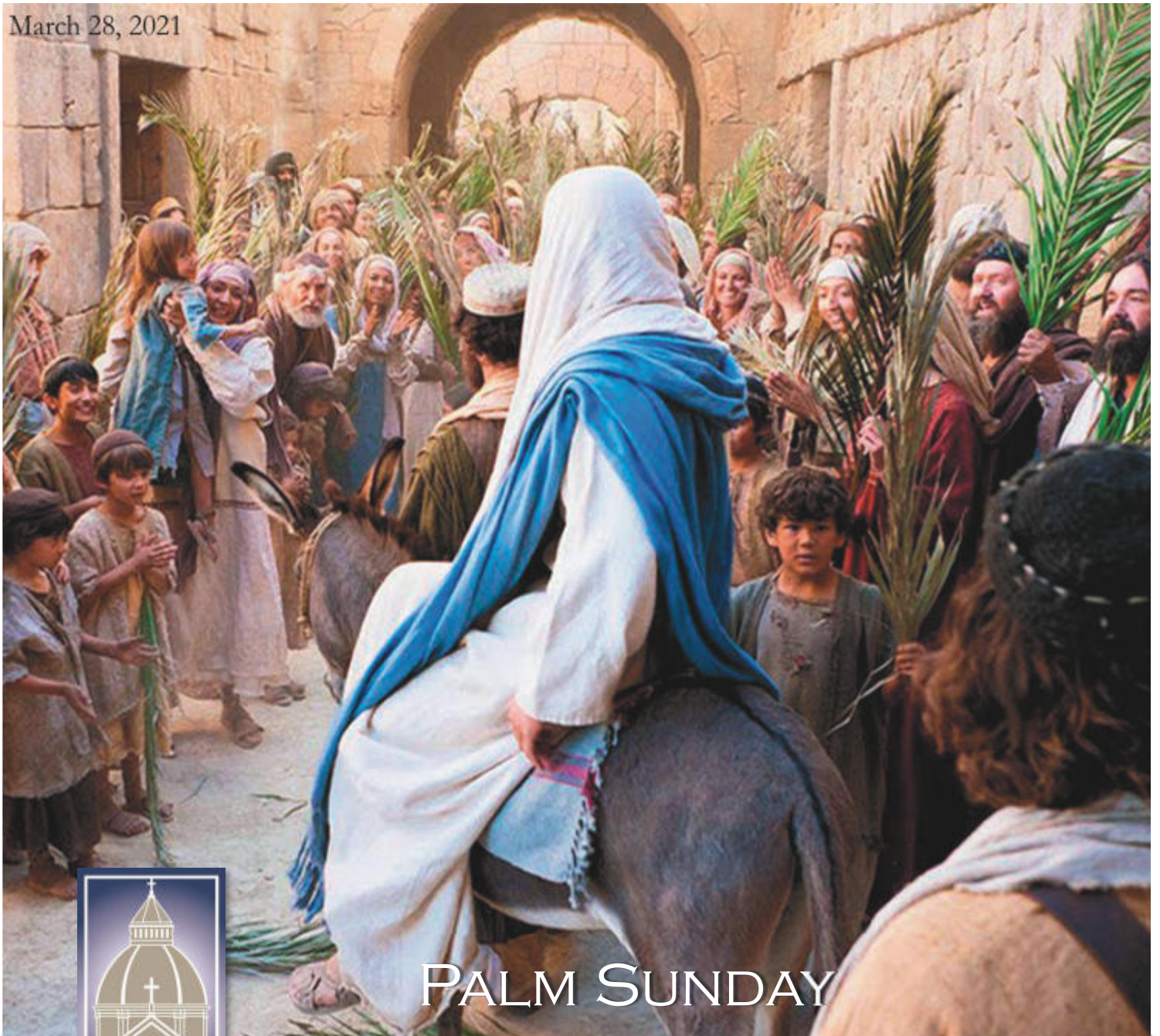

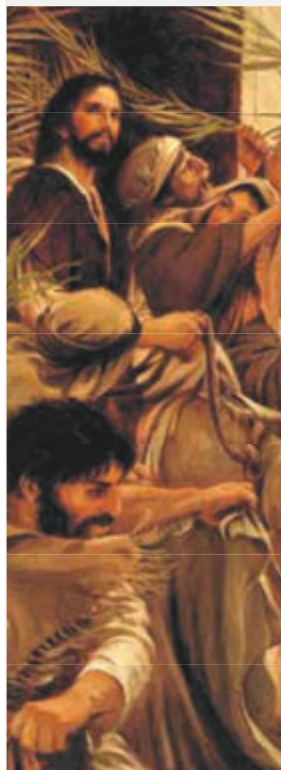
Holy Saturday Sabado Santo April 3

As we begin Palm Sunday this week, we begin what is traditionally known as Holy Week. We begin this time both with a feeling of joy as we remember the great triumph of Jesus over death, as well as a feeling of shame as we still allow ourselves to get lost in the darkness of our world. Holy Week can be a very significant time as we strive to step out of the ordinary activities of our lives and choose paths that lead us closer to Christ.

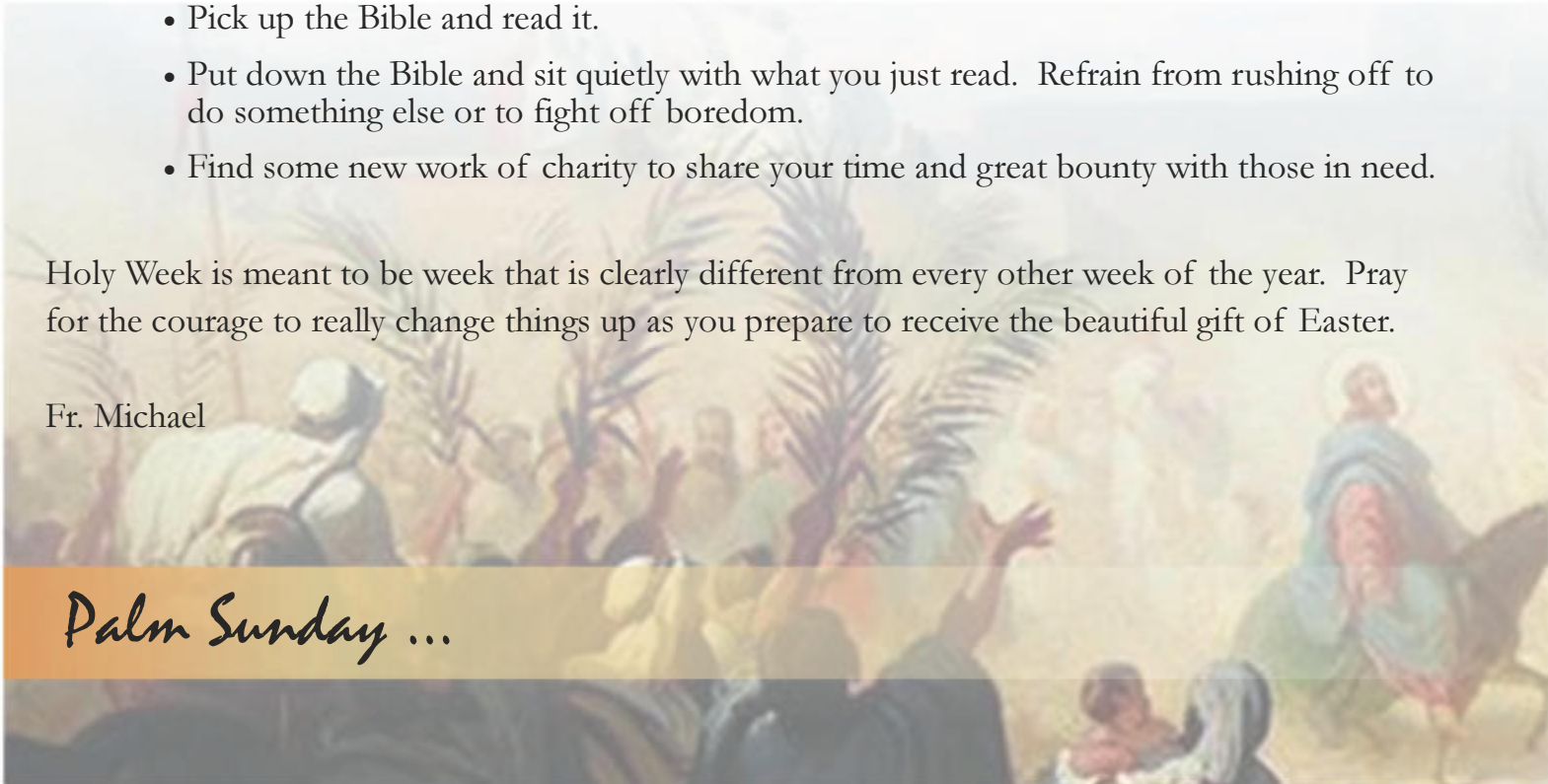
This week:

- Change your eating habits; eat less and more simply, feel the absence of a full stomach and the savoring of sweet and tasty meals.
- Change your drinking habits; feel the loss of no coffee, alcohol and flavored drinks but appreciate the simple gift of water.
- Change your work habits; simple meals mean less work in the kitchen, less time shopping and less time planning. Take some extra time off from work, especially to come to church services and time in prayer and silence.
- Change your leisurely habits; no television or time spent surfing the net, stay off of Facebook and refrain from reading and sending texts.
- Consider turning off the phone and letting it rest for a week.
- Spend some more time outside, walking and enjoying the family.
- Family discussions can often lead to arguments, so spend some time together in silence. God might allow you to discover things about Him and each other that have gotten lost in all the talking you do.
- Pick up the Bible and read it.
- Put down the Bible and sit quietly with what you just read. Refrain from rushing off to do something else or to fight off boredom.
- Find some new work of charity to share your time and great bounty with those in need.

Holy Week is meant to be week that is clearly different from every other week of the year. Pray for the courage to really change things up as you prepare to receive the beautiful gift of Easter.

Palm Sunday ...



Al comenzar el Domingo de Ramos esta semana, comenzamos lo que tradicionalmente se conoce como Semana Santa. Comenzamos esta vez tanto con un sentimiento de alegría como recordamos el gran triunfo de Jesús sobre la muerte, así como un sentimiento de vergüenza, ya que todavía nos permitimos perdernos en las tinieblas de nuestro mundo. La Semana Santa puede ser un momento muy significativo, ya que nos esforzamos por salir de las actividades ordinarias de nuestra vida y elegir caminos que nos acerquen más a Cristo.

Esta semana:

- Cambia tus hábitos alimenticios; comer cada vez más simple, sentir la ausencia de un estómago lleno y el sabor de las comidas dulces y sabrosas.
- Cambie sus hábitos de consumo; sentir la pérdida de café, alcohol y bebidas saboreadas, pero apreciar el simple regalo de agua.
- Cambia tus hábitos de trabajo; comidas simples significan menos trabajo en la cocina, menos tiempo de compras y menos planificación del tiempo. Tómese un poco de tiempo libre del trabajo, especialmente para venir a los servicios de la iglesia y el tiempo en oración y silencio.
- Cambie sus hábitos pausado; no hay televisión o tiempo dedicado a navegar por la red, mantenerse alejado de Facebook y abstenerse de leer y enviar textos.
- Considere apagar el teléfono y dejarlo reposar durante una semana.
- Pase un poco más de tiempo al aire libre, caminando y disfrutando de la familia.
- Las discusiones familiares a menudo pueden conducir a discusiones, así que pasen algún tiempo juntos en silencio. Dios podría permitirles descubrir cosas acerca de Él y los demás que se han perdido en todo el habla que hacen.
- Recoge la Biblia y léidala.
- Deja la Biblia y siéntate en silencio con lo que acabas de leer. Abstenerse de salir corriendo para hacer otra cosa o para luchar contra el aburrimiento.
- Encuentra un nuevo trabajo de caridad para compartir tu tiempo y gran recompensa con los necesitados.

La Semana Santa está destinada a ser una semana claramente diferente de cada dos semanas del año. Oren por el valor de cambiar realmente las cosas mientras se preparan para recibir el hermoso don de la Pascua.

A Look at Holy Week...



A walk with Jesus to Easter

This week...

Palm Sunday—March 28: we commemorate Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem to begin his final week and initiate his Passion (MT 21:1-11, MK 11:1-11, LK 19:25-44)

Monday—March 29: Jesus overturns the money-changing tables in the temple saying, "My house will be called a house of prayer..." Jesus invites us to look at the state of the 'temple' of our hearts: is my heart a 'house of prayer?' (MT 21:12-13, MK 11:15-17, LK 19:45-46)

Tuesday—March 30: The conflict with Temple leaders grows and Jesus is confronted by the Temple leaders who question His authority (MT 21:23, MK 11:27, LK 20:1).

Wednesday—March 31: Jesus is anointed with costly nard, but Judas objects, and seeds of doubt grow in his heart. Judas begins looking for a way to turn Jesus over to the chief priests and scribes. (MT 26:1, MK 14:1, LK 22:1)

Holy Thursday—April 1: Celebration of the Last Supper we commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist, the Institution of the Holy Priesthood, and the Institution of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. (MT 26:17-36, MK 14:12-31, LK 22:7-34)

Through Thursday night, Jesus is arrested, beaten, brought before Pilate. His body already weakened by Friday morning.

Good Friday—April 2: We commemorate the Passion of Our Lord, his Crucifixion and Death. (MT 23:33, MK 15:22, LK 23:32) It is a day of Fasting, Prayer, and abstinence of all meat. No Masses are celebrated this day, but there is a communion service in the Good Friday services.

Please pray for our Elect and Candidates this week as they enter into a time of final preparation for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. May they receive a special grace to trust the Lord with all of the Mind, their soul, their heart and strength. Be assured they are praying for the Community of the Cathedral with much gratitude for your support and witness of faith.

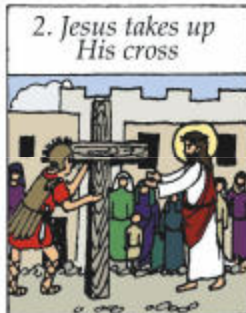
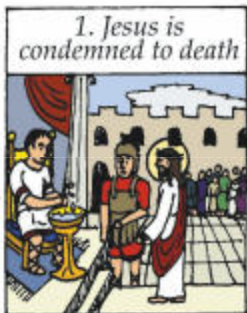

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS - Walk Every Step with Christ

Holy Week is a week for being mindful. We must set loose the baggage of Lent, and not be deterred by the dazzling sunrise of Easter morning beckoning in the distance. It's okay for us to be excited for Easter. We've waited so long, after all. In my opinion, it's one of the best feelings there is: the yearning we have in our hearts for the Resurrection as we embark on Palm Sunday. And in a purely logical sense, many of us have Easter celebrations for which we are preparing, and practical considerations to contend with. It's going to be a busy week, one likely full of happy distractions.

But my friends, we simply must keep our feet on the ground. Let's not "skip" Holy Week. Resist the urge to flip to the last page of the book, to fast-forward to the final scene of the movie. Don't rob yourself of the journey. This week is a blessed opportunity. It is this week that teaches us who we are. In the span of the Triduum, we have the birthday of the priesthood, the institution of the Eucharist, the sacrifice on Calvary and so many other and meaningful scenes.

It may sound strange, to advise someone to savor the moments of Holy Week. There are so many violent and heartrending moments, after all. But this is the valley of tears, remember — we are not in Heaven yet. And here, in our fallen, sin-filled world, it is the heartrending moments that seem to matter the most. These are the moments that define us as Catholics. Live them. Cherish them. Be present for each one.

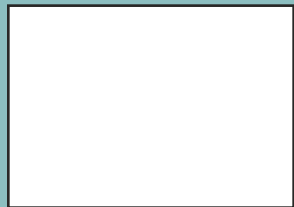

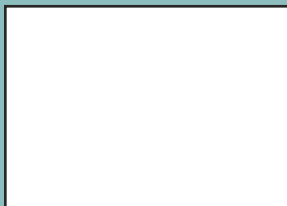
