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STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today we observe the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This beautiful feast celebrates the gift of the Eucharist, which the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches is the source and summit of our Christian faith. "For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself" (CCC paragraph 1324).

The very word, Eucharist, means "thanksgiving" or "gratitude" and so this feast is especially meaningful to all of us who are striving to live as grateful stewards of all God's blessings to us. Surely the Eucharist is the greatest of all blessings because it is not only from God, it is God - the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Today's second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians reminds us of the depths of love our Lord has shown us in the gift of the Eucharist, recalling Christ's words at the very first Eucharistic celebration. "The Lord Jesus took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you." In that moment, and at every celebration of the Mass thereafter, Jesus gives us His very self in an act of complete humility and perfect love. How can we possibly show our gratitude for such a sublime gift?

We can receive the gift of the Eucharist with the greatest possible reverence and love. And, following our Lord's example, we can give ourselves generously to others in the week ahead.

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The Body and Blood of Christ

When Jesus went back to Heaven He didn't want to leave us all alone, so He gave Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist. First He gave Himself to the Apostles at the Last Supper, and today He gives Himself to us in Holy Communion.

Normally when we eat something it gets absorbed into our body. But receiving Jesus in Holy Communion does something different. It makes us more into Jesus' Body! It brings our soul closer to God and closer to all the other people in the Church. That's what "Communion" means.

When we go to Communion in a state of grace we can get so much more grace from God. Our venial (small) sins can be taken away and we can get more strength to do His will. In fact, the time that your prayers are the most powerful is right after you receive Holy Communion, when Jesus is right inside you. He is your closest friend and only wants what is good for you. 

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥27

The more committed the life of Jesus, the heavier the cross will be. It is because the devil is not happy to see more people faithful to God. Therefore, they are more aggressive in attacking Christians, making them abandon Jesus and consequently, become disciples of the devil.

Peter was different. He said to Jesus, "Lo, we have left everything and followed you." Leaving everything is a necessary condition for following Jesus. If anyone is not willing to let go of guilty pleasure, there will be no way to get the eternal blessings of the kingdom of heaven.

"Leaving" (aphēkamen) here means that one lets go of everything that is previously owned; including family, possessions, or relationships. In short, one has to devote oneself to the life of Jesus and to "follow" (ēkolouthēkamen) him. That denotes the participation in the life of Jesus.

Jesus promised Peter and other disciples that they would receive a hundredfold in the future, i.e. the kingdom of heaven. However, before receiving eternal life, the persecution was also a hundredfold.

"Persecution" (diōgmōn) is originally meant to hunt animals, which here is likened to knocking people down as if they were catching prey. Putting it at the level of faith is to punish those who have religions. Their beliefs, in the eyes of the unbelievers, are not only disrespected, but in turn are sins and must be punished. Jesus was crucified on the cross for upholding God's justice, speaking the truth, and performing miracles, all of which were regarded as sins by false religious leaders.

In addition to punishment, it also means revenge. When Christians refused to bow down to the statue of Caesar, they were put to death. All the disciples who followed Jesus and evangelized the world preached the truth that their words and actions were the opposite of what the hypocrites did. Nevertheless, it is a glorious moment when they were avenged by their adversaries and martyred for God.

Persecution may seem like the best weapon to destroy Jesus and the church, however, Jesus said, "and in the age to come eternal life."

"In the age to come" (tō aiōni tō erchomenō, the age which is coming) is the arrival of eternity. The devil is unqualified to enter into eternal life because it and its disciples had persecuted the church. The weapon of persecution that destroys the church ultimately becomes the suicidal death of the devil, forever.

Following Jesus is to testify that God is love, no matter how high the price the Christians will pay.

伯多禄不一様,他對耶穌說: "看,我們捨棄了一切,而跟隨了你。"

捨棄是跟隨耶穌必要條件,如果不捨得放下犯罪快感,就永遠得不到天國永福。

"捨棄"(aphēkamen)這裡解作放下一切從前所擁有的,包括家庭、財產或關係,簡言之,是全身投入耶穌生命,而"跟 隨"(ēkolouthēkamen)就是參與耶穌生命。

耶穌給伯多祿以及門徒許諾,他們會在往後得到百倍回報,意即天國,可是,在進入永生之前,迫害同樣也是百倍。

"迫害"(diōgmōn)本意是狩獵動物,這裡比作將人打倒,好像捕獲獵物一樣。放在信仰層次,就是懲罰有信仰的人,他們 的信仰,為無信者眼中不但得不到尊重,反過來是罪過,必須懲罰。耶穌因為主持天主正義,說真話,行奇蹟,這都被虛假宗 教領導看成罪狀而被釘死在十字架上。

所有跟隨耶穌,並且傳揚福音的門徒,宣揚的真理正是相反假善人的作為,耶穌死,他們也要死。

除了懲罰,就是報復。當基督徒拒絕跪拜羅馬凱撒神像的時候,也就是他們被敵對者報復,為主殉道的光榮時刻。

迫害看似最佳毀滅耶穌以及教會武器,可是,耶穌說:"並在來世獲得永生。"

"來世"(tō aiōni tō erchomenō, the age which is coming)就是要來的世代,即永恆;在永恆裡面,只有永生,相反永生的,就是魔鬼以及魔徒,他們在迫害教會之後,往永死去。毀滅教會的迫害武器,最終是殺害自己永生的邢台。 跟隨耶穌,不為什麼,只為見證天主是愛,無論任何代價


