



A real-life miracle at the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade

Larry Peterson, a contributor to Aleteia.org, tells here the story of his own ancestors, passed down through the generations.

During the early morning hours of November 24, 1906, a ship quietly slid against the ebb-tide waters of the Narrows and entered New York harbor. On board were almost 2,000 people, mostly immigrating Europeans.

Through the emerging light of the new dawn, the Statue of Liberty came into view. The appearance of the great icon had them mesmerized. They had arrived at their new home, America.

Among the people on board was a little girl from Hungary. Her name was Julia, and she was four years old. She held a small rag doll tightly in her arms. At that moment in time, it was the only link she had to security and happiness.

Eight days earlier, Julia had hugged her poppa good-bye. She remembered his stubbly beard tickling her face. He had reached into the pocket of his big wool overcoat and pulled out a surprise. It was a doll. He smiled and said, "For you, Shkutabella (my little pretty). Her name is Rachel, and I made her for you. As long as you have her, I will always be with you even if I am not there. Do you understand?"

Julia nodded her head up and down, and her mom said, "Please Bollassar, please come with us. I do not like going without you."

"Viola, it is all right. I will be over in a year. My brother George will take care of you. It is all right."

Viola and Julia had boarded the ship and set off. Just a few days into their journey, as the lonely mother and daughter stood on the deck, a life-boat broke free from its support cable. It fell and hit Viola, killing her instantly.

Julia's mom had been standing next to her and then she was lying lifeless on the deck. The child's young mind could not understand why her mom did not move. She screamed at her to wake up. That would never happen.

When the ship docked at the pier, all Julia knew was fear and loneliness.

At Ellis Island, a bizarre series of events saw Julia shuffled from one official to another and when a lady smiled at her, the official nearby assumed they were together and made Julia go with the lady. The woman took Julia as far as Broome and Varick Streets in lower Manhattan. She told the child to stay there and walked away. Just like that, Julia had become another abandoned child on the streets of the city.

Little Julia, holding Rachel, had been standing in the same spot for more than an hour. She was cold, hungry, and frightened beyond belief when the beat cop, Paddy Dolan, approached her. He was instantly smitten with the dark-haired, blue-eyed child and asked

her her name. Hesitatingly she said, "Julia."

Officer Dolan brought her with him to the station-house, and after checking as much as anyone could in 1906, she was declared an orphan. But this orphan was not going to an orphanage. Paddy Dolan brought her home.

Paddy's wife, Aileen, a wee wisp of a gal from County Galway in Ireland, could not have children. Paddy and Aileen adopted Julia, and she became Julie Dolan. She grew up to be a teacher, married a man named Tommy O'Rourke (also a policeman), and they had three children: two boys and a girl. The girl was named Viola.

On Thanksgiving Day 1951, Julia, her daughter Viola, and Viola's four-year-old daughter, Karen, went to the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. They stood in the crowd at 63rd Street and Central Park West and, after Santa had passed by, Viola suggested that they go to the Squire's Restaurant a few blocks away.

Karen was holding Rachel, Grandma Julia's doll. Karen loved the doll and, in a moment of weakness, Grandma Julia had allowed her to take the doll with her to the parade. Rachel had not been out of the house in more than 40 years.

They sat in a booth at Squire's and Karen placed Rachel on the table. Julia reached over and fingered the doll lovingly. Suddenly a man stood by their table. He was old and weathered and quite nervous. A chill ran down Julia's spine. The man pointed to the doll and nervously said, "Excuse me...is..is that doll named Rachel?"

Viola, not seeing her mother turning pale, answered, "Why yes, how could you know such a thing?"

As tears fell from the old man's eyes, he looked at Julia and softly said, "Is it really you, Shkutabella?"

Julia jumped from her seat and threw her arms around the old man. "Oh Poppa, Poppa, Poppa. I can't believe it. Yes it is. It is. It is ME."

Question: What significance does the Advent season have for our Christian faith journey?

Answer: Advent is a season of joyful anticipation and expectation. But for what specifically? Certainly not for the birth of the Christ Child - that occurred more than 2,000 years ago. This season links us with all those who lived in the era of longing for the coming of the Messiah. But he has come and lived among us.

What if the anticipation and expectation were to focus on how we can continue to make present the living Christ in each and every moment of our daily lives? Yes, Jesus came among us 2,000 years ago. But how do we continue to make that presence real in our world? Jesus himself set the agenda for us. We are to proclaim good news to the poor and give liberty to captives, sight to the blind, food for the homeless, and freedom for those who are oppressed and abused. What would the Advent season look like if this, was the main focus of our joyful anticipation and expectation? Try it and see what results. It may surprise all of us.





VERSO DEL EVANGELIO DE DOMINGO

"La gente se morirá de terror y de angustiosa espera por las cosas que vendrán sobre el mundo, pues hasta las estrellas se bambolearán. Entonces verán venir al Hijo del hombre en una nube, con gran poder y majestad. Cuando estas cosas comiencen a suceder, pongan atención y levanten la cabeza, porque se acerca la hora de su liberación". - Lc 21, 26-28

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

Muéstranos Señor tu misericordia, y danos tu salvación. Caminamos hacia un Año Nuevo Litúrgico, el Año "C". Escucharemos durante este tiempo el Evangelio según San Lucas. Y es bueno saber que uno de los componentes principales del Evangelio de San Lucas es el mensaje de salvación para el mundo entero. También se le llama el Evangelio de la misericordia porque Lucas presenta a Jesús, como el que siempre buscaba, lo que le faltaba. "El Hijo del Hombre ha venido a buscar y a salvar lo que estaba perdido" (Lucas 19:10). Pero, a la vez, existe la exigencia a la conversión; es voltear el corazón hacia el amor de Dios, donde está la fuente de la verdadera alegría.

Hoy damos comienzo al Adviento; son cuatro semanas antes de la Navidad. Es un tiempo corto pero lleno de contenido para prepararnos para la venida del Salvador. Es un lapso de tiempo de cuidado y de atención a las señales de los tiempos que se viven hoy en día. Vale la pena preguntarse: ¿hacia dónde debo de levantar la cabeza? ¿Dónde está la liberación? Jesús nos lo dice claramente: "Estén vigilando y orando en todo momento" (Lucas 21:36). El reto es no perder el tiempo esperando regalos, que, en muchas ocasiones, no sirven para nuestra salvación. Busquemos el regalo principal que es Jesús hecho carne entre nosotros. El Papa Francisco nos invita a levantar la mirada hacia María en este tiempo de Adviento. Ella es la Madre que sabe guiar hacia su Hijo. Dejémonos llevar por ella siendo activos en la espera y en atención vigilante.

VIVIR LA LITURGIA

Ya que comenzamos nuestra jornada de adviento, en preparación para la celebración del nacimiento de Cristo y en anticipación de su gloria, tenemos que recordar de estar preparados. Esta temporada corta de adviento puede ser un mini retiro para esas personas que viven en un mundo que frecuentemente es contraproducente en desarrollar una relación madura, enfocada y significativa con Dios. Ser cristiano y estar seguro en su fe requiere una fuerza que solo le puede llegar a través de la oración. Esas cuatro semanitas de preparación le pueden ayudar a recordar lo que Dios ha hecho en nuestra historia y pueden ayudarle a abrir su corazón para que puedan ver más claramente lo que Dios hace por usted hoy y Sus promesas para el futuro. Que todos usemos este tiempo de adviento de una manera prodiciente y que podamos llegar a una santidad más grande.




