Stewardship Reflection

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is a Latin word, meaning "rejoice." The Christian steward should be characterized by a spirit of rejoicing.

Our First Reading, from Isaiah, expresses a fitting motto for us. "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul." It is God Who is the source of our joy and contentment — not things or achievements or comfort, but our relationship with God.

This is why stewards can share so freely of their time, talents and material possessions — because ultimately, we are not attached to these things. We recognize them as good gifts from our loving Father, but we are attached to the Giver of the gifts, not the gifts themselves. This allows for great freedom in life and the capacity for great joy in the Lord.

In fact, we can become like John the Baptist, in today's Gospel passage from the Book of John. We read this description of the prophet: "He came for testimony, to testify to the light... He was not the light but came to testify to the light." This is our calling too — to testify to the Light, our wonderful Savior — by the way we make use of the time, talent and treasure He has entrusted to our care.

When God Himself is the source of our joy, it cannot be taken away from us. There is still time, this Advent season, to clear away any "clutter" in our lives that may take our focus away from Him. Let us strive to detach from any of these things so that we can be free to truly rejoice in God on Christmas Day.

Reflexión sobre la mayordomía

Hoy celebramos el Tercer Domingo de Adviento, el Domingo de Gaudete. "Gaudete" es una palabra latina que significa "regocijarse". El mayordomo cristiano debe caracterizarse por un espíritu de regocijo.

Nuestra primera lectura, de Isaías, expresa un lema apropiado para nosotros. "Me regocijo de corazón en el Señor, en mi Dios está el gozo de mi alma". Es Dios quien es la fuente de nuestro gozo y contentamiento, no cosas, logros o consuelo, sino nuestra relación con Dios.

Esta es la razón por la que los mayordomos pueden compartir tan libremente su tiempo, talentos y posesiones materiales, porque en última instancia, no estamos apegados a estas cosas. Los reconocemos como buenos regalos de nuestro amoroso Padre, pero estamos apegados al Dador de los dones, no a los dones mismos. Esto permite una gran libertad en la vida y la capacidad de un gran gozo en el Señor.

De hecho, podemos llegar a ser como Juan el Bautista, en el pasaje evangélico de hoy del libro de Juan. Leemos esta descripción del profeta: "Vino a dar testimonio, a dar testimonio de la luz... Él no era la luz, sino que vino a dar testimonio de la luz". Este es también nuestro llamado: dar testimonio de la Luz, nuestro maravilloso Salvador, por la forma en que hacemos uso del tiempo, el talento y el tesoro que Él ha confiado a nuestro cuidado.

Cuando Dios mismo es la fuente de nuestro gozo, no nos lo pueden quitar. Todavía hay tiempo, en esta temporada de Adviento, para despejar cualquier "desorden" en nuestras vidas que pueda desviar nuestro enfoque de Él. Esforcémonos por desprendernos de cualquiera de estas cosas para que podamos ser libres para regocijarnos verdaderamente en Dios el día de Navidad.

And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?" He admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Christ." So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" He said:

"I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord,'" as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." This happened in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

Advent Wreath Prayer:



Gospel Focus:

Next Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and as we draw close to Christ's birth, we reflect on the Annunciation, when Archangel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would be the mother of God. The first reading speaks of the Ark of the Covenant that carried the pieces of the 10 Commandments given to the Hebrews at Mount Sinai. The Ark was a sign of God's presence among His people. It is said that when Mary said yes to be the Mother of God, she became the Ark of the New Covenant, the Covenant of Jesus who was foretold from the beginning of Human History.

December—Week 3

This third week we focus on our theme for the month: Journey to Bethlehem, which was our focus at our Community event.

Journey to Bethlehem | Viaje a Belén

During our Family Faith Formation community day this month, we reflected on God's divine plan and the arrival of Jesus. We discovered that the birth of Jesus was not just one event celebrated on Christmas Day, but a series of events throughout human history leading up to Jesus' Birth. Here are a few stops we had along the way.



1. God created the world and all it contains in six days and rested on the seventh day. He loved all that he created calling it good. He had a special love for his human creation calling Adam and Eve 'very good'.



2. Adam and Eve were banned from the Garden of Eden because of their disobedience, trying to become like God with out God. The rest of human history is God restoring us to Himself out of love.



3. In Jesus' family tree we see how God wove Himself into our human story. In Matthew 1 we read about the ancestors of Jesus. Even Jesus' family had strange characters yet God used them for good.



4. Mary says "Yes" to being the mother of God. We discovered that Mary didn't "have to" say yes to God's plan, but freely chose the will of God as a fruit of her prayer and silence. We look to have a heart like hers.

Durante nuestro día comunitario de Formación de Fe Familiar de este mes, reflexionamos sobre el plan divino de Dios y la llegada de Jesús. Descubrimos que el nacimiento de Jesús no fue sólo un evento celebrado el día de Navidad, sino una serie de eventos a lo largo de la historia humana que condujeron al Nacimiento de Jesús. Aquí hay algunas paradas que hicimos en el camino.

1. Dios creó el mundo y todo lo que contiene en seis días y descansó el séptimo día. Amaba todo lo que creaba llamándolo bueno. Tenía un amor especial por su creación humana llamando a Adán y Eva "muy buenos".

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥103 (Luke 14:12-24)

Jesus was at dinner on a Sabbath in the house of one of the Pharisee leaders. Jesus moved from self-seeking ambition to selfish recompense and tried to counteract this as well. He counseled this time, not his fellow guests, but the host. He suggested that the kind of people one should invite to dinners was not one's friends, brothers, relatives, or rich neighbors; instead, the poor, the maimed, the lame, and the blind.

Four affluent types of people, able to recompense, are contrasted with four pitiful types, unable to do so. Jesus said, "You will be repaid at the resurrection of the just." The future passive verb "will be repaid" (antapodothēsetai) is a good sense of recompense that those who generously help others without any conditions will be given eternal life. That is what Jesus said about "the resurrection of the just." They are the just who follow the example of Jesus who lays down his life for his sheep without asking for any recompense. Real love never reckons with recompense; and because this is so, generosity will find its reward at the resurrection. The reciprocity expected must give way to a return in another unexpected form, i.e. a return not from the pitiful but from God. Those who invite the pitiful will find themselves among the just at the resurrection. When Christians really believe that they are loved by God, they can allow their friends the freedom to respond to their love in their own ways.

Gaudete Sunday (降臨節的第三個星期日)

安息日，耶穌在一位法利塞人首領家裡吃飯。耶穌從治病到虛榮，都在指正法利塞人的不是，現在，第三主題就是交易的“慷慨”。

勸告的，不是其他客人，是主人。耶穌建議，吃飯應該邀請的人，非“朋友、兄弟、親戚及富有的鄰人”；相反，是“貧窮的、殘廢的、癱腿的、瞎眼的人”。

四種富足的人能口報答，四種可憐的人無法回報

耶穌口：“在義人復活的時候，你必(將)能得到賞報。”將來時態被動語態動詞“將得報”(antapodothēsetai)是正面的回報，即那些無條件慷慨幫助苦者的人，將獲得永生；這就是耶穌所口的“義人復活”；如耶穌為口的羊捨掉性命而不求任何回報，這些義人效法耶穌榜樣，他們最佳回報，是永生。真愛，從不計較回報；正因如此，這種慷慨才會在復活時得到回報。計較回報最終必須讓一位給永生，即不是來自苦者，而是來自天主

的公義之人。當基督徒深信他們被天主所愛時，心滿意足，一生何求？

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


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
