Stewardship Reflection

The blessing included in the First Reading from the Book of Numbers is one with which most of us are familiar. "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord let His face shine upon you, and be gracious to you..." In the Jewish culture, this has been known for centuries as the Aaronic blessing as it was dictated by God Himself to Aaron. It is important to note that it begins with "The Lord bless you."

All blessings come from God. One error we make is to conclude that blessings always mean happiness or security or prosperity. God knows what blessings we need, even if we do not. The key for us is to be grateful for whatever blessings we may have. That mindset is at the hub of stewardship — knowing all blessings come from the Lord, and our need to be appreciative of them.

To be "kept" by the Lord is to turn our lives over to Him, to know that He is with us and that He loves us, blesses us, and does indeed "keep" us ever in His care. The truth is that to be blessed by God is one of the greatest gifts we can receive. It is available to all of us without exception.

During this continued Christmas season, it is well to remember and repeat the classic statement by the character Tiny Tim in Charles Dickens' immortal A Christmas Carol: "God bless us, everyone," for certainly, He does.

Liturgy & Music Corner



The New Year begins under the sign of the Holy Mother of God, under the sign of the Mother. A mother's gaze is the path to rebirth and growth. We need mothers, women who look at the world not to exploit it, but so that it can have life. Women who, seeing with the heart, can combine dreams and aspirations with concrete reality, without drifting into abstraction and sterile pragmatism. And the Church is a Mother, this is what makes the Church feminine. For this reason, we cannot find a place for women in the Church without allowing the heart of the Woman and Mother to shine. This is the place of women in the Church, the great place, from which other places, more concrete and less important, are derived. But the Church is Mother, the Church is woman. And since mothers bestow life, and women "keep" the world, let us all make greater efforts to promote mothers and to protect women. How much violence is directed against women! Enough! To hurt a woman is to insult God, who from a woman took on our humanity. He did not do it through an angel; nor did he come directly; he did it through a woman. Like a woman, the Mother Church, takes the humanity of her sons and daughters.

At the beginning of the New Year, then, let us place ourselves under the protection of this woman, the Mother of God, who is also our mother. May she help us to keep and ponder all things, unafraid of trials and with the joyful certainty that the Lord is faithful and can transform every cross into a resurrection. Today too, let us call upon her as did the People of God at Ephesus. Let us stand and, facing Our Lady as did the people of God in Ephesus, let us together repeat three times her title of Mother of God: "Holy Mother of God, Holy Mother of God, Holy Mother of God"! Amen.

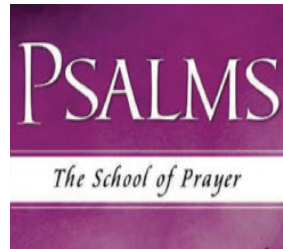

Happy Birthday Jesus! Where's my Present?

At the end of Advent, we challenged our families with a question:

How many birthday parties do we attend where everybody gets lots of presents except the one who has the Birthday?

Well, Christmas can be that way. We celebrated God's birth on Christmas, but do we give Jesus any presents? We talked about some of the presents we can give to God:

- Love, by doing good to others for God's sake
- Time, by spending time praying
- Sharing our things with others
- Remembering to care for the poor
- Doing our chores without being asked
- When someone asks for our help we do it promptly (not when we achieve the next level of our favorite game).

When the wisemen came to Jesus, they gave exquisite, expensive gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. They gave their very finest gift. As we approach the day of Epiphany (January 8th), take time to prepare a gift for the Newborn King, the Lord or Lords, the Prince of Peace, Jesus, the Son of God. What gift do you bring?

Next Sunday is the Feast of the Epiphany. We remember that the Magi, or Wise Men, visited Jesus. Let's listen to learn about their journey and what gifts they gave Jesus to honor him.

Read next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 2:1-12.

The gifts of the Magi—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—have come to be understood as symbols of Christ's royalty, divinity, and eventual suffering and death. They are special because in giving them, the Magi acknowledge who Jesus was to be: our Savior. We pray that we will acknowledge Jesus as Savior in all that we do and say. Conclude by singing together "We Three Kings."

Theotokos = God bearer

The Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D., insisted "If anyone does not confess that God is truly Emmanuel, and that on this account the holy virgin is the "Theotokos" (for according to the flesh she gave birth to the word of God become flesh by birth) let him be anathema. 🐏"

Find the other **UNO** the Sheep for the definition.

Theotokos was given a unique role in history. Having her at the start of the Julian calendar on Jan. 1 emphasizes this gift. Within the liturgical season of Christmas, when we reflect on the Incarnation, the feast of **Theotokos** (today called the "Solemnity of **Mary, Mother of God**") is to deepen the transformative Christmas gift of God becoming human. On the very first day of the new year, we are invited to place our hopes and fears under Mary's mantle of protection. Who better to entrust our day, our months, our year, our body and life to, than she who God trusted to receive and nurture His own son?

Mary, Theotokos, in this new year I entrust myself, my family, my loved ones and friends, my home and my country to your maternal protection. Amen.

How to Pray:

7. Di el "Gloria" (*Opcional: Diga la oración "Oh mi Jesús" solicitada por María en Fátima*)
8. Anuncie el próximo misterio; luego diga el "Padre Nuestro" y repita estos pasos (del 6 al 8) mientras continúa con los Misterios restantes.
9. Diga las oraciones finales: el "Ave, Santa Reina" y la "Oración final"
10. Haz la "Señal de la Cruz"

1. Make the Sign of the Cross and pray the Apostles' Creed
2. One Our Father
3. Three Hail Mary's for an increase in Faith, Hope and Love
4. Glory Be to the Father...
5. Announce the First Mystery and Pray Our Father
6. Pray 10 Hail Mary's and meditate on the mystery
7. Pray Glory Be (optional: the "Oh my Jesus" prayer of Fatima)
8. Announce the next mystery and pray an Our Father, 10 Hail Mary's and Glory be for each of the mysteries.
9. Pray the closing prayers such as Hail Holy Queen.
10. Close with the Sign of the Cross

A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 54

Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

Mary is a model of intimate relation with God. Moreover, she is also the model of the church which knows how to live and practice the Word of God.

Luke 1:39-40: Mary went to visit her cousin Elizabeth. The angel spoke to her about the pregnancy of Elizabeth and Mary; immediately, she went out of the house to help her cousin. Mary did not only have intimate relation with God but in particular with people in need.

Luke 1:41-44: The greeting of Elizabeth. The encounter of the two women manifested the gift of the Spirit which made the child jump with joy in Elizabeth's womb. Mary made God's kingdom present on earth as it was in heaven.

Luke 1:45: The praise which Elizabeth made of Mary. "And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord." The Word of God generated a new life in the womb of a virgin, in the womb of the poor and abandoned people who accepted it with faith. Mary was chosen as the representative of the poor and abandoned to accept God's abundant grace, Jesus the Son of God.

Luke 1:54-55: at the end, Mary recalled that all that was the expression of God's mercy toward his people and an expression of his fidelity to the promises made to Abraham as she said, "He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy." The term "mercy" (eleous) here means that the mercy and clemency of God in offering to humans' salvation by Jesus. Mary, by her faith, kept her love to God's promise until the end of her life and indeed, she was in perfect communion with God.

That is the spiritual life of Mary. When does it come to completion? Her assumption into heaven! The Assumption of the BV manifests the ending of every person who entrusts his/her life in the hands of God. Thus, the celebration of the Assumption of the BVM is to encourage the faithful though they are poor and abandoned.

REFLECTIONS

- What prevents us from being one with God?
- Where and how does the joy of being one with God take place today in my life especially in that of the church and family?

瑪利亞探望她表姐妹依撒伯爾：天使向她傳報表姐以及她懷孕之後，立即啟程拜訪表姐，並且伺候老年懷孕的她。聖母不僅與天主緊密契合，還有特別關心有需要的人。福音，為聖母不光是默存心中，還有付諸行動，如耶穌。

路1:41-44

依撒伯爾對瑪利亞的問候：兩位孕婦相遇，彰顯了聖神的恩賜，若翰在母親胎中都一起歡喜踴躍。聖母讓天主旨意承行於地，如天上。

路1:45

依撒伯爾對瑪利亞的讚美：“那信了由上主傳於她的話必要完成的，是有福的。”天主聖言在瑪利亞胎中，標記那些懷著信德等待天主救援的窮人和被遺棄的人，從此獲得新的生命。聖母被天主召叫作為窮人以及被遺棄者的代表，如今獲得天主完美恩寵，是天主子耶穌。

路1:54-55

最後，瑪利亞讚美天主：“他曾回憶起自己的仁慈，扶助了他的僕人以色列，正如他向我們的祖先所說過的恩許，施恩於亞巴郎和他的子孫，直到永遠。”“仁慈”(eleous)指向天主通過耶穌給人救恩的仁慈和寬大。聖母憑著她的信德，把天主應許的愛一直活到塵世生命的盡頭，然後與天主完美共融合一。

這就是聖母的神修

聖母蒙召升天，表明所有將自己生命交託天主手中的基督徒結局。因此，慶祝聖母蒙召升天節，是為鼓勵那些貧窮和被遺棄的信徒，在絕望當中堅持希望。

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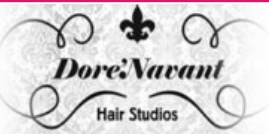
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
