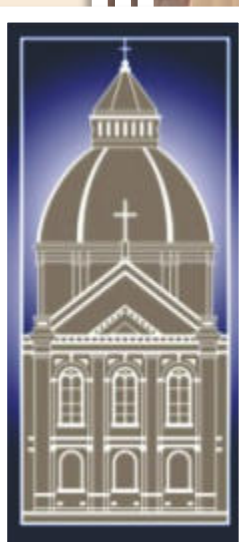

MYSTAGOGY



Question: I've heard of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. What are they, and what's the difference?

Answer: As God has shown us mercy, so too are we called to show mercy to those we encounter. We see mercy throughout the Gospels, but the parable in Matthew 25 forms the foundation for the first set of Works of Mercy. This parable of the last judgment shows each person being asked how well they cared for those around them, and being reminded that this care for those in need is care for God Himself. Each person is asked if they have fed the hungry, given drink to the thirsty, clothed the naked, sheltered the stranger, cared for the sick, and visited the imprisoned. These - along with burying the dead - are the Corporal Works of Mercy, as they primarily concern the physical life of a person.

The list of the Spiritual Works of Mercy developed later. These actions of love primarily concern the inner life of a person. They are instructing the ignorant, counseling the doubtful, admonishing sinners, bearing wrongs patiently, forgiving offenses, comforting the afflicted, and praying for both the living and the dead. All of these actions are concrete ways of bringing the love of God into the world.

CINEMA DIVINA MOVIE REVIEW

In December of this year, *Star Wars: The Rise of Skywalker*, will be released, bookending a nine part movie series that has been over 40 years in the making. The colossal cultural impact of *Star Wars* on the world is undeniable, just about everything imaginable has been marketed, from toys to toasters to t-shirts to even tattoos and they have all been immensely popular. So, why? What is it about this story involving a powerful empire seeking to dominate the universe, headed by an evil leader, who is challenged by a young man from a humble background, inspired by a "force", that has been so captivating, even loved, by millions across the planet?

Star Wars: The Force Awakens (2015), reignited this love, and introduced the smart phone generation to this iconic story, if they had not been already, which is probably unlikely. In this new story we follow *Rey*, a young woman who finds herself thrown into a battle between good and evil that she did not seek. She, like the original movie's protagonist, *Luke Skywalker*, was in way over her head, but despite the challenges, lived up to what she was asked. "Asked"...not directly by someone... but impelled by a "force" that she knew was good. *Rey* moves through the story unsure, but confident the "will" of this "force" is leading her to a greater good beyond her own. She personally struggles, as an orphan, with a past she knows nothing about, gets thrown into a new environment with people she does not know and sought after by an evil empire. Yet, she perseveres, knowing in her heart this "force" will guide her and help her to reach her full potential.

As Catholics we can draw clear parallels to both *Luke Skywalker's* and *Rey's* journeys to our own. We are impelled by the will of God, a "force" so to speak, to follow His will. We are met with both internal and external challenges to accomplishing that will in our lives. But we are not alone. We may not have, "force

powers", but we do have grace. We may not have light sabers but we have sacramentals. We may not have Yoda or Obi Wan to guide us, but we have friends, priests and the saints. The universal appeal of a story like *Star Wars* hits at the core of our calling, that being home to God in heaven. *Luke Skywalker* and *Rey* are, in a sense, science fiction "saints", ordinary people who used their gifts to the fullest, to become extraordinary. We, in the real world, can look back at a history full of men and women who accomplished incredible things against "evil empires". And we, with the "force", "light sabers" and the Obi Wans in our lives...can do the same.

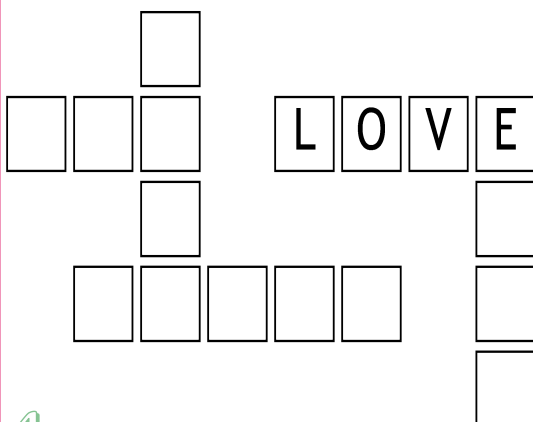
Prayer - Dear God, help me to love my friends like Jesus did.

MYSTAGOGIA



Pregunta: He oído hablar de las obras corporales y espirituales de la misericordia. ¿Qué son y cuál es la diferencia?

Respuesta: Como Dios nos ha mostrado misericordia, también estamos llamados a mostrar misericordia a quienes nos encontramos. Vemos misericordia en todos los evangelios, pero la parábola en Mateo 25 forma la base para el primer conjunto de Obras de Misericordia. Esta parábola del juicio final muestra que a cada persona le preguntaron qué tan bien cuidaban a quienes los rodeaban, y que se les recuerda que este cuidado para los necesitados es el cuidado de Dios mismo. A cada persona se le pregunta si ha alimentado al hambriento, le ha dado de beber al sediento, ha vestido al desnudo, ha protegido al extraño, ha cuidado al enfermo y ha visitado al encarcelado. Estas, junto con el enterramiento de los muertos, son las Obras Corporales de la Misericordia, ya que se refieren principalmente a la vida física de una persona.

La lista de las obras espirituales de la misericordia se desarrolló más adelante. Estas acciones de amor se refieren principalmente a la vida interior de una persona. Están instruyendo a los ignorantes, aconsejando a los dudosos, amonestando a los pecadores, soportando los males con paciencia, perdonando las ofensas, consolando a los afligidos y rezando por los vivos y los muertos. Todas estas acciones son formas concretas de llevar el amor de Dios al mundo.

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

El Evangelio de este V Domingo de Pascua nos dice que "Cuando Judas salió del cenáculo, Jesús dijo: 'Ahora ha sido glorificado el Hijo del hombre y Dios ha sido glorificado en él. Si Dios ha sido glorificado en él, también Dios lo glorificará en sí mismo y pronto lo glorificará.'" (Juan 13:31-32). Con referencia al término de las partidas que frecuentemente indican el final de algo, en esta ocasión Judas cierra su ciclo de fidelidad al Señor. Por el contrario, Jesús anuncia en su partida la apertura a lo nuevo, a la gracia de Dios en la vida humana por medio de la resurrección. Después, Jesús continúa ensañando el mandamiento nuevo; El amor nuevo hacia todos sin distinción de personas, sin límite alguno. Ese amor máximo es comprobado con su muerte de cruz.

¿Amamos nosotros de esa manera? ¿En este momento, a quien le doy amor sin condiciones? El Papa Francisco nos lo repite en todos los momentos que habla en público y en su vida privada. El nos da

respuestas seguras con sus palabras y hechos:

El primero es el mandamiento del amor: ya no sólo "amar al prójimo como a ti mismo", sino un paso más: "Amar al prójimo como yo os he amado". "El amor sin límites. Sin esto la Iglesia no va adelante. La Iglesia no respira". "Sin el amor, no crece, se transforma en una institución vacía, de apariencias, de gestos sin fecundidad. Ir a su cuerpo: Jesús nos dice cómo debemos amar, hasta el final". (Homilía del Papa en Santa Marta Ciudad del Vaticano, 26 de abril de 2108).

VIVIR LA LITURGIA

¿Cómo sabe la gente que eres un discípulo de Jesucristo? Algunas personas prefieren mantener su fe en secreto y rara vez mencionan su creencia en Jesús. Otros son más vocales y fácilmente le dicen a la gente que son cristianos. Para Jesús, hay otra manera de reconocer si uno es un discípulo. Les dice a sus amigos que todos sabrán que son discípulos si se aman los unos a los otros. El amor al que Jesús nos llama no es solo un amor terrenal. No se trata solo de hacer cosas buenas por las personas o incluso de tener pensamientos positivos sobre otras personas. El amor de Jesús es amor divino. En pocas palabras, Jesús se hizo humano para que podamos llegar a ser divinos. Estamos llamados a mirar al mundo, a las personas y a nosotros mismos como lo hace Dios. Esto requiere compasión incondicional y mucha misericordia y perdón. No podemos hacer esto solos. Es por eso que el Cristo resucitado permanece con nosotros, especialmente a través de la Eucaristía, para ayudarnos a convertirnos en quien Él es. Si se hace correctamente, no habrá duda sobre quién tiene nuestra lealtad.

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

Recientemente estuve leyendo un artículo sobre los aspectos reales del amor verdadero. El psicólogo que escribió el artículo dijo que muchas personas se esconden detrás de las palabras "Te amo". Pueden empezar a creer que si lo dicen suficientes veces simplemente se convertirá en realidad.

Jesús afirmó que el mundo conocería a sus discípulos por el hecho de que se amarían unos a otros. En la Iglesia, hablamos de amarnos unos a otros con bastante frecuencia. Yo espero que alguien pueda decir que soy un discípulo de Jesús por la forma en que amo a los demás. Sin embargo, esa esperanza es algo que tengo que mantener en el centro de mi mente porque temo, con demasiada frecuencia, que hablo más del amor que de lo que actuó por amor.

Como cristianos, podemos encontrarnos escondiéndonos detrás de nuestras palabras. La historia, desafortunadamente, nos ha demostrado que nuestro testimonio de acción no siempre ha sido lo suficientemente profundo. El mundo seguramente sabrá a quién servimos si amamos como Jesús, actuamos como Jesús y servimos a otros como Jesús. Nuestra corresponsabilidad dará testimonio del poder transformador de Jesucristo y atraeremos a otros hacia Él. Nuestro amor será un instrumento de nuestra evangelización. Nuestras palabras se harán verdaderas, no porque las dijimos lo suficiente, sino porque son verdaderas.

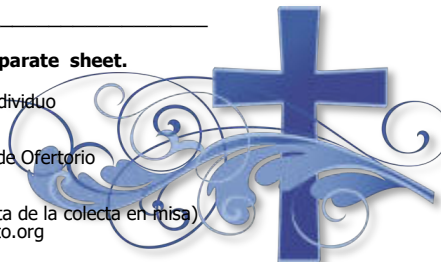

聖婦李達（五月二十二日）

主曆一三八一年，聖李達生於亞本嫩山區的洛伯果城。李達自幼非常熱心，很早就有獻身事主的志願。可是當父母為她擇配的時候，她完全服從，因為她知道天主聖意要這樣做。丈夫性情暴戾，喜怒無常，生活放蕩，整天打罵妻子。一連十八年，李達逆來順受，始終沒有一句怨言。兩個兒子漸漸長大，不幸也沾染了父親的惡習。李達每日以淚洗面，哀求上主保全他們的靈魂清白無損。

後來，丈夫良心發現，立志改過，求妻子寬恕。李達很欣喜今後的家庭生活，將可以好一點。不料福無雙至，有一天，丈夫在外面同別人發生爭執，動起武來，身受重傷，抬到家裏，已經氣絕了。可是李達的兩個兒子立誓要替父報仇。李達竭力勸兒子們不可殺人，兒子們少年氣盛，不肯聽母親的話。李達無法可想，就祈求上主，阻止兒子們犯殺人的大罪。果然，兩個兒子突患重病，無法執行報仇的計劃。李達衣不解帶，侍候他們，目的想勸他們改過，寬恕仇人。兒子們臨死前辦了妥當的告解，表示寬恕仇人，所以死的時候，靈魂很妥當。

李達夫死子亡，孑然一身，萬念俱灰，重萌棄家的意念。她申請入加西亞女修院。誰知會章規定，已嫁的婦女，不能入院修道。李達申請了三次都被駁回。最後，修會當局破例批准她入院修道。李達在修院裏，一如過去在家裏一樣，謙遜服從。關於額外的苦行，院規沒有硬性規定，讓各修女自由決定，應做些什麼苦行。在這一方面，李達毫不顧惜自己的身體，總是選擇最嚴的苦行。

她於主曆一四五七年五月廿二日安逝。

St. Rita of Cascia (May 22)

Rita was born in 1381 in the city of Roccaporena, a small suburb of Cascia. She was married at age twelve to a nobleman named Paolo Mancini. Her parents arranged her marriage, a common practice at the time, despite her repeated requests to be allowed to enter a convent of religious sisters. Her husband was known to be a rich, quick-tempered, immoral man, who had many enemies in the region of Cascia.

Rita endured her husband's insults, physical abuse, and infidelities for many years. Through humility, kindness, and patience, Rita was able to convert her husband into a better person and eventually had two sons. Unfortunately, her husband had a dispute and fight with others outside and was mortally wounded. Rita's sons wished to revenge their father's murder. Rita, fearing that her sons would lose their souls, tried to persuade them from retaliating, but to no avail. Accordingly, she petitioned God to take her sons rather than submit them to possible mortal sin and murder. Her sons died of dysentery a year later, which pious Catholics believe was God's answer to her prayer, taking them by natural death rather than risk them committing a mortal sin punishable by Hell.

After the deaths of her husband and sons, Rita desired to enter the monastery of Saint Mary Magdalene in Cascia but was turned away because she was already married. In the monastery, Rita is as humbly obedient as she used to be at home. Regarding the extra austerity, there is no hard and fast rule in the monastery, so that the nuns are free to decide what to do. In this respect, Rita does not care about her own body, always chooses the strictest ascetic. She died peacefully on May 22, 1457.
