



Pastor's Corner



"And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions.

I have been pondering lately over the Kingdom of God. How do we understand with some clarity what and where the Kingdom of God is? I tend to think of it as something I will enter after I rise from the dead with everyone else entering heaven. When I am dead I will finally be in God's kingdom. Yet, Jesus says that this young man is not far from the Kingdom. Is this man about to die? Is that why the others are afraid to ask any more questions? Clearly death does not seem to be the concern. Rather, it is the man's "understanding" that is making him near the Kingdom. What he understands is that the love of God and the love of neighbor are worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices. There is nothing we can do, whether feeding the homeless, having the seats of honor, caring for family, making lots of money, prayer or fasting that is greater than to love God and neighbor.

If we can live this type of love, unconditional, without fear or anxiety, without believing we're the answer, getting beyond ourselves, perhaps getting beyond this kingdom, and simply love God and neighbor, and nothing else, we will know what it feels like to be in the Kingdom of God.

That is a BIG "IF". As well, to move beyond this kingdom will probably appear as if we just don't care what happens to anyone. Can I get beyond this kingdom and still love my neighbor? Somehow I have to be intimately part of this kingdom, loving my neighbor and myself, while not getting lost in worldly distractions.

This kind of love is not possible for us to accomplish. Only through Christ are we able to fully love God and neighbor. Jesus the Christ lived in the world, intimately a part of the lives of everyone around him, yet fully loving God. His example, to sacrifice without counting the cost, to speak without anxiety, to love without conditions, to heal without pride, to touch without lust, and to die without friends, gives us the courage to know it is possible.

If we believe we have to die first before we enter the Kingdom of God, we have probably waited too long. My only prayer is that being not far from the kingdom will be close enough.

The month of **November** is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... For the Lord Himself shall come down from heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise.

The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. Even in the Old Testament prayers and alms were offered for the souls of the dead by those who thought "well and religiously concerning the resurrection." It was believed that 'they who had fallen asleep with godliness had great grace laid up for them' and that "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." We know that a defiled soul cannot enter into heaven. (Excerpted from *Liturical Meditations*, The Sisters of St. Dominic)

A partial indulgence can be obtained by devoutly visiting a cemetery and praying for the departed, even if the prayer is only mental. One can gain a plenary indulgence visiting a cemetery each day between November 1 and November 8. These indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory.

A plenary indulgence, again applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is also granted when the faithful piously visit a church or a public oratory on November 2. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required, that one *Our Father* and the *Creed* be recited.

A partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, can be obtained when the Eternal Rest (*Requiem aeternam*) is prayed. This is a good prayer to recite especially during the month of November:

Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

BISHOP THOMAS GRACE.

ROME, February 27. —Rev. Thos. Grace, rector of the cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament, Sacramento, has been appointed Bishop of the diocese of Sacramento, in succession of Rt. Rev. P. Manogue, D. D.

Bishop Grace has added to the altar in the Cathedral a wall or mural tablet of White marble, surmounted by a cross, in honor of the late Bishop Manogue.

As soon as the artist completes a bust of the prelate it will be placed in the slab. The inscription on the tablet reads (Latin): "In Memory of Most Rev. Patrick Manogue, First Bishop of this Diocese and Founder of this Cathedral, His Grateful Successor Placed This Stone. Jesus, Kind Lord, Grant Him Rest. Born in Ireland, 1831; ordained in Paris, 1861; he gave his soul to God, 1895."

DEEDED TO THE BISHOP.

Patrick William Riordan, Archbishop of the Roman Catholic Church, had deeded to Thomas Grace, Bishop of the Sacramento diocese, all of the property in Tehama county formerly held by Bishop Patrick Manogue. It was willed to Archbishop Riordan upon the death of Bishop Manogue, to be held by him until a successor should be appointed to the vacancy caused by the death of Bishop Manogue. Bishop Grace is the successor, and the deed is made to carry out the provisions of the will, wherein the Archbishop was to turn over the property to the successor.



"Spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ among Catholic communities through ACTS."



Esquina del Pastor



"Y cuando Jesús vio que respondía con comprensión, le dijo: "No estás lejos del reino de Dios". Y nadie se atrevió a hacerle más preguntas.

Últimamente he estado reflexionando sobre el Reino de Dios. ¿Cómo entendemos con cierta claridad qué y dónde está el Reino de Dios? Tiendo a pensar en esto como algo en lo que entrará después de que resucite de entre los muertos con todos los demás entrando al cielo. Cuando muera, finalmente estaré en el reino de Dios. Sin embargo, Jesús dice que este joven no está lejos del Reino. ¿Está este hombre a punto de morir? ¿Es por eso que los demás tienen miedo de hacer más preguntas? Claramente la muerte no parece ser la preocupación. Más bien, es el "entendimiento" del hombre lo que lo está acercando al Reino. Lo que él entiende es que el amor de Dios y el amor al prójimo valen más que todas las ofrendas y sacrificios quemados. No hay nada que podamos hacer, ya sea alimentar a las personas sin hogar, tener los lugares de honor, cuidar de la familia, ganar mucho dinero, orar o ayunar que es mayor que amar a Dios y al prójimo. Si podemos vivir este tipo de amor, incondicional, sin miedo ni ansiedad, sin creer que somos la respuesta, ir más allá de nosotros mismos, tal vez ir más allá de este reino, y simplemente amar a Dios y al prójimo, y nada más, sa-

bremos de qué se trata. Se siente como estar en el Reino de Dios. Eso es un gran "SI". Además, moverse más allá de este reino probablemente aparecerá como si no nos importara lo que le suceda a nadie. ¿Puedo ir más allá de este reino y seguir amando a mi prójimo? De alguna manera, tengo que ser parte íntima de este reino, amar a mi prójimo y a mí mismo, sin perderme en las distracciones mundanas.

Este tipo de amor no es posible para que lo logremos. Solo a través de Cristo podemos amar a Dios y al prójimo. Jesús, el Cristo, vivió en el mundo, intimamente como parte de la vida de todos los que lo rodean, y al mismo tiempo ama plenamente a Dios. Su ejemplo, sacrificar sin contar el costo, hablar sin ansiedad, amar sin condiciones, sanar sin orgullo, tocar sin lujuria y morir sin amigos, nos da el coraje de saber que es posible.

Si creemos que debemos morir primero antes de entrar en el Reino de Dios, es probable que hayamos esperado demasiado. Mi única oración es que estar cerca del reino sea lo suficientemente cerca.

El mes de **noviembre** está dedicado a las Almas Santas en el Purgatorio. La Iglesia conmemora a todos sus hijos fieles que se han apartado de esta vida, pero que aún no han alcanzado las alegrías del cielo. San Pablo nos advierte que no debemos ser ignorantes con respecto a los muertos, ni tristes, "así como otros que no tienen esperanza ... Porque el Señor mismo bajará del cielo ... y los muertos que están en Cristo se levantarán .

La Iglesia siempre nos ha enseñado a orar por aquellos que han ido a la eternidad. Incluso en el Antiguo Testamento se ofrecían oraciones y limosnas por las almas de los muertos por aquellos que pensaban "bien y religiosamente con respecto a la resurrección". Se creía que "los que se habían quedado dormidos con piedad tenían una gran gracia reservada para ellos" y que "por lo tanto, es un pensamiento santo y saludable orar por los muertos, para que puedan ser liberados de los pecados". Sabemos que un alma contaminada no puede entrar en el cielo. (Extraído de Meditaciones Litúrgicas, Las Hermanas de Santo Domingo)

Se puede obtener una indulgencia parcial visitando con devoción un cementerio y orando por los difuntos, incluso si la oración es solo mental. Uno puede obtener una indulgencia plenaria visitando un cementerio cada día entre el 1 de noviembre y el 8 de noviembre. Estas indulgencias son aplicables solo a las Almas en el Purgatorio.

Una indulgencia plenaria, de nuevo aplicable solo a las Almas en el Purgatorio, también se concede cuando los fieles visitan piadosamente una iglesia o un oratorio público el 2 de noviembre. Al visitar la iglesia o el oratorio, se requiere que el Padre Nuestro y el Credo sean requeridos. Recitado

Una indulgencia parcial, aplicable solo a las almas en el purgatorio, se puede obtener cuando se reza el Descanso Eterno (Requiem aeternam). Esta es una buena oración para recitar especialmente durante el mes de noviembre:

Que el eterno descanso les conceda, oh Señor, que la luz perpetua brille sobre ellos. Que las almas de los fieles partan, en la misericordia de Dios, en paz. Amén. (catholicculture.org)

VERSO DEL EVANGELIO DE DOMINGO

El escriba replicó: "Muy bien, Maestro. Tienes razón cuando dices que el Señor es único y que no hay otro fuera de él". Jesús, viendo que había hablado muy sensatamente, le dijo: "No estás lejos del Reino de Dios". - Mc 12, 32. 34

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

Imagina la escena del Evangelio de este domingo. El maestro de la ley estaba observando atentamente las enseñanzas de Jesús. Escuchaba cómo Jesús daba respuestas acertadas y esto le causa admiración y se atreve a preguntar: ¿Qué mandamiento es el primero de todos? La respuesta dada abarca no solo una respuesta sino dos: amar a Dios y al vecino. "Escucha, Israel: El Señor nuestro dios es el único Señor. Amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu inteligencia y con todas tus fuerzas." Luego, añade lo siguiente. "Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo" (Marcos 12:29-31). Ya desde los tiempos de Moisés, el pueblo de Israel vivía en comunidad, cuidándose uno al otro.

Jesús enfoca dos cosas importantes, tanto en su tiempo como ahora. Amar a Dios primero y al vecino como a uno mismo. ¡Qué difícil es esto! Dios ante todo lo que tengo y soy. ¿Cómo despojarme de lo que está lleno mi corazón? Nuestro 'vecino' no es solo la persona que vive a su lado. Dar la excusa que uno no conoce a su 'vecino' es inaceptable. Prójimo, quiere decir próximo. Su próximo es su esposo/a, sus hijos, su comunidad. Definitivamente, la enseñanza de la Palabra de Dios no es un juego de niños. Es un proceso de crecimiento en el amor para toda la vida. Gastarse en darse, eso es amor. El Papa Francisco, nos ayuda en comprender esto: "He aquí el camino del Señor: adorar a Dios, amar a Dios por encima de todo, y amar al prójimo. Es muy sencillo, pero muy difícil. Se puede hacer sólo con la gracia. Pidamos la gracia" (Homilía 15 de octubre de 2013).

VIVIR LA LITURGIA

El amor a Dios y el amor al prójimo son dos cosas que están atados íntimamente. No puede existir uno sin el otro. ¿Quién es mi prójimo y cómo lo amo? Es fácil confesar con los labios que amamos al otro, pero ¿cómo se demuestra esto en acción? Nuestros prójimos no son solo esas personas que están a nuestro alrededor. Todos son nuestros prójimos: los extranjeros, los que han llegado aquí sin papeles, los que nos han lastimado, los que envidiamos, los que damos por hecho y los pobres. Aceptar a la humanidad en todas sus formas no siempre es algo fácil, y hacerlo nos puede sacar de nuestro confort. Trabajar hacia la justicia, como Dios quiere, muchas veces significa ajustar cuánto se sacrifica uno y ajustar sus deseos. La imagen de Dios está en las caras de nuestros prójimos y también está en la nuestra. ¿Cuánto ama usted a su prójimo?

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

Puede preguntarle a muchos cristianos si Dios es lo más importante de su vida, y sin pensarlo, muchos le responderán que sí. Sin embargo, simplemente decir que sí no significa que sea verdad. Es la respuesta automática de muchos pero no estoy seguro de que la gente considera verdaderamente lo que significa esa respuesta. ¿Dios es más importante para usted sobre todo lo que tiene? ¿Es más importante Dios que sus hijos?

Muchas veces queremos creer que Dios es lo más importante de nuestras vidas, pero nuestras acciones revelan la verdad. Decimos y hacemos cosas que demuestran que lo que es más importante son las cosas, las circunstancias o nosotros mismos. Si pusiéramos a Dios primero en nuestras vidas seríamos más generosos, más felices y más realizados. Lo más maravilloso de todo esto es que la mejor autoayuda que podemos practicar es dejar nuestros propios deseos y enfocar todas nuestras energías en Dios. Verdaderamente uno se a ayuda más a sí mismo cuando deja de pensar tanto en sí mismo y dejar todas las preocupaciones en las manos de otro. Por supuesto que ese es Dios. Él sabe todo lo de nuestros corazones. Dios no beneficia de lo que le entregamos. Los frutos nos llegan cuando lo ponemos a Él primero. Le entregamos esos frutos y nos damos cuenta que tenemos más de los que teníamos cuando comenzamos.

¿Qué importancia le da usted a Dios? Su respuesta puede ser la llave de la vida que ha buscado por tanto tiempo.

聖嘉祿·鮑榮茂主教(十一月四日)

聖嘉祿出身義國米蘭貴族，生於公元一五三八年十月二日。嘉祿是一位博學多才的知識分子，熱心提倡學術研究，在梵諦岡創設了學術研究協會，延聘專家作學術演講，擔任專門研究工作。

公元一五六三年，嘉祿領受了鐸品神職。二個月後，祝聖為主教。可是他教廷的公務太忙，一時來不及上任，赴米蘭治理教區。教會根據脫利騰大會會議的決議，編製要理書，修訂禮儀，和聖教音樂，這任務又落在嘉祿的肩上。

公元一五六六年四月，嘉祿到米蘭，致力整頓教區紀律。他自己以身作則，操務苦行，生活儉樸，主教府收入，全部撥充慈善事業。有一次，人們見他的被縕太薄，特給他添置一條厚被。嘉祿道：「不必買，假如天氣寒冷，上了床，身體自然會暖和起來。」

嘉祿公務繁劇，睡眠不足，身體一天比一天衰弱。教宗額我略十三世禁止他在封齋期內，守齋太過分。

公元一五八四年，嘉祿的身體，比以前更衰弱。十月裡，到華拉流山作了一年一度的退省神工。是月廿四日起，病勢惡化。廿九日赴米蘭，諸聖瞻禮日，在故鄉亞隆伯作了最後一次彌撒，追思已亡瞻禮在米蘭領受最後聖事。十一月四日子時，安逝主懷。享年僅四十六歲。嘉祿於公元一六一零年由教宗保祿五世列入聖品。

St. Charles Borromeo (November 4)

St. Borromeo was born on in Milan October 2, 1538 under a noble family. He is a knowledgeable and versatile intellectual who enthusiastically advocates academic research, established an academic research association in Vatican, and hired experts to give academic lectures and special research work.

In 1563, Borromeo was ordained as a priest and as a bishop two months later. However, he was so busy that he did not make it in time to take his ministry in a parish at Milan. According to Council of Trent, bishops such as Borromeo have to compile the books for the church's teachings, revise the etiquette, and the music of the sacrament.

In April 1566, Borromeo went to Milan to work on rectifying the parish discipline. He set himself as a role model, he worked hard, lived a simple life, and the income of the Bishop's Office was all donated to charities. Once, people saw that his bedding was too thin, and he was given a thick blanket. He said: "You don't have to buy it. If the weather is cold and you get into bed, your body will naturally warm up."

Borromeo got so busy that his body is weakening day by day without enough sleep. Pope Gregory XIII ordered him not to fast too much during fasting period.

In 1584, Borromeo became weaker. In October, he went to a mountain nearby for an annual retreat. His condition got worsened on the twenty fourth day of the month. On the 29th, he went to Milan, and on the all soul's day, he held the last mass in his hometown of Arona, and it was the last sacrament he held in Milan. On the midnight of November 4, he passed away. He was canonized in 1610 by Pope Paul V.

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
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
