking these, the mother of Zebedee's two sons came to Jesus and asked, "Command that these two sons of mine may sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your kingdom" The other disciples were then angry: "when the ten heard it, they were indignant at the two brothers."

Both the mother and the disciples completely ignored Jesus' paschal mystery by overwhelming with vain glory and anger.

Seeing this, Jesus continued, "even as the Son of man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

The verb "serve" (diakonēsai) denotes the people who become servants as to serve the master or to take care of household chores. Jesus used this verb to explain the true meaning of the incarnation of the Word of God that he will serve people with his own death and resurrection, so that they will be saved by following Jesus into eternal life.

The other verb "give" (dounai) is to die. Here this verb includes violence which describes what happened to Jesus: "they will condemn him to death, and deliver him to the Gentiles to be mocked and scourged and crucified."

"Ransom" (lytron) this term means liberation from the misery and penalty of people's sins.

How do Jesus' death and resurrection redeem sinners as a ransom?

Faith! Whoever participates in the life of Jesus and dies his/her sins with Jesus' death, will be raised up with him. Likewise, whoever rejects Jesus will die eternally as those who crucified him.

The death of Jesus is to put the death of the world to death with his resurrection.

耶穌說：“人子要被交於司祭和經師，他們要定他的死罪；並且要把他交給外邦人戲弄、鞭打、釘死；但第三天，他要復活。”

話說完不久，載伯德兒子的母親就前來要求耶穌：“你叫我的這兩個兒子，在你王國內，一個坐在你的右邊，一個坐在你的左邊。”

門徒看到生氣：“那十個聽了，就惱怒他們兩兄弟。”

無論是這位母親或門徒，都完全漠視耶穌的逾越奧跡

耶穌繼續說：“就如人子來不是受服事，而是服事人，並交出自己的生命，為大眾作贖價。”

“服事” (diakonēsai) 是成為僕人去伺候主人或打理家務，耶穌用這動詞闡釋天主聖言降生成人的真正意義，就是他將以自己的死亡復活伺候人們，好讓他們因跟隨耶穌而進入永生。

死亡，就是交出生命；“交出” (dounai) 這裡包含暴力，說明耶穌的遭遇：交給外邦人戲弄、鞭打以及釘死。

“贖價” (lytron) 意即將人從罪惡痛苦和懲罰中解放出來。

耶穌的死亡復活，如何將罪人救贖？

信德，誰參與耶穌的生命，將自己罪惡與耶穌同死，也會與他同生；同樣，誰拒絕耶穌，如同釘死他的人一樣，永死。

耶穌的死亡，就是以他的復活，置世界的死亡，於死亡
