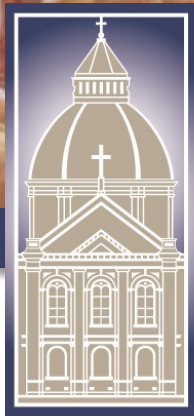
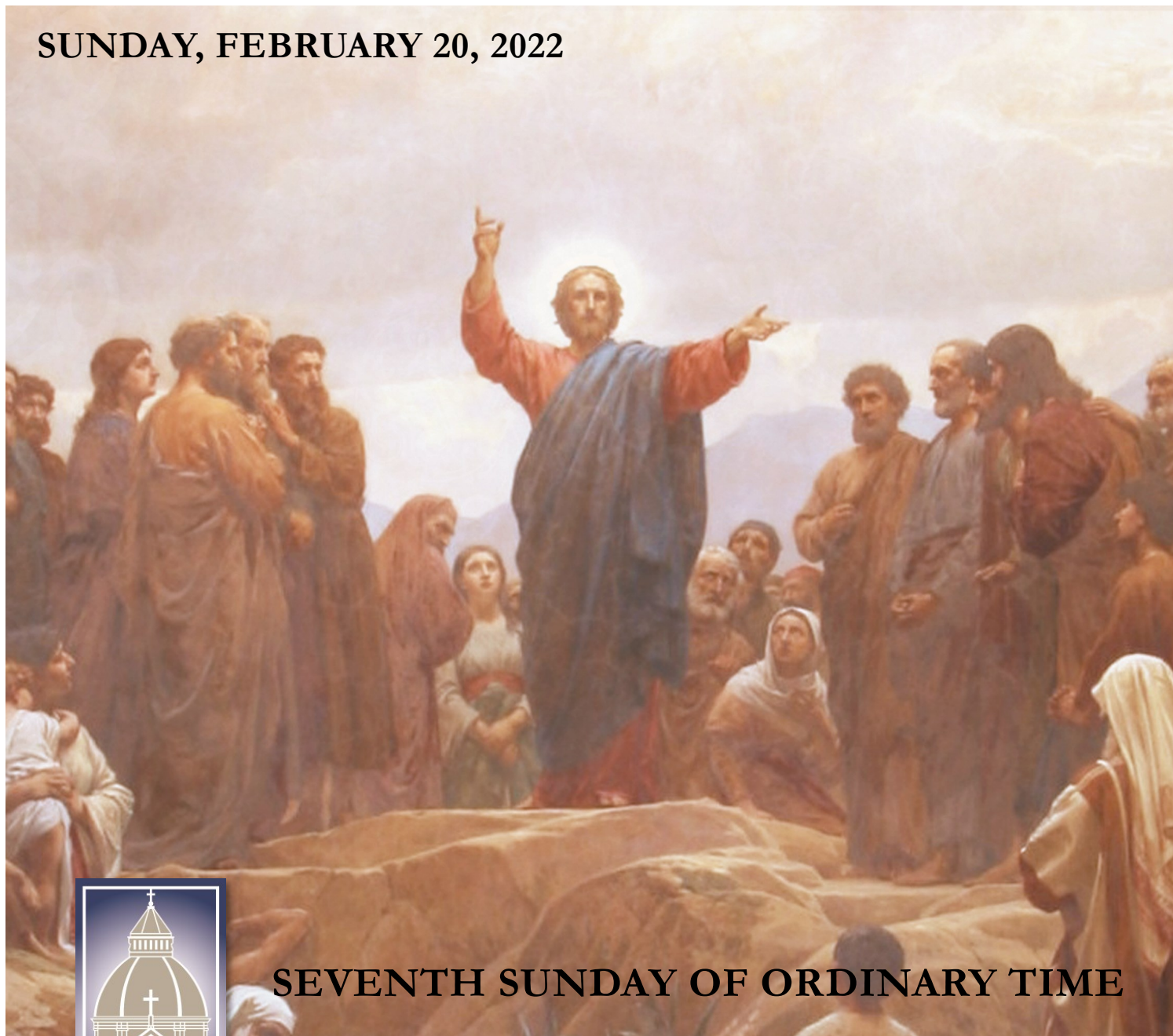

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In today's Gospel, taken from the sixth chapter of Luke, Jesus offers a very challenging, seemingly impossible approach to daily life. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak do not withhold even your tunic." It makes one want to say, "Seriously, Lord?" And He doesn't stop there. Jesus adds, "Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back."

It seems so unfair! That is, unless we look at this way of life from a stewardship point of view. Then, not only does it seem doable (though challenging), but it also actually makes perfect sense. A steward understands clearly that all he has and all that he is — his very life — is a gift from God given to him from an unfathomable abundance of love. This changes everything! This means "my" cloak, "my" tunic, "my" money, and time — all of it ultimately belongs to God. He has entrusted these things to each of us in love to use for His purposes and His glory.

Does this mean we are to be passive "doormats" to anyone who wants to take advantage of us? Certainly not. Jesus explains this in the next verse of this passage when He says, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." There is nothing wrong with loving oneself since God loves us and has made us in His own image and likeness. Jesus is simply asking that we also approach others, and the sharing of our gifts, with this same attitude. He is giving us a definition here of real love, a steward's love!

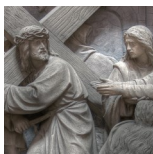

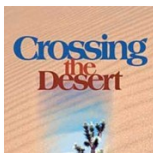

A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 11 Fr. Abraham Chiu (趙必成神父)

It is easy to make bad people so-called holy ones by saying yes to their every fault. It is even easier to trample good persons into sinners by falsely accusing them for what they had not done.

The fake religious leaders knew that their power was much weaker than Jesus', so they slandered him: "He is possessed by Beelzebul, and by the prince of demons he casts out the demons." "Beelzeboul" is the name of the prince of the devil. The scribes satirized Jesus that he was only the inferior of the devil, not the leader.

Jesus bluntly said that those who blasphemed the Holy Spirit were guilty of an eternal sin. In short, anyone against the Holy Spirit; is also against the Holy Trinity as well.

The verb "blaspheme" (blasphēmiai) is interpreted as speaking evil or using abusive language against God. While the scribes slandered the Holy Spirit as the prince of demons, this action is to deny God that God is the Lord. They are surely "guilty of an eternal sin" (enochos estin aiōniou hamartēmatos).

Eternal life is heaven; eternal death is hell. The hell is the consequence of the rejection and blasphemy against God. That is to say, rejecting God as the Lord is an action of digging hell for oneself.

虛假宗教領導明知力量敵不過耶穌，唯有污衊他：“經師們說：他附有貝耳則步。又說：他賴魔王驅魔。”

“貝耳則步” (Beelzeboul) 是魔鬼之王的名字，經師這樣說耶穌，諷刺耶穌連魔王都做不到，只是他的爪牙。

耶穌直斥其非，先說：“撒殫若起來自相攻擊紛爭，也就不能存立，必要滅亡。”然後說明褻瀆聖神的結果：“永遠不得赦免，而是永久罪惡的犯人。”

耶穌直言褻瀆聖神的人，是永久罪惡犯人，意即褻瀆聖神，就是拒絕天主聖三。

“褻瀆” (blasphēmiai) 在這裡解作辱罵天主，或說祂壞話來加以褻瀆，經師將聖神污衊為魔王，這個行動，就是拒絕天主是上主。他們是“永久罪惡的犯人” (enochos estin aiōniou hamartēmatos)，希臘版直譯是“是犯上永恆罪惡” (but is guilty of an eternal sin)。永恆的生，是天堂；永恆的死，是地獄，是拒絕以及褻瀆天主的結果。
