Stewardship Reflection

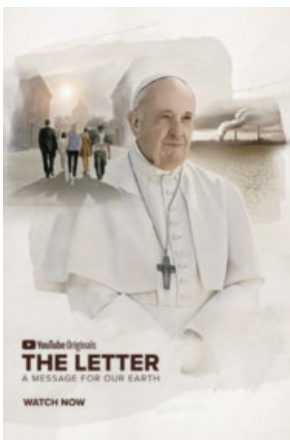
Today, we celebrate the great feast of the Ascension of our Lord, that glorious moment when Jesus, 40 days after His resurrection, was lifted up — quite literally — into heaven, as the apostles watched in stunned amazement. It is recounted in both our first reading, from Acts, as well as the Gospel passage, from Matthew. It must have been an extraordinary thing to witness.

But the first reading tells us that the apostles were not permitted to simply bask in the moment for very long. “While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, ‘Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?’”

In other words, “Don’t just stand there, do something!”

This verse is a call to each one of us Christian stewards this very day. We have been given every grace and blessing through the Mass and all of the sacraments, through the Word of God, the rich teachings of our faith, and even our talents and our material possessions.

And like those first apostles, we are not meant to just stand here but to do something with these gifts — in love and gratitude to the One Who gave them to us. We are called, just as much as the first apostles “to be [His] witnesses... to the ends of the earth,” not with our own power, but through the power of the Holy Spirit in us.

Gospel Reflection

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

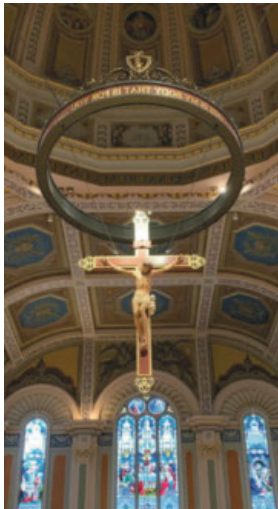
Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.

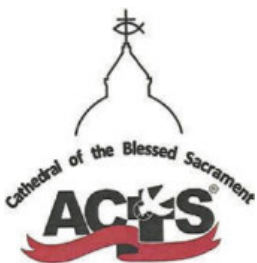

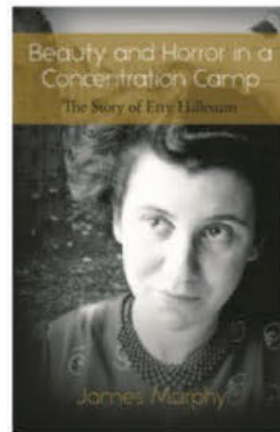

Seeking Christ in One Another By Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman

The funeral luncheon, the Irish wake, the vigil at an ailing loved one’s bedside: in times of crisis, people gather. In moments of sadness, fear, and confusion, we gravitate toward one another. For some reason, the feelings are so much more bearable when we are not alone.

I’m sure that the disciples and their companions, gathered in the upper room after the Lord’s Ascension, did all of the things we typically do at these functions. I’m sure they hugged and talked and shared food, processing together the remarkable events they had witnessed.

But we don’t hear about any of that. We hear only that they prayed — fervently, and together.

Saint John Paul II famously said that “it is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you.” And I think that, whenever we gather, in good times or in bad, we think we are seeking companionship — but we are actually seeking God.

As I think back on the last few crisis-gatherings my family has had, I try to remember when we have stopped everything to pray together. I can think of a few times, but to be honest, they are too few. We are usually occupied with more practical tasks: planning the funeral, talking to the doctor, making the decisions, ordering the food. Just trying to survive through it.

But this is the busywork of sorrow, and it is a waste of our time. We would do better to follow the example of the disciples and remember that, in these dire moments, God is waiting for us.

Family Bible Moment

In our Gospel this Sunday—this 7th Sunday of Easter—we celebrate the Ascension of Jesus into heaven, and how before Jesus returned to God the Father in Heaven, he promised to leave us an advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will be with us always in the Sacraments of the Church Looking ahead to next week, we will celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost and the coming of the promised Advocate, the Holy Spirit.

Read next Sunday's Gospel, John 20:19-23

The gospel tells us about Jesus giving the Spirit to His disciples. Our understanding of Pentecost comes from the first reading from Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11. They were hiding in the upper room, praying and waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit. This time between the Ascension of Jesus and Pentecost is traditionally a period of nine days. During the Novena, they prayed to know what to do. Jesus was no longer with them and they probably felt a little bit alone and uncertain about how to carry on the Mission of Jesus.

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥74 (Mark谷 8:14-21)

Excessive anxiety about life is actually a lack of faith. Anxiety arises every day and every hour because of the changes in the world that bring instability to one's life. Crisis of life makes people worry, and this worry itself is a warning for survival, not that negative. However, knowing that God has bestowed grace, but still worrying not enough, or even complaining that God is not paying attention, this is a lack of faith.

The disciples all witnessed Jesus' two miracles of multiplying the loaves and fish. Nevertheless, when they boarded the boat, they found out that they only had one loaf with them; they became worried and then discussed with each other about the lack of loaves.

Jesus challenged the disciples by asking: "Why do you discuss the fact that you have no bread? Do you not yet perceive or understand? Are your hearts hardened? Having eyes do you not see, and having ears do you not hear?"

Five verbs in a row, indicating that the disciples' hearts were not with Jesus, but in the world: not perceive (oupō noeite), not understand (oude syniete), hardened (pepōrōmenēn), not see (ou blepete), and not hear (ouk akouete). There is nothing greater than the death of a heart. Heart is used to describe the center of life. If the heart is hardened, life will fall into confusion. The passive participle "being hardened" (pepōrōmenēn) shows that the human heart is confused by the world, and finally, it becomes ruthless and loses the ability to understand. In short, the disciples did not feel the merciful love of Jesus, and were unable to understand him rationally.

Just as Jesus cautioned his disciples to "beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and the leaven of Herod," the disciples' slowness to Jesus' miracles and anxiety about life show that they are as unbelieving as the Pharisees and Herod. Although by the side of Jesus, the hearts of the disciples ran to the side of the devil. Where the heart is by Jesus, Jesus is there, wherever and whenever.

對生命過分焦慮，其實，是缺乏信德

焦慮每天每時都因世界變動而出現，因為變動給人帶來不穩定的生命。危機讓人擔心，本是生存警號，可是，明知天主已經賜下恩寵，還是焦慮不夠，甚至擔心天主沒有關注，這就是缺乏信德。

門徒都親眼目睹耶穌兩次增餅增魚奇蹟，可是，上船後，身邊只有一個餅，然後擔心起來，並且彼此討論沒餅。耶穌嚴厲教訓門徒，說：“為什麼你們議論沒有餅了？你們還不明白，還不了解嗎？你們的心仍然遲鈍嗎？你們有眼看不見，有耳聽不見嗎？”

連續五個動詞，說明門徒心不在耶穌，只在世界：不明白 (oupō noeite)、不了解 (oude syniete)、心遲鈍 (pepōrōmenēn)、看不見 (ou blepete) 以及聽不見 (ouk akouete)。

哀莫大於心死，心被用來形容人生中心，如果心遲鈍，人生就會墮入迷茫中。被動語態分詞“遲鈍” (pepōrōmenēn) 說明人心被世界所迷惑，變得冷酷無情以及失去理解能力，簡言之，沒有感受耶穌慈悲大愛，又不能理性明白所講道理。

如耶穌教訓門徒，要謹慎“提防法利塞人的酵母和黑落德的酵母”，門徒對耶穌奇蹟的遲鈍，以及對生命的焦慮，表示他們如法利塞人與黑落德一樣無信，雖然耶穌在身邊，心卻跑到魔鬼那邊去。

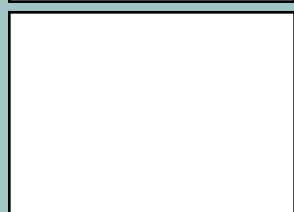

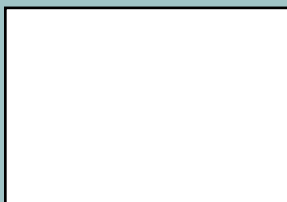

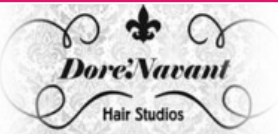
