A Sign of Hope

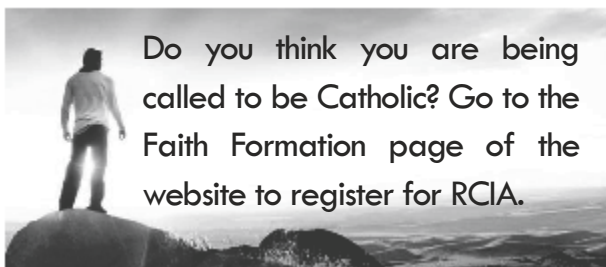

Faith. Hope and Love



We are now in the Christmas season and today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. This day conjures up the image of the baby Jesus with Mary and Joseph adoringly watching Him and the animals being at peace in His presence. For me, the Holy Family is always Mary and Joseph adoringly watching the child Jesus. Of course the Holy Family experienced many other situations throughout the life of Jesus the Christ.

All of the scriptural references of Jesus, Mary and Joseph are significant, as well as the many unmentioned stories that took place within that family.

What is beautiful about our nativity scenes is the great stillness that seems to pervade the attention of those who are present. Nothing seems to be able to disturb the peace of being in the presence of the baby Jesus, even though they are outside, in the cold with animals, smells and lack of provisions. All is well. Maybe our crèches are a little romanticized and unrealistic, still, we can believe that being in the presence of Christ, no matter where it is, peace must rule.

Of course, there are many images in the Gospels where Christ is present and the people are not peaceful. Many times, we can be in Christ's presence but not be with Christ. Christ Himself brought Christ with Him wherever He went. That is obvious. Yet, so often He wasn't recognized. People were looking for something else. We can often look for something, even for Christ, and not see that He is right in our midst. COVID-19 is causing us Catholics to re-imagine how Christ is present to us. We are challenged to make our families and our homes places of worship where the Christ child can be experienced. Our "domestic churches" are coming into focus and creating an even stronger appreciation of "God with us." We might find ourselves frustrated, irritated by "proper protocols," saddened by the many people who have died, upset by the great divisions that exist in our country, and wishing that we could just get back into our churches. However, to fail to take advantage of the great opportunity to live in our holy homes like the Holy Family (who never experienced a Catholic Cathedral), would be to reject the very gift that comes with today's celebration.

Today we embrace a church that dwells within people's homes. Soon we will once again embrace that larger family that dwells in our Cathedral home. May God continue to bless you all.

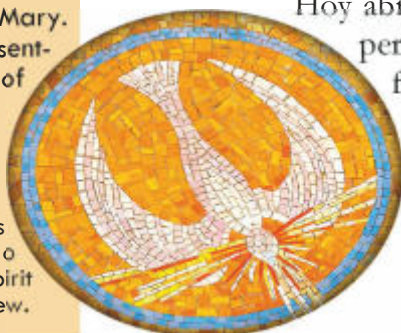
Ahora estamos en la temporada navideña y hoy celebramos la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia. Este día evoca la imagen del niño Jesús con María y José mirándolo con adoración y los animales en paz en su presencia. Para mí, la Sagrada Familia es siempre María y José mirando con adoración al niño Jesús. Por supuesto, la Sagrada Familia experimentó muchas otras situaciones a lo largo de la vida de Jesucristo. Todas las referencias bíblicas de Jesús, María y José son significativas, así como las muchas historias no mencionadas que tuvieron lugar dentro de esa familia.

Herod, perceiving that he was deluded by the wise men, was exceeding angry, and sent his soldiers to kill all the male children ages two and under that were in Bethlehem and on the borders, according to the time which he had diligently inquired of the wise men. Then was fulfilled the prophesy of Jeremiah: "A voice in Rama was heard, of lamentation and great mourning; Rachel bewailed her children, and would not be comforted, because they were not."

The Feast of the Holy Innocents is a children's feast; this day has also been known as "Childermas." This is a good day to begin the parental blessing of their children.

"Mary, the all-holy ever-virgin Mother of God, is the masterwork of the mission of the Son and the Spirit in the fullness of time. For the first time in the plan of salvation and because his Spirit had prepared her, the Father found the dwelling place where his Son and his Spirit could dwell among men. In this sense the Church's Tradition has often read the most beautiful texts on wisdom in relation to Mary. Mary is acclaimed and represented in the liturgy as the "Seat of Wisdom." — CCC#721

A plenary indulgence may be gained by reciting or singing the hymn *Veni Creator Spiritus* on the first day of the year. This hymn is traditionally sung for beginnings of things, calling on the Holy Spirit before endeavoring something new.

Nuestras "iglesias domésticas" se están enfocando y están creando una apreciación aún más fuerte de "Dios con nosotros". Podríamos encontrarnos frustrados, irritados por los "protocolos adecuados", entristecidos por las muchas personas que han muerto, molestos por las grandes divisiones que existen en nuestro país y deseando poder volver a nuestras iglesias. Sin embargo, no aprovechar la gran oportunidad de vivir en nuestros santos hogares como la Sagrada Familia (que nunca conoció una catedral católica), sería rechazar el mismo regalo que viene con la celebración de hoy.

Hoy abrazamos una iglesia que habita en los hogares de las personas. Pronto, una vez más abrazaremos a esa familia más grande que habita en nuestra casa de la Catedral. Que Dios continúe bendiciéndolos a todos.

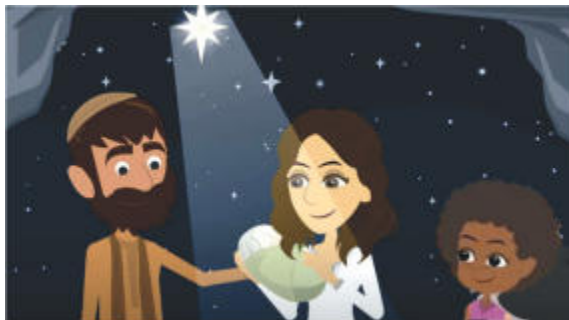
"¡Esto es Dios!" Se recuerda a sí mismo.

A Time to Ponder

Mary is exhausted after having given birth to her son, Jesus. She cradles him in her arms, humming a gentle lullaby to the newborn. Joseph too is tired from the travel, glad to have found a warm, dry place for Jesus to be born. With heavy eyelids, he gazes with wonder at the child.

“This is God!” He reminds himself.

And he ponders how it is that the child resting in Mary’s arms is from heaven. So much has taken place! The year for Mary and Joseph began with joy at being betrothed, making plans for a life together! And how on March 25th (the Feast of the Annunciation on the modern calendar) Mary conceived Jesus through the Holy Spirit. How God’s plan turned their world upside down! Mary and Joseph know exactly what it is like to have a year like no other! To have their plans interrupted and changed. They too know about isolation (Mary being pregnant before they lived together caused scandal and made them social outcasts). It was almost too much, and would have been if not for the gift of faith in the Angel’s message that this child was truly from God.

Lost in his thoughts, Joseph didn’t hear the approaching shepherds. He gripped his staff a little tighter, ready to fend off any who might endanger Mary and the sleeping baby. Immediately, Joseph relaxed, seeing the joy in the shepherds faces. They too were visited by an angel who told them to come to Bethlehem where they would find the Messiah. Mary sat quietly taking this all in, no words were possible to describe what was taking place. So she gathered the memories in her heart, listening in awe at the story the shepherds told, looking at them, and then at the babe in her arms.

This little child is the Savior of the world!

Perhaps our lives too are passing through a year like no other. Let us ask for the gift of faith, that through the intercession of the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph, we might have courage to ponder them with faith. Mary didn’t understand all of the signs in her life, but she knew God was the author of them, and she pondered them daily in her heart. Maybe we can too.
