

How will you renew your commitment to prayer, fasting and almsgiving during Lent this year?

Abstaining from meat and other indulgences during Lent is a penitential practice. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

AMDG For the 6th Sunday of Ordinary Time, this bulletin article explains that the second reading (1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1) gives us a great motto that we should post on our bedroom mirrors so that it's the first thing we see as our sleepy eyes awaken each morning: "Whatever you do, do it for the glory of God." Everything! Brush your teeth for the glory of God. Kiss your family "Good morning!" for the glory of God. Go to Mass for the glory of God (in other words, we don't go to church just for what we can get out of it). Do your work for the glory of God. Drive politely for the glory of God. 


... Gracias Dios





Reflexión de febrero

¿Qué es el Misterio Pascual?

El Misterio Pascual es la Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección de Jesucristo. La palabra "Pascual" viene del griego Pascha, que significa "Pascua" y Jesús se convirtió en el Cordero Pascual. (Analizaremos este misterio en más detalle auando estudiemos la Eucaristía). Decimos que el Misterio Pascual es un misterio porque, en Jesucristo, una nueva vida surge de la muerte. Como aprendimos en la última lección, en el Bautismo morimos una muerte espiritual y renacemos en la vida nueva de la Resurrección de Cristo. Esta es una de las razones por las que renovamos nuestras promesas bautismales durante la Pascua. El Bautismo da inicio al proceso de salvación de la muerte eterna y del pecado. Cristo nos abrió el camino al cielo mediante el Misterio Pascual: su Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección. En el Bautismo, nos convertimos en herederos de esa promesa de vida eterna. Como hemos aprendido en las lecciones anteriores, la gracia de Dios sana nuestra alma cuando pecamos. Algunos protestantes, aunque no todos, creen que todo lo que necesitamos para alcanzar la salvación es tener fe en Jesucristo y que no es posible perder la salvación. Los católicos no compartimos esas creencias. Nosotros creemos, tal y como Jesús nos lo dijo muchas veces, que la salvación no se trata de un acontecimiento aislado, sino de un proceso en el que debemos cooperar con la gracia que Dios nos ofrece.



MOVING INTO LENT

For about six weeks before Easter, Catholics observe the season of Lent. The first day of Lent varies, this year beginning February 17th with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a penitential season when Catholics practice prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as a way of preparing to enter into the Paschal Mystery and the celebration of Easter by renewing our Baptismal Vows and learning how to live them more faithfully during the Easter Season.

MUDARSE A LA CUARESMA

Durante unas seis semanas antes de Pascua, los católicos observan la temporada de Cuaresma. El primer día de Cuaresma varía, este año comienza el 17 de febrero con el Miércoles de Ceniza. La Cuaresma es una temporada de penitencia en la que los católicos practican la oración, el ayuno y la limosna una forma de prepararse para entrar en el Misterio Pascual y la celebración de la Pascua renovando nuestros votos bautismales y aprendiendo a vivirlos más fielmente durante la temporada de Pascua.

February Reflection What is the Paschal Mystery?

What Is The Paschal Mystery? The Paschal Mystery is the Passion, Death. and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. "Paschal" comes from the Greek Pascha for Passover; and Jesus became the Paschal Lamb. (We will study this mystery in greater depth when we study the Eucharist.) We call the Paschal Mystery a mystery because in Jesus Christ, new life can come from death. As we learned in the last lesson, we die a spiritual death and are reborn in the new life of Christ's Resurrection in Baptism. This is one reason we renew our baptismal promises at Easter. Baptism begins the lifelong process of salvation, or being saved from the eternal death of sin. Christ opened the way to Heaven through the Paschal Mystery: His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. We become heirs to that promise of eternal life in Baptism. As we have learned in previous lessons, God's grace heals our soul when we sin. Some Protestants (though not all) believe that faith in Jesus Christ is all that is needed for salvation and that salvation cannot be lost. Catholics do not believe these things. We believe, as Jesus told us many times, that salvation is not a single event that happens to us, but is a process in which we must cooperate with the arace God offers us.

Minuto rápido de la Biblia: Lea la segunda lectura de este domingo, la primera carta de San Pablo a los Corintios 1 Cor 10: 31-11: 1 San Pablo nos dice: "... hagas lo que hagas, hazlo todo para la gloria de Dios". ¿Cepillando tus dientes? Haz un buen trabajo y Dios será glorificado. ¿Tienes que sacar la basura? Hazlo por Dios. Al hacer bien las cosas pequeñas, entrenamos nuestras mentes y cuerpos para el momento futuro en el que podamos necesitar hacer algo GRANDE para Dios. ¿Qué pequeña cosa puedes hacer para glorificar a Dios hoy?



Quick Bible Minute: Read this Sunday's 2nd reading, St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians 1 Cor 10:31-11:1 Saint Paul tells us, "...whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." Brushing your teeth? Do a good job and God will be glorified. Have to take out the trash? Do it for God. In doing small things well, we train our minds and bodies for the future moment we may need to do something BIG for God. What small thing can you do to glorify God today?





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
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
