Stewardship Reflection

So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." Talk about setting the bar high!

This verse at the end of today's Gospel passage from Matthew sets the tone for all of the readings this week.

The stewardship way of life, giving away the best of our time, talents and treasure to God for His glory and for the sake of others, is the path to holiness. Yet, it appears utterly foolish in the eyes of many.

Our Lord gives us several illustrations today of this "foolish" concept: "When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well... love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." This is the kind of action and attitude that will make us "children of our heavenly Father." This is the high bar of holiness to which our Lord is calling us.

If your lifestyle and your priorities look a little foolish to the world around you, know that you're probably doing it right in God's eyes. At the same time, you will be filled with a peace that the world around you desperately needs. And your stewardship way of life may just draw those around to the heavenly Father and a life of holiness, too.

So, with God's grace, we can confidently press on in the stewardship way of life, aiming to be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect. Our all-holy God desires it and deserves nothing less.

Pastor's Corner

Today is our last Sunday before we begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday this week. The word "Lent" itself comes from old English and means "springtime." So in many ways Lent, rather than being practiced as an austere and dry season, is more of a time for Spring cleaning. There are three common practices encouraged during Lent to help with this cleaning.

Prayer. We begin with a spiritual cleaning involving prayer. Prayer is simply a conversation with God, or an activity that helps us be in His presence. This includes being present at Mass, praying the Rosary, reading the Bible, journaling, speaking to God, and of course listening to Him. It is not complicated but requires removal of interior distractions and desires that pull us away from these activities. The hardest part about prayer is resolving to do it. To help get us started on this spiritual cleansing, celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation (go to Confession!) is a great way to begin.

Fasting. Along with our spiritual cleansing is a physical one. We clean up our lives. Start putting all our clutter away. Organize a little and throw away a lot. Fasting is the opposite of feasting. We live in a society full of feasting, never feeling satisfied. Anything that distracts us from conversing with God (our prayer) should be diminished or removed. Fasting requires letting go of things and making major changes to your life-style; less food, less television, less internet, less alcohol, less spending. Fasting prepares our space for prayer and opens our eyes to the needs of the poor.

Almsgiving. The third Lenten practice is reaching out to the needs of the poor. Our faith always demands that we embrace our brothers and sisters. This embrace is particularly directed towards the poor and needy. God desires that all His children be united. What we offer to the least of our brothers and sisters we offer to God. Our prayer and fasting impel us to provide for the least, speak to the least, embrace the least. Sacrificing our time, talents, and treasure for the needs of others is what helps us receive the great feast of Easter and is a necessary part on our path to resurrection and eternal life. Good Stewardship is a beautiful part of almsgiving.

There are always ample opportunities to live out these three Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This Lent, the Cathedral parish will help provide further resources to help enter into a deep cleaning of our lives. Of course, our Stewardship Retreat on February 25th is a great way to provide some tools to help make us clean for Easter.

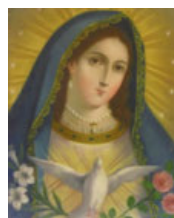

Ash Wednesday



This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, which is the first day of Lent. Lent is a special time in which we prepare to celebrate Jesus' death and resurrection on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.



Lent is a time of repentance. We make sacrifices and try to improve our lives to become more like Jesus. Jesus never sinned but He gave up His life to pay for our sins. That is why we make sacrifices—out of love for God and to make up for our sins. We offer our sacrifices to God the Father, just as Jesus on the cross offered up His life to God the Father.

On Ash Wednesday if you go to Mass you can receive ashes on your forehead. The ashes are a sign of repentance. They remind us that without God we are nothing and that someday we will die and be buried. But they can also remind us that if we do have God living in us, after we die we will rise from the dead, just as Jesus did on Easter, after He died on the cross.



Family Bible Moment

Last Sunday we reflected on this week's Gospel from Matthew 5:38-48, Jesus challenged us to love our enemies. Looking ahead to next week—1st Sunday of Lent—we walk with Jesus in the desert as He allows himself to be tempted by the devil.

Read next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 4:1-11

Jesus goes into the desert to pray and prepare:

- Jesus was lead into the desert by the Spirit to be tempted by the devil. By doing so he gives example of how we too can fight and conquer our temptations.
- He fasted for 40 days and nights, and naturally was hungry.
- He was tempted in three ways:
 - * Physical/Bodily (listen to your feelings of hunger and turn these stones into bread). Use of power for his own gain.
 - * Spiritual Authority (throw yourself down and God will save you). Demand God to protect us even when we put ourselves in harm's way.
 - * Power (promise of power if he worships the devil) The temptation to false worship in exchange for a good, or a compromise.

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥 61 (Luke 路 13:1-9)

Many Christians have struggled to understand why tragedy seems to befall innocent people but to the contrary, good luck bestows on the bad. In addition, they are taught that God will punish them if they misbehave themselves. As a result, people repent only because of the threat of divine retribution, not transforming their lives toward God's kingdom. This has become the popular norm of the faithful.

Today, Jesus uses two local tragedies to teach us about our need for repentance and of a renewal of life. Jesus presented these two real incidents as one tragedy, i.e. unwilling to repent is the worst tragedy of life. Moreover, the natural assumption at the time was to think that the victims were particularly guilty and must have somehow deserved it.

Jesus connected his warning to people's rejection of God as well as the Jews interpreted this tragedy as God's punishment of the workers who had cooperated with Pilate in his sacrilegious aqueduct project. Jesus denied that either the Galileans or the eighteen people suffered because of their sins. Whoever rejected repentance would finally die eternally since the repentance theme is a major emphasis in Luke's gospel (3:3; 3:8; 5:32; 13:3, 5; 15:7; 16:30; 17:3; 24:47).

Jesus' life is the clearest evidence that a person's suffering is not proof of that person's sin. While sin can lead to tragedy, not every tragedy is the result of sin. Jesus invited us to such repentance that "metanoia" this Greek verb implies not just regret for the past but a radical conversion and a complete change in our way of life as we respond and open ourselves to the love of God.

Repentance, or a turning away from one path to another, is not so much finding God as being found by God. It helps us in life and in death; in addition, it also reminds people of living as forgiven people. Finally, it encourages Christians to face death without fear. We cannot see Jesus in all his fullness unless we look at him through the lens of repentance. Repentance, thus, teaches us how to die in order to know how to live.

為什麼好人遭遇悲劇？惡人卻榮華富貴？

很多人簡單回答：天注定，人還是乖乖聽天由命

有否想過：天主是否很殘忍？為什麼祂給好人降下災禍？有人回答：這是天主給人的考驗，看他們是否在磨難當中依然保持信德。

如果要考驗，為什麼耶穌在十字架上，寬恕罪人，包括釘死他的虛假宗教領導？

如果基督徒信仰水平，還是停留在天主考驗或懲罰，悔改只是為了免下地獄，不是跟隨耶穌，那麼，耶穌的死亡復活，還是被人糟蹋漠視。

福音當中，耶穌用兩個當地發生的悲劇，來教導群眾無論在任何情況下，都需悔改更新。首先，比拉多屠殺加里肋亞人，是為擾亂他們的宗教聚會。另一次，比拉多殺死許多抗議的加里肋亞猶太人，因為他們反對他從聖殿的金庫挪用資金在耶路撒冷建造高架渠。

儘管殘暴行為是比拉多下令實施的，但當時的人自然假設受害者特別有罪，活該。耶穌繼續警告群眾，被壓死的十八人，不是天主因為這些工人跟比拉多合作進行褻瀆神明的渡槽工程而遭到天主懲罰，而是呼籲群眾悔改，以免他們為自己的罪而永遠喪亡。

悔改是路加福音主題之一（參3:3, 8; 5:32; 13:3, 5; 15:7; 16:30; 17:3; 24:47）。“悔改”（metanoia）不僅意味著悔恨過去罪惡生活，更重要的，是在天主面前赤裸裸的打開自己丑陋的人生，不是讓天主懲罰，而是給天主疼愛，因而徹底改變罪惡生活方式。

耶穌的死亡，不是因為他罪有應得，因此，善人遭遇天災人禍，無論是自然或人為，雖然死的冤枉，可是，死亡的概念不是一般人的看法；義人的死亡在耶穌內，是進入復活的門檻。雖然犯罪導致悲劇，但並非所有悲劇都是罪的結果。

耶穌重點不在於如何死去，而是死，要在悔改當中，無論人生如何順利或坎坷，悔改之後獲得永生，最重要。

悔改，與其說是找到天主，不如說是被天主找到。
