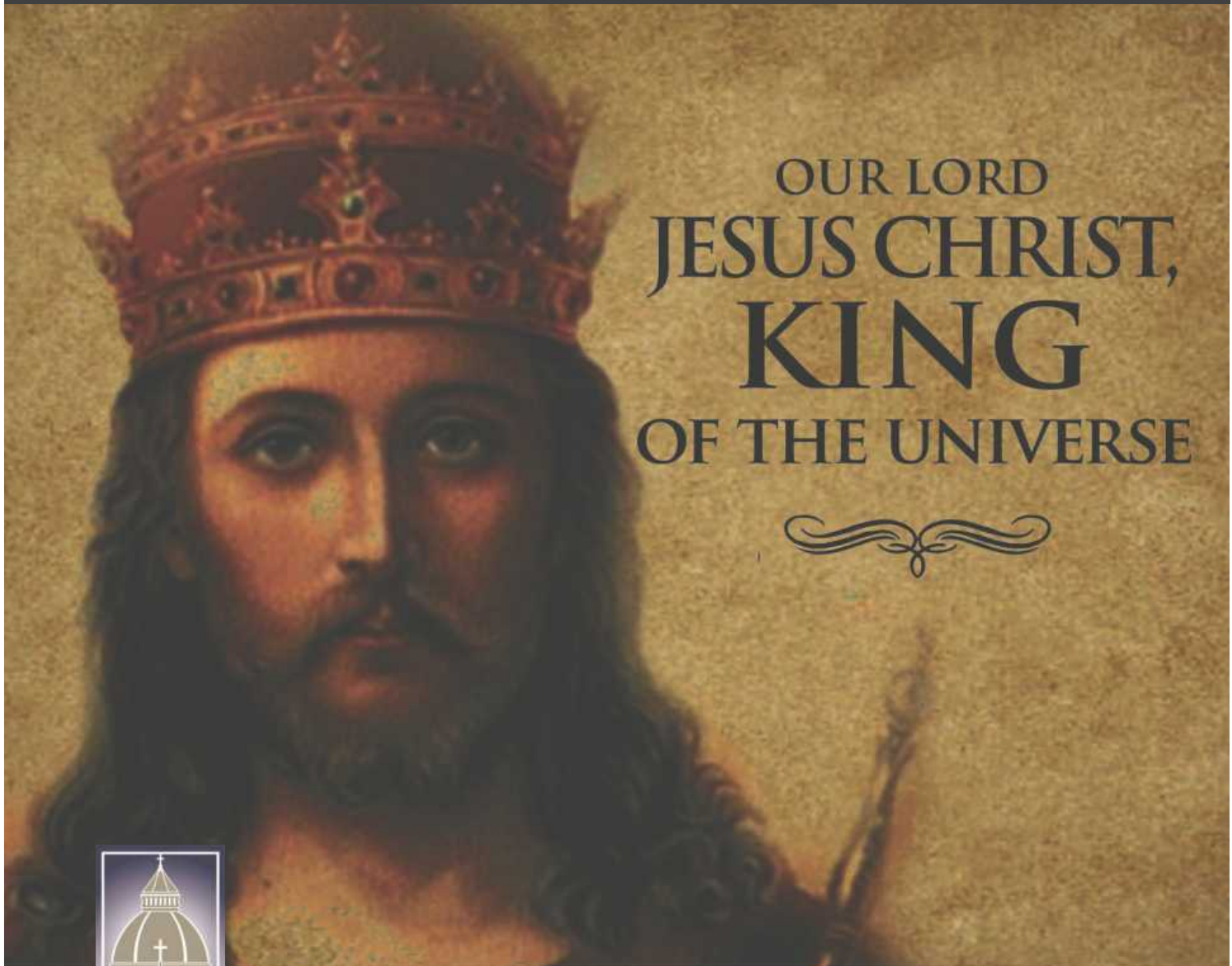

Stewardship Reflection

Today we come to the end of the liturgical year, celebrating the magnificent feast of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Our readings provide contrasting images of this King of ours — He has authority over all, and yet, He is humble and tender in His care for us, especially the most vulnerable.

How can we properly honor and love such a King? By offering Him our very lives through the stewardship way of life.

The Gospel passage from Matthew shows us how. The passage begins with Christ's own description of His Second Coming, "When the Son of Man comes in his glory and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him." Then the moment of judgment will come. Some will be invited into the Kingdom of Heaven — the others to eternal punishment.

This judgment will be based not on how influential we became in society, how high we climbed the corporate ladder, or any "worldly" achievements. Rather our judgment will be based on how we treated the least of those around us, whom Jesus calls His brothers. "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me." To make His point very clear, Jesus gives specifics — feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, showing hospitality to the stranger, and caring for the ill and imprisoned.

The more deeply we embrace the stewardship way of life, the more closely our priorities will align with His.

TODAY: Commissioning of Liturgical Ministers

Each year we commission those who serve our Lord and our Cathedral Parish through Liturgical Ministry. The ministry members commissioned this weekend are specifically from the liturgical ministries--directly or indirectly. They operate under the direction of the Liturgy Committee as commissioned and directed by the pastor.

Today, we will recognize and pray for those who serve as Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Greeters/Ushers, Lectors, Music Ministers, Sacristans, and Ministers of Hospitality, as well as those who serve on the Liturgy Committee and those responsible for the Liturgical Environment.

Q. Why is Advent the beginning to the Liturgical year?

A. The liturgical year is one of the ways the church remembers and celebrates the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The prayers and Scripture readings of Advent help us to prepare for Christmas, when Christ's first coming is celebrated, and also for Christ's final coming at the end of time. While Advent is the first of the liturgical seasons in chronological order, it is not the first in theological significance. That preeminence belongs to the Paschal Triduum: "the sacred Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord shines forth as the high point of the entire liturgical year".

READING 1

EZ 34:11-12, 15-17

Thus says the Lord GOD:

I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord GOD. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly.

As for you, my sheep, says the Lord GOD, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats.

When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.' Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

Entonces dirá también a los de su izquierda: ‘Apártense de mí, malditos; vayan al fuego eterno, preparado para el diablo y sus ángeles; porque estuve hambriento y no me dieron de comer, sediento y no me dieron de beber, era forastero y no me hospedaron, estuve desnudo y no me vistieron, enfermo y encarcelado y no me visitaron’.

Entonces ellos le responderán: ‘Señor, ¿cuándo te vimos hambriento o sediento, de forastero o desnudo, enfermo o encarcelado y no te asistimos?’ Y él les replicará: ‘Yo les aseguro que, cuando no lo hicieron con uno de aquellos más insignificantes, tampoco lo hicieron conmigo’. Entonces irán éstos al castigo eterno y los justos a la vida eterna”.

Whatever you do to others...

Jesus is a fair king. In today's Gospel reading, He tells us how He will judge people at the end of time. Those who were good to God will be saved, and those who were not good to Him will be condemned. Whoever is good to others is good to God, and whoever is unkind to others is unkind to God.



Our Lord cares so much about His people that He will judge us according to how we treat each other. Jesus is the Good Shepherd and the King, and He cares about every one of us specially. Imagine a king who came to see every one of his subjects to make sure that they were doing okay. Well, Jesus does more than that- He died for us on the cross! He looks after us all the time, and He says that anyone who is unkind to us will be judged as being unkind to Him.



Christ the King is the just judge. How do you think you will be judged when you die, or at the end of time? Are you kind to others? Do you ever think about how you would treat Jesus if He were here? Do you treat other people the way you would treat Jesus?

Gospel Focus:

Next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent—*which from the latin “advenire” means “to come to”*. It is a four-week season leading up to Christmas. This is a time of preparation that guides our hearts to celebrating the Birth of Jesus at Christmas. In this first week we will focus on be ready, reflecting on our hearts, and our longing—and need—for a Savior. We are reminded of our need, and that we must turn our gaze to His holy face, and there, find the key of Salvation. Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus!

St Leo the Great

Leo was born in Italy about 400 years after Jesus ascended into heaven. Ordained a deacon in the Church, he was later unanimously elected pope in 440. As pope, he was successor to St. Peter. Leo was a good model of a shepherd of the flock the Church: He guided the Church by guardin the truths of the Faith. During Leo’s time, there were many errors about Jesus begin spread throughout the Church, but Pope Leo was deteminded to teach the Truth of the Catholic faith handed down from the apostles. One of the most important truths he explained was how Jesus was fully God and fully Man, and that He died to save us from our sins. He also met with Attila the Hun, a conquerer convincing him to leave Rome alone, which he did. He died in 461 and was buried in Rome near the bones of St. Peter. In his actions and his writings, he shows how important it is to guard the truths of Christ and remain faithful to the Church. St Leo, pray for us!



San Leon el Grande

Leo nació en Italia unos 400 años después de que Jeuss ascendiera al cielo. Ordenado diácono en la Iglesia, fue elegido Papa por unanimidad en el año 440. Como Papa, fue sucesor de San Pedro. León fue un buen modelo de pastor del rebaño de la Iglesia: guió a la Iglesia guardando las verdades de la Fe. Durante la época de León, muchos errores sobre Jesús comenzaron a difundirse por toda la Iglesia, pero el Papa León estaba decidido a enseñar la Verdad de la fe católica transmitida por los apóstoles. Una de las verdades más importantes que explicó fue cómo Jesús era completamente Dios y completamente Hombre, y que murió para salvarnos de nuestros pecados. También se reunió con Atila el Huno, un conquistador que lo convenció de dejar en paz a Roma, lo cual hizo. Murió en 461 y fue enterrado en Roma cerca de los huesos de San Pedro. En sus acciones y sus escritos muestra cuán importante es custodiar las verdades de Cristo y permanecer fiel a la Iglesia. ¡San León, ruega por nosotros!

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥 100 (Luke 12:39-48)

Christians need to be vigilant and ready to face God, especially our hearts because God faces our hearts every moment. One of the means for remaining alert is prayer. The most important element in prayer is listening to God's will, not telling God all our wishes.

What the best action to respond to God's love is to practice what we pray; i.e. faith, hope, and charity. It is also the most vigilant way to wait for the second coming of Jesus the Messiah. This means doing God's will by rendering humble service to others, by combating poverty, by ending the hatred that divides us, by establishing peace among individuals and nations, by curbing the pride that causes us to become confrontational, and by creating communion that respects the dignity of humans.

Jesus said, "You also must be ready; for the Son of man is coming at an unexpected hour." The adjective "ready" (hetoimoi) points to receiving someone's coming. The verb "unexpected" (ou dokeite) denotes a fact that Jesus' coming is absolutely out of people's thinking. Jesus aimed to insist that if the disciples value their lives to enter God's kingdom, lives spent holy should not be measured by sense of investment but permeation of God's grace to every second of life.

One of the most spiritual channels to wait for Jesus in daily lives is to learn seeing Jesus in the least of our brothers and sisters. In other words, we must be prepared to serve Jesus in whatever form he takes. What we frequently discover in serving other people is that God comes to us through them and at the same time, we are serving God in our vigilance of life.

基督徒需要保持醒悟並準備好面對天主，特別是心靈，因為天主每時每刻都在看顧我們的心。保持警醒的方法之一是祈禱，祈禱最重要的，是聆聽主的旨意，而不是對天主嘮叨來道去。

回應主愛最好行動，是實踐祈禱內容，即信望愛三德，這也是等待默西亞耶穌再來的最佳醒悟方式；意味著透過謙卑為人服務、消除貧窮、結束仇恨、建立和平、排除驕傲以及尊重他人，是大同，即在天主旨意之內共融。

耶穌說：“你們也要準備，因為在你們不料想的時刻，人子就來了。”形容詞“準備”（hetoimoi）表示迎接對方來臨；動詞“不料想”（ou dokeite）表示耶穌第二次光榮來臨完全出人意料。耶穌講這些話，目的是強調門徒要珍惜自己生命，好能進入天國，那麼，聖潔生活不是一種人生投資，而是天主恩寵滲透到生命的每分每秒。

日常生活中等待耶穌來臨最屬神途徑之一，就是在最小兄弟姊妹身上看見耶穌。換言之，必須準備好以任何方式服事臨在人間的耶穌；在服事弱小者的過程中，會發現天主透過他們來到我們身邊，同時也在醒悟當中服事耶穌。
