I offer you wisdom, insight, youth, beauty, meaning, eternity.


There is no awe -

(Scots: *Saunt Magret*, c. 1045 – 16 November 1093), also known as **Margaret of Wessex**, was an English princess and a Scottish queen. Margaret was sometimes called "The Pearl of Scotland".<sup>[1]</sup> Born in exile in the Kingdom of Hungary, she was the sister of Edgar Ætheling, the shortly reigned and uncrowned Anglo-Saxon King of England. Margaret and her family returned to the Kingdom of England in 1057, but fled to the Kingdom of Scotland following the Norman conquest of England in 1066. By the end of 1070, Margaret had married King Malcolm III of Scotland, becoming Queen of Scots.

She was a very pious Roman Catholic, and among many charitable works she established a ferry across the Firth of Forth in Scotland for pilgrims travelling to St Andrews in Fife, which gave the towns of South Queensferry and North Queensferry their names. Margaret was the mother of three kings of Scotland, or four, if Edmund of Scotland, who ruled with his uncle, Donald III, is counted, and of a queen consort of England. According to the *Vita S. Margaritae (Scotorum) Reginae (Life of St. Margaret, Queen (of the Scots))*, attributed to Turgot of Durham, she died at Edinburgh Castle in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1093, merely days after receiving the news of her husband's death in battle.

In 1250, Pope Innocent IV canonized her, and her remains were reinterred in a shrine in Dunfermline Abbey in Fife, Scotland. Her relics were dispersed after the Scottish Reformation and subsequently lost. Mary, Queen of Scots, at one time owned her head, which was subsequently preserved by Jesuits in the Scottish College, Douai, France, from where it was subsequently lost during the French Revolution. Dear Friends in Christ:

On Monday, November 12th, I will join my brother bishops for the week-long assembly of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. At this meeting, we will make critical decisions regarding the scourge of sex abuse by clergy in our Church. I pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us to act as vigilant guardians of the young and vulnerable in our Church.

Each bishop must confront the past and the shameful history of priests and bishops who betrayed the trust place in them by the People of God. Children and young people were scarred by horrible, wicked crimes committed by the very people they had been taught to rely on as spiritual leaders. We must seek atonement for these sins and work continually to be worthy of the trust of God's people. Only after such atonement can we expect there to be confidence in the measures we take to safeguard the vulnerable in our parishes, schools, and ministries.

To prepare for this assembly, I ask of you to join me in prayer for three intentions:

- For the healing and support of all victims of clergy sexual abuse.
- For the conversion and just punishment of the perpetrators and concealers of sexual abuse.
- For the strength of the bishops to be holy shepherds in protecting and leading God's people from all harm.

Thank you for your prayers. Please know that I am grateful for them, and that I hold you in my prayers as well.

**CHRISTIAN SYMBOLS:** Found on gravestones throughout the world, R.I.P. is an abbreviation that has a rich history. The letters stand for a Latin phrase, *requiescat in pace*. The direct translation in English is "rest in peace," though the Latin words are actually part of a much longer prayer for the deceased.

The first use of the Latin phrase dates to the 8th century and is meant to be a prayer for the deceased person, praying that they may experience eternal rest in Heaven. It corresponds with the Catholic belief in purgatory and the phrase remains a central part of Catholic funeral ceremonies today. (Philip Koslowski | Aleteia.org)

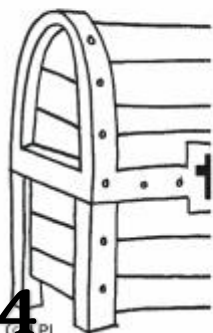

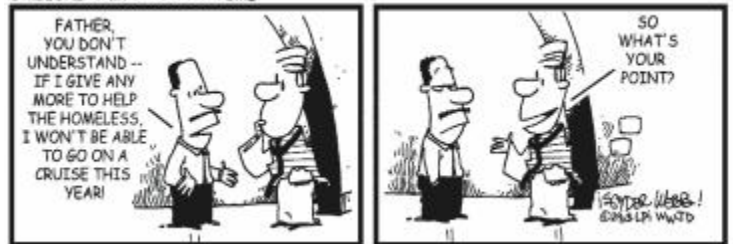
**Prayer** - Dear God, help me to quietly give you the best of all that you have given me.

## VERSO DEL EVANGELIO DE DOMINGO

En esto, se acercó una viuda pobre y echó dos moneditas de muy poco valor. Llamando entonces a sus discípulos, Jesús les dijo: "Yo les aseguro que esa pobre viuda ha echado en la alcancía más que todos". - Mc 12, 42-43

## MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

El punto de la enseñanza de hoy es muy adecuado para la sociedad moderna. En los tiempos antiguos, como ahora, la lucha de muchas personas estribaba en cómo prescindir del materialismo, de lo superfluo. Desear poco y ocupar poco es lucha y reto. El padre Pedro Arrupe, sacerdote Jesuita, expresaba lo innecesario de la siguiente forma: "Lo superfluo se torna conveniente, lo conveniente necesario, y lo necesario imprescindible." Jesús, enseña a la gente a estar alerta de no ser hipócritas como los maestros de la Ley. Decía: "Cuidense de esos maestros de la Ley a quienes les gusta pasear con amplias vestiduras, ser saludados en las plazas y ocupar asientos reservados en las sinagogas y los banquetes" (Marcos 12:39-40). El problema, no estaba en el vestir bien y ser notables en la sociedad.

Sino, en el maltrato que daban a las viudas. Eso era lo que Jesús condenaba severamente. Por lo tanto Él les explica lo que había visto en el Templo, sobre la ofrenda de la viuda. "Yo les aseguro que esta viuda pobre ha dado más que todos los otros. Pues todos han echado de lo que les sobra, mientras ella ha dado desde su pobreza; no tenía más, y dio todos sus recursos" (Marcos 12:43-44). ¿Cómo son las ofrendas que damos, de lo que nos sobra o de lo que nos duele dar? Recordemos que ahora tenemos el papel de discípulos misioneros de Jesucristo y se espera que la compasión y la misericordia brote del corazón que ama al Señor.

## VIVIR LA LITURGIA

Todos somos algo de generosos. Para muchos, cuando uno le pide algo - de su tiempo, talento o tesoro - considera si "está a su alcance" hacer lo que otro le pide. A pesar de la solicitud de otros, muchos todavía mantienen sus propias necesidades. En algún momento, ¿usted ha dado lo poquito que le queda de su tiempo, talento o tesoro sabiendo que ya no habrá más para usted? Todos tendemos a ser medios codiciosos de nuestro tiempo, talento y tesoro. Hay mucha gente a través de la historia que ha dado todo solo para encontrarse con muchos regalos. San Francisco de Asís es un testigo excelente a esto. Las escrituras de hoy nos demuestran a dos viudas que hacen lo mismo. ¿Usted ve a estas personas como ejemplos de tontería o de sabiduría?

## LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

¿De qué forma se revela el sacrificio? Yo pienso en las personas que han servido en las fuerzas armadas. Ellos han sacrificado tanto para mi libertad y para llegar a una verdadera paz. Pienso en los que sirven a la Iglesia: los sacerdotes, diáconos y los religiosos. Sus vidas están dedicadas a la oración y a los trabajos bondadosos para que la Buena Nueva no solamente se extienda pero que se manifieste en el amor que ellos demuestran hacia Dios y a sus hermanos y hermanas. Pienso en los padres que se quedan despiertos por las noches con sus hijos enfermos y que ya cuando están más grandes sus hijos, se quedan despiertos por las noches esperando que lleguen a casa bien. Pienso en los maestros que trabajan duro, sin ganar mucho dinero y que no reciben el respeto que se merecen, para educar a la siguiente generación de ciudadanos.

Yo veo el sacrificio en todo mí alrededor. Yo pienso que usted también lo pueda ver si verdaderamente intenta. Sin embargo también noto que hay tanta gente que solo se preocupa por sobresalir ante los demás, sea como sea. Veo que hay gente que tiene tanto y anhelan aún más. Veo que hay gente que es tan egoísta hasta el punto de destruir a sus familias y sus amistades. Literalmente mueren por una falta de compasión. Veo que hay tanta gente que se le ha olvidado de dónde vienen todos sus tesoros, si lo sabían para comenzar.

Pienso en todos esos que viven tan sacrificados y todos los demás que son lo opuesto de ellos. Que nuestros ojos vean más de ellos que son generosos. Que no nos enfoquemos en los que han abandonado a los demás y que nos enfoquemos en los que han sacrificado tanto para los demás. Que el testigo del verdadero sacrificio nos ilumine el camino hacia nuestro Padre y el camino a una vida llena de Su amor.

### 聖瑪爾定(十一月十一日)

聖瑪爾定原籍班諾尼省（今匈牙利境內），公元三一六年出生，父母都是外教人。

瑪爾定的父親是軍官，所以他十五歲的時候，父親就強迫他加入軍隊，駐屯法國的亞米央城。那時候，他雖然還是一個望教者，尚未正式領洗，生活方式，已與隱修士相同。

有一天，瑪爾定隨軍駐紮於高盧時遇上一名乞丐，他看到乞丐衣衫破爛在酷寒中發抖的樣子而心生憐憫，就將自身的袍子割下一半贈送給了該乞丐。當晚他夢見耶穌託夢，而耶穌身上穿着的正是他當日送給乞丐的半件袍子。

瑪爾定因這個夢受到啟發，因此立下志向想成為一名隱修士，他受洗後向上司請求退伍，並受業於波亞疊的主教希納略門下。後來希納略因為反對當時羅馬當局支持的亞流派，所以遭到流放。於是他就回到了童時居住的意大利，並度過幾年的獨居隱修生活。三六一年時因為恩師希納略回歸，他又回到了高盧，並且建立了當地第一個隱修院。

三七一年，瑪爾定當選都爾主教。人們知道他不肯擔任主教的職位。到了城裡，就擁他往聖堂，舉行祝聖禮。在場觀禮的人，一部份認為瑪爾定容貌猥瑣，不堪膺此重任，事實證明，他們的觀察完全錯誤。

瑪爾定於三九七年十一月八日逝世，葬於都爾城。教友到他墳墓致敬者，接踵不絕，後來成為法國重要的朝聖地點之一。

#### St. Martin of Tours

Martin was born in 316 in Savaria in the Diocese of Pannonia (now Szombathely, Hungary). His parents are not Christian.

As the son of a veteran officer, Martin at fifteen was required to join a cavalry ala. At the age of 15, he was stationed at Amiens, France. At that time, although he was still a preacher, he had not officially been baptized, and his lifestyle was the same as that of the monk.

One day, when Martin was stationed in Gaul, he met a poor man. He saw the man shivering in the cold and felt pity. He gave half of his robes to the man. He saw Jesus in his dream that night, and Jesus was wearing half of his robes that he gave to man that day. Martin was inspired by this dream, so he set his goal to become a monk. After he was baptized, he requested to be discharged from

the army and became disciple of Hilary, the Bishop of Poitiers. He opposed the Arianism of the Imperial Court. When Hilary was forced into exile Poitiers, Martin returned to Italy. In 361, he returned to Gaul with the return of Hilary, and established the first local monastery.

In 371, Martin was acclaimed bishop of Tours. People knew that he refuses to serve as a bishop. When he arrived in the city, he went to a church and held a consecration ceremony. Some of the people who attended the ceremony thought that Martin's looks were cumbersome and unbearable. It turned out that their observations were completely wrong.

Martin died on November 8, 397 and was buried in the city of Tour. Many parishioners visited his graves to pay respect to him, and his grave has continued to be one of the important pilgrimage sites in France.
