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STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



Today we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. What we are commemorating is a central reality of our Christian faith, that God is Trinitarian in nature — three distinct persons in one God.

The Church calls this truth a mystery, as indeed it is. Some have said that “mystery” in this context is “not a wall to run up against but an ocean in which to swim.” Contemplating the “ocean depths” of this mystery can make us humans feel so small, and almighty God so far from us. Yet nothing could be further from the truth as today’s readings demonstrate.

In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that God is intimately connected to us. “The love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.” God wants to live in the very depths of our being and in all the intimate details of our lives if we will let Him.

And in the Gospel from St. John, we learn that God holds back nothing of Himself from us. Jesus tells His disciples (this includes us!) that the Holy Spirit “will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything the Father has is mine.” Thus, we find ourselves drawn right into the midst of this Trinitarian love. In fact, if the mystery of Holy Trinity is an ocean which to swim, the “water” that makes up that ocean is love.

What then should be the response of the Christian steward to this sublime mystery? All we can do is worship. And offer our lives back to God in total gratitude for calling us to live in the richness of such unfathomable love.

It seems that so much of living is trying to figure out what it is we're supposed to be doing. Pursuing the career, raising the kids, planning the parties, designing the home, getting the degree, working and getting up and giving time to God can make us feel as though we've been just keeping busy so that we don't notice how off track we really are. People often tell me that they are certain that they have a purpose in this world and yet are struggling with just finding a reason to live. When everything we chase after, the family, the job, the material possessions, and the desires, leave us still feeling empty, what is it we are supposed to do? Even though turning to the Church and God can give us some deeper meaning, after a period of time we can begin to wonder if this, too, is just something to distract us from the true meaning of our life.

As I get older, I see that most of our pursuits keep us at the center of our actions. Even our connection with God is meant to help us fulfill some sort of meaning in our lives. This would all make perfect sense if we weren't trying to approach life with some faith in the divine. Once we add God to the equation, we necessarily need to take ourselves out of the center and put Him there. For most believers, we keep ourselves in the center and expect God to work around our expectations. In the end, whether we believe or not, with us at the center, we are clearly left with emptiness.

Put God in the center of your life. It's obvious and we preach it all the time. It's as simple as striving to give Him the glory in all we say and do. Do not strive to please yourself or anyone else. Strive to please God and everything and everyone else will find its proper place. The real purpose of our lives, the real reason why God made us, is to simply reveal to the world His presence (as in "the kingdom is here") and His love (as in "God is love"). This is pleasing to God. There is nothing else we need to do. Just tell and show the world that you believe in the Holy Trinity, and God will take care of the rest. You might find your exterior world emptier, but your interior world will be filled.

Parece que gran parte de la vida consiste en tratar de averiguar qué es lo que se supone que debemos estar haciendo. Seguir la carrera, criar a los niños, planear las fiestas, diseñar la casa, obtener el título, trabajar y levantarse y dedicarle tiempo a Dios puede hacernos sentir como si nos hubiésemos mantenido ocupados para no darnos cuenta de cómo fuera de pista que realmente estamos. Las personas a menudo me dicen que están seguras de que tienen un propósito en este mundo y, sin embargo, luchan por encontrar una razón para vivir. Cuando todo lo que perseguimos, la familia, el trabajo, las posesiones materiales y los deseos, nos dejan todavía sintiéndonos vacíos, ¿qué se supone que debemos hacer? Aunque volverse a la Iglesia y a Dios puede darnos un significado más profundo, después de un período de tiempo podemos comenzar a preguntarnos si esto también es algo que nos distrae del verdadero significado de nuestra vida.

A medida que envejezco, veo que la mayoría de nuestras actividades nos mantienen en el centro de nuestras acciones. Incluso nuestra conexión con Dios está destinada a ayudarnos a cumplir algún tipo de significado en nuestras vidas. Todo esto tendría perfecto sentido si no estuviéramos tratando de acercarnos a la vida con algo de fe en lo divino. Una vez que agregamos a Dios a la ecuación, necesariamente debemos sacarnos del centro y ponerlo allí. Para la mayoría de los creyentes, nos mantenemos en el centro y esperamos que Dios cumpla con nuestras expectativas. Al final, creamos o no, con nosotros en el centro, claramente nos quedamos con el vacío.

Pon a Dios en el centro de tu vida. Es obvio y lo predicamos todo el tiempo. Es tan simple como esforzarse por darle la gloria a Él en todo lo que decimos y hacemos. No te esfuerces por complacerte a ti mismo o a los demás. Esfuérzate por agradar a Dios y todo y todos los demás encontrarán su lugar adecuado. El verdadero propósito de nuestras vidas, la verdadera razón por la que Dios nos hizo, es simplemente revelar al mundo Su presencia (como en “el reino está aquí”) y Su amor (como en “Dios es amor”). Esto es agradable a Dios. No hay nada más que debemos hacer. Solo di y muéstrale al mundo que crees en la Santísima Trinidad, y Dios se encargará del resto. Puede que encuentres tu mundo exterior más vacío, pero tu mundo interior estará lleno.

The Blessed Trinity

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Blessed Trinity. The word Trinity is a title for God that tells us that He is three Persons in one God.

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥26

Let go, how hard is it? It depends on what people will get after letting go.

Jesus wants believers to let go of the world and get heaven. However, Christians sometimes listen to the devil as to let go of heaven and opt for hell. Is it worth?

What Jesus said to the rich man was to raise his spiritual level: "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor; and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me."

At first glance, selling everything is the foundation. Actively taking up the cross is the main issue to follow Jesus. In other words, selling everything is a preparation for bearing the cross, because following Jesus is not a comfortable job. The devil will continue to tempt and persecute the Christians all their lives, forcing them to obey the devil, and finally letting go of the kingdom of heaven because of pain; then rushing to hell with the company of the devil.

The Greek verb "follow" (akolouthei) is participating in Jesus' life. That is the cross. The pain inflicted on him by the adversaries came to climax when they mocked Jesus: "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself, and come down from the cross!" (Mark 15:29-30)

If Jesus really jumped off the cross, he would have fallen into the devil's trap. It might indicate that Jesus could not bear the pain and he chose to leave the mission of God. Thus, he finally failed to reveal to the world that there would be resurrection after death.

Since Jesus was persecuted for upholding God's justice, then Christians who participated in Jesus' life should like that of Jesus, i.e., letting go themselves and even their lives for the kingdom of heaven. The resurrection, indeed, is waiting for those who give up their lives for witnessing to God.

Letting go of all the world's property, for this rich man, is the spiritual cultivation, allowing him to get closer to the core of Jesus' life step by step. At that time, what he should rely on was not himself but God.

Jesus continued saying: "how hard it is for those who trust in riches to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God."

"Trust" here (pepoithotas) means to believe. In short, if one worships money like a god and relies on it with all one's heart, s/he will not be able to enter the kingdom of heaven. How could these persons enter the kingdom of God while they regard hell as their heaven?

The heart, like an anchor, where it is placed, is the port.

耶穌對富人所說的，是提升他神修層次：“你去，變賣你所有的一切，施捨給窮人，你必有寶藏在天上；然後來，背著十字架，跟隨我！”

變賣一切，是基礎，主動背起十字架，才是積極跟隨耶穌。

換言之，變賣一切，是背十字架的準備，因為跟隨耶穌不是舒服的事，魔鬼會一輩子不斷誘惑與迫害，逼使基督徒聽從魔鬼，因痛苦而放下天國，跟著進入地獄。

“跟隨” (akolouthei) 是參與耶穌生命，而耶穌生命就是十字架，是敵對者加給他的痛苦，特別在十字架下戲弄嘲笑耶穌：“哇！你這拆毀聖殿，三天內重建起來的，你從十字架上下來，救你自己吧！” (谷15:29-30)

耶穌如果真的從十字架上跳下來，就中了魔鬼詭計，因為耶穌也受不了痛苦，離開天主的救世使命，沒有給世界啟示死亡之後有復活。

既然耶穌因主持天主正義而受迫害，那麼，參與耶穌生命的基督徒，也要跟耶穌一樣，為天國而奉獻自己，甚至生命，因為死亡之後有復活。

放下世界一切財產，為這富人，是神修提升，讓他一步一步接近耶穌生命核心，到時，他所依靠的，不是自己，而是天主。

耶穌繼續說：“仗恃錢財的人，進天主的國是多麼難啊！駱駝穿過針孔，比富有的人進天主的國還容易。”

“仗恃” (pepoithotas) 意即信任或相信，簡言之，如果將錢財變成神明一樣膜拜，並且全心依靠，是進不了天國，因為，這些人將地獄看成天國。

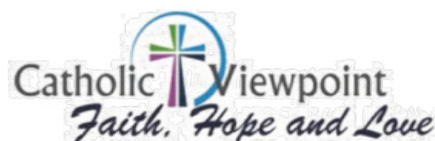
