






## Summer Series: The At-Home Pilgrim

### A Pilgrim Seeks to Know His Inner Witness

The Inner Witness is that place of interior retreat and rootedness - the place of both the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and the True Self - and is precisely what inspires our search for the Divine.

This is the common search of all humanity, and yet many do not know their Inner Witness - their truest self and their source of connection to the Sacred. From the pain and brokenness that inevitably accompany life, they have come to believe God is not real. Or perhaps they have been told that God is real - and even believe it - but they do not truly know God, because they are told that the image of God within humanity only existed at the time of creation, not that it is something that we all bear and have access to each day.

One religious denomination that recognizes the imprint of the image of God on humanity is the Eastern Orthodox tradition of Christianity. According to the Eastern Orthodox doctrine known as theosis, the purpose of life is the uncovering of the image of God - or imago Dei - within each one of us. It is a lifelong journey into the likeness of Christ, who is both fully human and fully Divine.

A good way to describe this is by the metaphor of polishing silver. Like magnificent silver, the image of God is embedded within each one of us, though it has been tarnished by the pain and brokenness within the world. The journey to uncover the image of God within us is like polishing the silver, and with each intentional movement we reveal more of our true selves as image bearers, and more of the Divine, whose image we bear.

No matter the journey, this is the essence of the pilgrim's quest. Led by the Sacred Guide, the pilgrim who seeks to know his Inner Witness journeys toward his true essence as an image bearer and consequently also the Divine.

**PRACTICE:** Pay attention to your dreams. Belief in the power of dreams might seem too new-age for many Christians today, but you can't deny that the medium of dreams for communicating a message or reality was often used by God in the Bible. Dreams exist beyond our control, and therefore it is often said that dreams tell us things that we are unable or unwilling to recognize otherwise. Our dreams are thus a valuable medium of communication for our Inner Witness, where our True Self and the Holy Spirit can join together to freely speak their truths.

Where do you encounter the wisdom of the Inner Witness?

# Bishop Jaime Soto issues statement on recent clergy abuse scandals

**August 16** - This morning, in the wake of these recent reports of clergy abuse, Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, President of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, published a statement. In it he said, "I apologize and humbly ask your forgiveness for what my brother bishops and I have done and failed to do. Whatever the details may turn out to be regarding Archbishop (Theodore) McCarrick or the many abuses in Pennsylvania (or anywhere else), we already know that one root cause is the failure of episcopal leadership."

The People of God deserve better. Over the last decade we have made strides in Sacramento to create safe environments for the families entrusted to us. My brother priests and I must continue working to earn the trust of the Catholic community. In the wake of the recent events, we must listen compassionately, counsel with confidence about the steps already taken, and assure the faithful that we will remain vigilant.

These shameful events raise questions and concerns among the faithful and the greater community. We should honestly acknowledge the sins and failings of the past, but even more importantly, in addition to owning and atoning for what happened in the past we must continue to demonstrate our commitment to care for the victims and prevent these sins from happening again.

I assure you that in the Diocese of Sacramento:

- The bishop, priests, and pastoral staff take seriously all complaints of sexual misconduct.
- Any accusation alleging criminal activity is reported to law enforcement and/or child protective services.
- All steps will be taken to protect the faithful, especially children and young people, including fingerprinting and background checks for all clergy; safe environment training for children, staff and clergy; and zero tolerance for anyone credibly accused of abusing a minor.
- Victims are provided with the pastoral care they need.

Please pray for those who have suffered from sexual abuse, that they may experience God's profound love for them and God's healing powers.

I also ask you to pray for all my brother priests and deacons who earnestly strive to grow in holiness and serve you with devotion.

Let us keep one another in prayer.

# The Story of the Martyrdom of John the Baptist

The drunken oath of a king with a shallow sense of honor, a seductive dance and the hateful heart of a queen combined to bring about the martyrdom of John the Baptist. The greatest of prophets suffered the fate of so many Old Testament prophets before him: rejection and martyrdom. The "voice crying in the desert" did not hesitate to accuse the guilty, did not hesitate to speak the truth. But why? What possesses a man that he would give up his very life?

This great religious reformer was sent by God to prepare the people for the Messiah. His vocation was one of selfless giving. The only power that he claimed was the Spirit of Yahweh. "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3:11).

Scripture tells us that many people followed John looking to him for hope, perhaps in anticipation of some great messianic power. John never allowed himself the false honor of receiving these people for his own glory. He knew his calling was one of preparation. When the time came, he led his disciples to Jesus: "The next day John was there again with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God.' The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus" (John 1:35-37).

It is John the Baptist who has pointed the way to Christ. John's life and death were a giving over of self for God and other people. His simple style of life was one of complete detachment from earthly possessions. His heart was centered on God and the call that he heard from the Spirit of God speaking to his heart. Confident of God's grace, he had the courage to speak words of condemnation, repentance, and salvation.

## Reflection





2018-2019 School Year: CCD Classes for K – 6th Grade will begin on Saturday, September 8, 2018, at 10:00 am. Confirmation Classes for 7th Graders and up will begin on Tuesday, September 11, 2018, at 7:00 pm.

For children over 7 years of age and teens, 7th Grade and higher, who are not baptized, and teens who did not complete their sacraments of Communion and Confirmation, classes will begin on Sunday, September 9, 2018, at 9:00 am. 



## Serie de verano: El Peregrino en la casa

### Un peregrino busca conocer a su testigo interno

El Testigo Interno es ese lugar de retiro interior y de enraizamiento, el lugar tanto de la morada interna del Espíritu Santo como del Verdadero Ser, y es precisamente lo que inspira nuestra búsqueda de lo Divino.


Esta es la búsqueda común de toda la humanidad, y sin embargo, muchos no conocen a su Testigo interno, su ser más verdadero y su fuente de conexión con lo Sagrado. Del dolor y del quebrantamiento que inevitablemente acompañan a la vida, han llegado a creer que Dios no es real. O quizás se les ha dicho que Dios es real, e incluso lo creen, pero no conocen verdaderamente a Dios, porque se les dice que la imagen de Dios dentro de la humanidad solo existía en el momento de la creación, no que sea algo que nosotros todos tenemos y tenemos acceso a cada día.

Una denominación religiosa que reconoce la impronta de la imagen de Dios en la humanidad es la tradición ortodoxa oriental del cristianismo. De acuerdo con la doctrina ortodoxa oriental conocida como theosis, el propósito de la vida es el descubrimiento de la imagen de Dios, o imago Dei, dentro de cada uno de nosotros. Es un viaje de toda la vida a la semejanza de Cristo, que es totalmente humano y totalmente divino. Una buena manera de describir esto es mediante la metáfora de pulir plata. Como magnífica plata, la imagen de Dios está incrustada en cada uno de nosotros, aunque ha sido empañada por el dolor y el quebrantamiento en el mundo. El viaje para descubrir la imagen de Dios dentro de nosotros es como pulir la plata, y con cada movimiento intencional revelamos más de nuestro verdadero yo como portadores de la imagen, y más de lo Divino, cuya imagen llevamos.

No importa el viaje, esta es la esencia de la búsqueda del peregrino. Dirigido por la Guía Sagrada, el peregrino que busca conocer sus Testigos Internos viaja hacia su verdadera esencia como portador de la imagen y consecuentemente también a lo Divino. PRÁCTICA: presta atención a tus sueños. La creencia en el poder de los sueños puede parecer muy nueva para muchos cristianos hoy en día, pero no se puede negar que el medio de los sueños para comunicar un mensaje o realidad a menudo fue usado por Dios en la Biblia. Los sueños existen más allá de nuestro control, y por lo tanto, a menudo se dice que los sueños nos dicen cosas que de otro modo no podemos o no queremos reconocer. Nuestros sueños son por lo tanto un valioso medio de comunicación para nuestro Testigo Interno, donde nuestro Ser Tero y el Espíritu Santo pueden unirse para hablar libremente sus verdades.

### MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

Las lecturas de la Liturgia de este domingo nos retan a escoger si nos vamos o nos quedamos. Si escogemos quedarnos se nos exige ser sinceros y fieles al Señor. La Primera Lectura nos dice que Josué junto con su familia decide servir a Yavé. El pueblo, por su ejemplo, responde también servir a Dios. También, con respecto a la fe se deben tomar decisiones a veces arriesgadas, pero necesarias para continuar en el camino. En el Evangelio de hoy terminamos de leer el discurso del pan de vida. Ahora, aparecen de nuevo los discípulos con Jesús, ellos, si recuerdan, habían estado en la multiplicación de los panes y con clara evidencia de no comprender la actitud y acciones de Jesús. Después aparecen en escena los judíos que murmuraban y criticaban también las palabras del Señor. Ante tal realidad, Jesús, inmediatamente afronta la situación.

Jesús le preguntó a los Doce: "¿Quieren marcharse también ustedes?". (Juan 6:67). Pedro responde en plural en representación de todos. "Señor, ¿a quién iríamos? Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna. Nosotros creemos y sabemos que tú eres el Santo de Dios". (Juan 6:67-69) Los doce comprenden que fuera de Jesús no hay esperanza y no hay salvación. Sin él van al fracaso total. Pedro lo reconoce aún más allá, es el Santo de Dios. Pedro hizo lo suyo, pero, nosotros, ¿cómo confesamos la fe en Jesús? ¿cómo pedimos que el Señor aumente nuestra fe? Serviremos, al Señor en el necesitado, el pobre, el sin voz. 


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## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

### 聖路易



聖路易是法國的國王，主曆一二一四年四月廿五日出生。主曆一二二六年十一月七日，父親路易八世駕崩。路易登基，他還只有九歲，由母親白蘭士攝政。路易勤政親民，熱心愛護教會，對神職人員懷有莫大的尊敬。主曆一二四四年，路易決定率軍隊參加十字軍戰役。尼羅河水高潮漲，埃及夏季天氣炎熱，路易的軍隊無法前進。過了六個月，他們才能和敵軍交戰，兵士不服水土，患病很多，損失慘重。戰事一再失利，路易被敵軍俘虜。

路易在被俘期內，每天和兩位隨軍司鐸念日課，態度鎮靜，恍如舊日在王宮一樣。看守他的兵士有時對他無理侮辱，他應付的態度完全與國君的地位相稱。敵軍要求他交出敘利亞的堡屋，他堅決拒絕。敵人以苦刑威脅他，路易答道：「你們只能控制我的身體，不能控制我的靈魂、我的意志。」敵人要求路易付出鉅額金幣，和割讓杜姆亞特城，作為贖金。路易昂然道：「我身為一國之君，豈可以金錢作價回贖。」過了一個時期，路易獲釋，恢復自由，率領殘軍赴巴勒斯坦，朝聖聖地，安撫教徒，鞏固拉丁王國的軍事設備。

主曆一二六七年，路易宣布組織一個新的十字軍，恢復聖地。主曆一二七零年七月一日，路易的軍隊揚帆出發，在突尼斯登陸，不久，路易和他們長子斐理伯都染上斑疹傷寒，病勢日趨沉重，八月廿四日，他領了終傅聖事，召希臘大使到病榻前，力促希臘教徒與羅馬教會復合。八月廿五日上午起，他舌頭僵硬，不能言語。過了一會兒，他又能說話，舉目向天，朗誦聖詠：「主，我將進入你的屋舍；我將在你聖殿裡，崇拜你；我將顯揚你的聖名。」下午三時，他又啓唇道：「我將我的靈魂托付你手。」言畢，瞑目安逝，遺骸迎回法國。路易於主曆一二九七年由教宗波尼法爵八世封聖。

#### St. Louis of France

Saint Louis was the king of France and was born on April 25, 1214. On November 7, 1226, his father, Louis VIII, passed away. Louis was crowned while he was only twelve years old and his mother Blanche became his regent. Louis is diligent and likes to be close to the people, eager to protect the church, and has great respect for the clergy. In 1244, Louis decided to lead the army to participate in the Crusader. The waters of the Niles rose, the weather in Egypt was hot in summer, so the army of Louis could not move forward. After six months, they were able to fight the enemy. The soldiers could not adapt to the environment, and they suffered a lot and suffered heavy losses. Louis was defeated and captured by the enemy.

During the period of his capture, Louis and his two military officers mourned the daily class, and they were calm, just like how they had been in the palace. The guards frequently insulted him, yet his attitude remains as if he is still the king. The enemy asked him to surrender the castle in Syrian, but he refused. The enemy threatened him with a torture, and Louis replied: "You can only control my body, not my soul, my will." The enemy asked Louis to pay a huge amount of gold coins and cede the city of Damietta as a ransom. Louis said with no fear: "As a king of a country, I cannot redeem money for a price." After a while, Louis was released, restored freedom, led the army to Palestine, pilgrimage to the Holy Land, appease the believers, and consolidate the military equipment of the Latin Kingdom.

In 1267, Louis announced the formation of new crusaders to restore the Holy Land. On July 1, 1270, Louis's army sailed and landed in Tunisia. Soon, Louis and their eldest son, Filippo, were infected with typhus, and it became increasingly worse. On August 24th, he took the final sacrament and called the Greek ambassador to him to urge the Greeks to reunite with the Roman church. In the morning August 25, his tongue became stiff and could not speak. After a moment, he could talk again, raise his eyes to heaven, and recite the Holy Spirit: "Lord, I will enter your house; I will worship you in your temple; I will reveal your holy name." At the time, he opened his lips again: "I will entrust my soul to your hand." After the words were finished, the eyes closed, and he passed away. His body was returned to France. He was canonized in 1297 by Pope Boniface VIII.
