



## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Using the best seeds doesn't always guarantee the best plants. An older Italian gentleman straight from Italy gave me these amazing tomato seeds that he claimed produced the best tomatoes ever grown. Without doubt, the fruit he shared with me was a testament to that fact. These tomatoes were amazing! I couldn't wait until the next growing season to plant these seeds and harvest my own tomatoes. The whole experiment ended up a failure. I did everything the gentleman said, but my fruit didn't even come close. What happened? At first I was perplexed, then some years later the light dawned. The problem wasn't the seeds, it was the soil!

You cannot sow seeds in any old place and in a haphazard way and expect them to be at their best. It doesn't work that way. Planting the seeds is the easiest part. Preparing the soil is the challenge. Tilling, mulching, enriching, and building up the nutrients are all required for good fruit. Then after the seeds are planted, more care is required in order to maintain that healthy, nutrient rich environment for those seeds to sprout, grow, and flourish. God happily sows the seeds of his Word. What do we do with them?

If we expect to be a passive bystander and have good fruit magically grow, we are mistaken. Bearing the good fruit of God's Word requires preparation and work. We have to cultivate the soil of our lives so that those seeds can find a proper home. This one thing alone takes a great deal of patience, time, and effort. What kind of preparation have we put into our lives so that we can be a recipient of God's seed? It takes a great deal of soul-searching and ego-checking to properly prepare. God is the ever faithful and persistent sower. If the seeds do not bear fruit the first time, God will come back time and time again, giving it another try.

If we have created a suitable bed for sowing, then once the seed is sown, we must properly maintain them. What is our maintenance plan for the seeds of God's Word? We need not only a source for water but a watering schedule. We need to weed, aerate the soil, nurture the young plants, protect them, and provide proper nutrients. What does our spiritual maintenance plan look like? If we have done all things well, imagine what the seeds of God's Word could produce in us!

## Cathedral Faith Formation & Education Catedral Formación y Educación de Fe

When Jesus tells a parable, he uses earthly images to communicate something about God or heaven. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is the farmer. The seed he is throwing about is the Good News - the saving message of God's love. The four conditions of the soil represent four ways we approach our relationship with God. Imagine the ground in the story is your heart:

- **the walking path:** you hear God's Word and sounds good, but it is forgotten almost immediately after you hear it, and it doesn't make its way into your heart.
- **the rocky ground:** you hear God's Word and it stays with you for a while but cannot get a firm hold on you and is quickly forgotten.
- **the thorny ground:** you hear God's Word and it grows in you, but it is too easily lost by the distractions of friends, internet, tv, concerns and worries.
- **the good soil:** you hear God's Word and your heart is ready to receive it because of your prayer which has prepared you to hear. The word of God becomes life-changing and fills you with long-lasting joy.

We need to become like a good farmer who prepares the ground for planting and treat our hearts in a similar way. We need to break up the hard ground, remove the rocks and weeds, and prepare the heart to hear God's Word. This takes prayer.

Maybe you've been desiring to grow in relationship with God and feel you just can't break through. Begin with prayer—a rosary, an act of faith, a prayer to your guardian angel or Saint Michael—and little by little you will find the Word of God finding a home in you.

Cuando Jesús cuenta una parábola, usa imágenes terrenales para comunicar algo sobre Dios o el cielo. En el Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús es el granjero. La semilla que está arrojando son las Buenas Nuevas, el mensaje salvador del amor de Dios. Las cuatro condiciones del suelo representan cuatro formas en que abordamos nuestra relación con Dios. Imagina que el fundamento de la historia es tu corazón:

- **el sendero:** escuchas la Palabra de Dios y suena bien, pero se olvida casi inmediatamente después de que la escuchas, y no llega a tu corazón.
- **el terreno rocoso:** escuchas la Palabra de Dios y se queda contigo por un tiempo pero no puede agarrarte firmemente y se olvida rápidamente.
- **el terreno espinoso:** escuchas la Palabra de Dios y crece en ti, pero la pierdes fácilmente debido a las distracciones de amigos, internet, televisión, preocupaciones.
- **la buena tierra:** escuchas la Palabra de Dios y tu corazón está listo para recibirla debido a tus oraciones que te ha preparado para escuchar. La palabra de Dios te cambia la vida y te llena de alegría duradera.

Necesitamos convertirnos en un buen agricultor que准备 el terreno para plantar y trate nuestros corazones de manera similar. Necesitamos romper el terreno duro, quitar las rocas y las malas hierbas, y preparar el corazón para escuchar la Palabra de Dios. Esto requiere oración.

Tal vez has estado deseando crecer en Tu relación con Dios y sientes que simplemente no puedes lograrlo. Comienza con una oración, un rosario, un acto de fe, una oración a Tu ángel de la guarda o San Miguel, y poco a poco descubrirás que la Palabra de Dios encuentra un hogar dentro de ti.



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE ORDINARY MOMENTS:  
Focus on the Good

When I was a child, my mother had a set of sculptures resembling three human heads. One head had hands over the ears, one had hands over the eyes, and one had hands over the mouth. Of course, they depicted the phrase, "Hear no evil; see no evil; speak no evil." I have seen these images repeated many times since then, usually as the monkey heads from a Japanese proverb, which would have probably seemed a little less creepy to me when I was a small child. Apparently, there is no consensus about the full meaning or certain origin of these three images nor the phrase. At the very least, it causes us to reflect on the need to avoid evil and look for the good in things.

As I have lived my life, I have come to believe there are more people who live their lives in a contrary manner to these images. It is not that they seek evil, but it is as if they "see no good, hear no good, and speak no good." Gossiping is the way they pass the time, and they always seem to find the negative in people and situations. Being a good steward certainly means that we do not seek evil, but more than that, it means that we see the abundance of good things all around us. These gifts of God are big and little, profound and ordinary. By seeing the world in this way, we begin to change our personalities and our overall disposition. We always need to follow a new proverb: see all the good, hear all the good, and speak about the good. Amen.


每日當責 – 在日常生活中體會天主：


