STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



Our Gospel today conveys how we are called to imitate Jesus through humility and service.

We are reminded that the Son of God became man and surrendered His life into the hands of men so that we might be saved. The life of Jesus was centered

around His Father's mission and the service of mankind. And this is how we ought to live — in imitation of Christ.

James and John wanted to ensure they had a spot in heaven with Jesus. They were concerned about themselves in that moment — “Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left.”

Jesus quickly reminded them, “whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all.”

Our culture constantly encourages us to do what we can to get ahead in this world, to do what feels good, no matter the effects — that power, authority, and wealth should be our goals in life.

Our faith offers us something different and fulfilling — a life of humility and service. As Christian stewards, we are called to live our lives in service of God and neighbor, just as Jesus did. Our life is not about us. It is about fulfilling God's glorious plan for each one of us.

So, we must ask ourselves, are we living out God's plan for our lives? Is my life centered on Christ and those around me or is it centered on me?

It can be difficult to know God's plan for our entire life. He sees the whole picture — we only see the now. All we can do is seek Him daily. If each day is centered on Him, then our entire lives will become the work of Jesus.

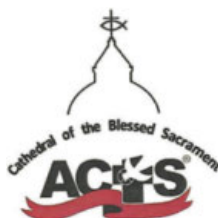

Sunday, October 17
Opening of the Diocesan Phase

10 am Mass

On Sunday, October 17, 2021, we will be joining dioceses throughout the world in commencing our own Diocesan Pre-Synod here in the Diocese of Sacramento. Pope Francis has challenged our Church to “journey together” and our Pre-Synod will provide us the opportunity to live out this calling.
Synod 2023

Pope Francis has called this Synod to be a time for the Church to focus on the topic of synodality itself. The two fundamental questions that will guide this process are:

1. “How does this ‘journeying together’ take place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal level), allowing the Church to proclaim the Gospel?”
2. “What steps is the Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?” (Preparatory Document, 2).

The opening celebration of the Synod took place in Rome on Saturday, October 9, 2021.

The Synod will then proceed in the following three phases:

1. The Diocesan Phase: October 2021 to April 2022
2. Continental Phase: May 2022 to March 2023
3. Synod of Bishops: October 2023

The Diocesan Phase of the Synod, the Pre-Synod will open today with the celebration of the **10:00 AM Mass at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament on Sunday, October 17, 2021.** All are welcome to join Bishop Soto and participate at this Mass as we especially pray that the Holy Spirit guide and direct us as a diocese and Church in the coming years of the synodal process.

SAINT OF THE MONTH SANTA DEL MES



St. Therese of Lisieux

*“Quiero ser santa.”
“I want to be a saint.”*

Therese wanted to be holy. At first she felt discouraged when she compared herself with the saints. But instead of staying discouraged, she persevered. She wrote: *“In spite of my littleness, I can aim at being a saint. ...I will look for some means of going to heaven by a little way which is very short and very straight, a little way that is quite new.”* St. Thérèse is known for this “Little Way” of seeking holiness in ordinary, everyday things .

Teresa quería ser santa. Al principio, se sintió desanimada cuando se comparó con los santos. Pero en lugar de permanecer desanimada, ella persistió. Ella escribió: *“A pesar de mi pequeñez, puedo aspirar a ser una santa... Buscaré algún medio para ir al cielo por un camino muy corto y muy recto, un caminito que es bastante nuevo”.* Santa Teresa es conocida por este “caminito” de buscar la santidad en las cosas ordinarias y cotidianas.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS - What's in it for me?

I think we've all been guilty of looking at a situation and wondering what's in it for us. It doesn't matter if it's a particular work assignment, someone at the parish asking for help with the mission trip bake sale, or your spouse asking if you'll take over the grocery shopping this week. Often, our first reaction to one of these requests is a heavy sigh and the thought: "If I do this, what will I get?"

Sometimes it surprises us to realize that the Apostles were no different. But in reality, these individuals were merely human beings struggling to commit to the task of everyday stewardship.

In the Gospels, we see glimpses of them longing for praise and affirmation. We see them jockeying for positions of power within the group of twelve. We see them expect earthly rewards like honor and admiration. We see them acting a lot like us.

But in the end, we see them transformed by the grace of God. Like all the saints, their holiness stems from their commitment to their call. They stumble through, and as they stumble, they keep trusting God. They keep turning to Him. They keep asking for help. They don't give up just because they keep failing at it.

We are defined by what we give when we have no hope of being reimbursed, rewarded, or recognized. The Apostles understood this, eventually, and they gave accordingly. Most of them gave their very lives. Remember, they're just like us. If they can do it, we can too.

我想我們都曾因看到某種情況，並想知道其中對我們有何好處，而感到愧疚過，這無論是在哪種特定的工作或任務中都有，例如教區的某人為福傳之旅，舉辦烘培義賣請求幫助，或是你的配偶要求你去採買這週的民生用品。常常，我們對這要求的第一個強烈的反映和想法是：如果我去做了，我會有甚麼好處？

有時候我們會很驚訝地發現，門徒們其實和我們一般人並沒有不同，我們傾向將與基督同時期的人，視為與救主同行的巨人。但實際上，這些人也僅僅是努力在於度聖善生活的一般人類。

在福音書中，我們瞥見到他們渴望被讚美和肯定，我們見到他們在十二人團體中角逐權力

地位，我們看到他們期待世俗的獎勵，如榮譽與敬佩，我們看到他們和我們同樣的處事行為。

但是在最後，我們看到他們因天主的恩典而轉變，像所有的聖人一樣，他們的聖潔源自對天主召叫的回應。他們跌跌撞撞而行，當他們絆倒時，他們仍信靠上主，他們繼續轉向祂，向天主祈求幫助，他們不會因為總是失敗而放棄尋求天主。

我們對於付出的定義是，付出沒有希望得到補償，獎勵或認可。宗徒們最終明瞭這點，於是他們做出了奉獻。他們中大部分的人奉獻出了生命。請記住，他們也跟我們一般人一樣，如果他們做得到，我們也能做得到。— Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS
