STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

We have arrived at Gaudete Sunday (Gaudete is the Latin word for "rejoice") this Third Week of Advent, and the Scriptures take on a joyful tone as we continue our preparations for the feast of our Savior's birth.

Our Second Reading gives us cause for joy as St Paul reminds us, "The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all...." Then he gives us a prescription for maintaining this peace: "In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Paul's instructions for obtaining peace come as an early Christmas gift. They remind us that we can and should go to God with all our needs and present them to Him along with our thanks. This guidance calls to mind a vital aspect of a stewardship way of life: gratitude to God in response to His great love and countless gifts to us.

The Gospel passage, from Luke, shows us how to live out this sense of thankfulness, making our lives a "Christmas gift" to Christ in joyful response to His love for us. When the crowds hear John the Baptist's message that their Savior is coming, they ask him what they should do to prepare. He responds, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do the same." He tells tax collectors to stop collecting more than is prescribed and soldiers, to be satisfied with their wages. In other words, he tells them to be good and generous stewards of all God's gifts to them!

As the great feast of Christmas draws near, let us rejoice in Christ's extravagant love. Let's avail ourselves of the peace He longs to give us. And let's look carefully at our lives to make sure we are indeed making of them a gift fitting for Him.

Gaudete Sunday - Each Mass has its own "entrance antiphon." This is a sentence or two, most often from the scriptures. We can sing it at the beginning of Mass (although, in our country, we usually begin Mass by singing a hymn instead of the antiphon). Years ago, people gave a title to each Sunday's Mass. The title came from the first Latin word of the day's antiphon. The entrance antiphon for the Third Sunday of Advent begins, "Rejoice in the Lord always." These words are from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians. In Latin, "rejoice" is *Gaudete* (gow- DAY-tay). So today is called Gaudete Sunday.

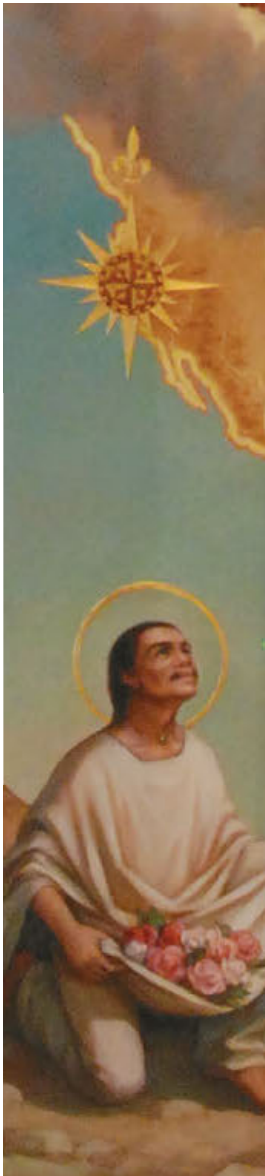
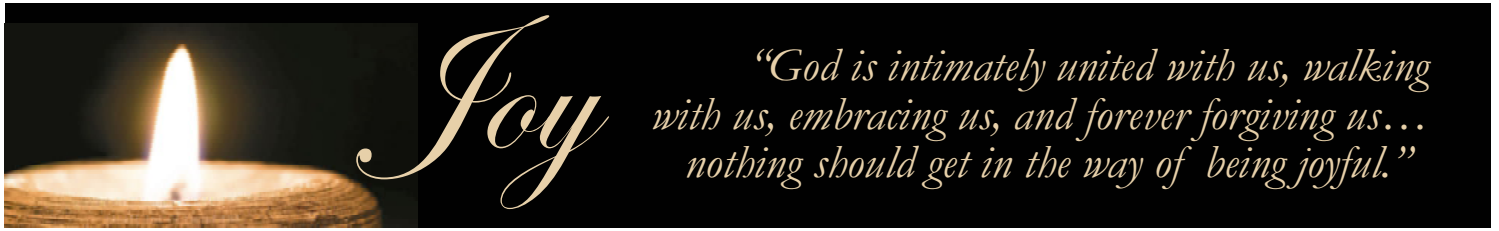

The third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete or Rejoice Sunday, draws us further into the Advent season and the great joy of the birth of Jesus at Christmas. As people of faith, we have just about every reason to be joyful. This means that, because we believe in God, a God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, who is the maker of everything, is Power, Authority, Justice, Mercy, and Love, who is intimately united with us, walking with us, embracing us, and forever forgiving us, there is nothing that should get in the way of our being joyful. It's possible that we struggle with believing sometimes, allowing human failures, sins, and ignorance to darken our relationship with God, but that doesn't change what we actually know through what we believe. God is with us!

Today is also the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. If we've ever been confused about who God is, wondering if He really loves us, really sees us, understands our hurts, forgives our stupidities, and fills us with grace, we have Our Mother to assure us of everything we believe. Mary reveals with her life everything we need to have hope and challenges us to reveal that hope with our lives. Although we know Mary experienced all human emotions, she never allowed sin to disrupt her belief that God exists, and with Him, all things are possible. Her own appearances, graced with the Holy Spirit, draw us further into the Advent season and the great joy of the birth of Jesus at Christmas. As people of faith, we do have every reason to be joyful!

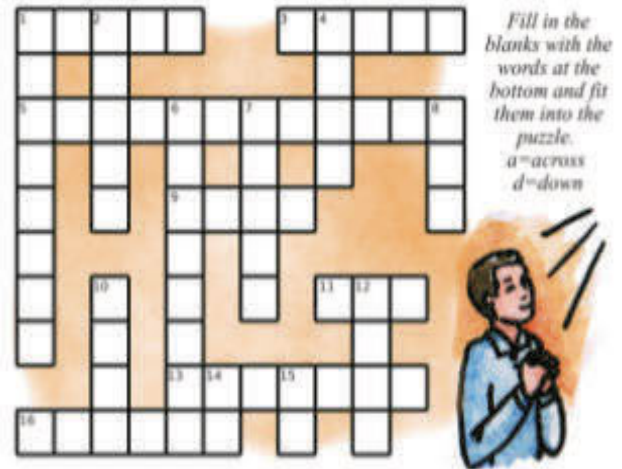

A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 4 Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

While a broken life is placed in the hands of Jesus, it will become perfect after his blessing and breaking. Regarding the two miracles of feeding the 5,000 and the 4,000 respectively, Jesus broke the bread. The verb "break" (eklasen) here is a symbol of sharing. Jesus firstly gave the bread and fish to the disciples and then they distributed the food to the crowd. As a matter of fact, Jesus is not hierarchical but to strengthen the faith of his disciples in order that they could witness to Jesus in the future. In addition, the disciples also learned from Jesus how to share the grace of God. The church is a piece of miraculous bread that Jesus shares with the world until the end of time.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS - The Well That Never Dries Up

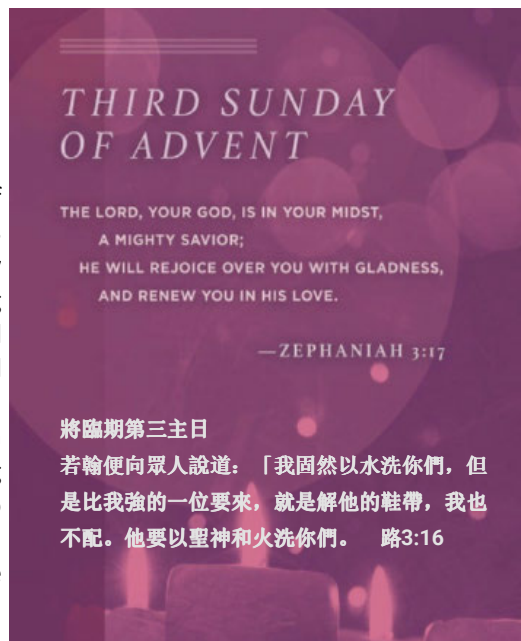
Depending on how your mood is today, the words of Paul will hit you differently. "Rejoice always," he tells us. Well, if your football team is poised to win this weekend or next, maybe you're really feeling this vibe. But if you've got a long slog at work ahead of you this week and a to-do list that only seems to grow and never shrink, it may make you grumble. "Rejoice always? Always? When I'm tired? Cranky? When I'm sick of doing and giving? Thanks, Paul. I'll be sure to scribble that phrase on a Post-It and stick it to my dashboard for when some entitled punk inevitably cuts me off on tomorrow's morning commute."

When we feel this way, we know it's time to head back to the well. Think of all the places in Scripture where God compares His love, His mercy, His salvation to water. And not just any water — living water, water that moves. God's strength is not a stagnant puddle sure to evaporate and disappear. It's water you can keep coming back to. It's water that never dries up.

Which is good news for us, because we never stop failing to do what we should, never stop failing to feel the joy and the compassion and the selflessness we are called to. We need a source of living water if we are going to 'rejoice always.' To be everyday stewards, we need a well that never empties.

The fountain of salvation never dries up. There is always more there for us to draw from. It's a sign of His commitment — so let us, in turn, be committed to Him.

當我有這種感覺時，就是該回到源頭之時，想想聖經中天主的愛，天主的仁慈，祂的活水救恩。不僅僅只是一般的水 - 是活水，流動的水，天主的力量不是一攤會蒸發的死水，而是可持續使用，永不乾涸的水。

這對我們來說是個好消息，因為我們永不會停止做我們該做的事，永不缺乏去感受我們被召叫要有惻隱之心及無私的喜樂，如果我們要"常常喜樂"，我們就需要活水源頭，每天要成為天主的僕人，那我們需要一口永不枯竭的井。

救恩的泉源永不乾涸，總是有許多足以使我們引以為鑑的事情。這是祂許諾的標誌 - 所以讓我們也反過來對祂許諾。
