

This weekend we celebrate the 3rd Sunday in Advent (Gaudete Sunday). On this "Rejoice" Sunday, the Church gives us a "break" from the penitential spirit of

the season of Advent. Gaudete Sunday is certainly a welcomed beaming light of hope amidst the shadows of darkness cast over this year. 2020 has felt as if it has been a continuous season of penance. How are we then supposed to rejoice and remain vigilant in our prayer lives?

I found the attached picture to be deeply moving because of its' relatability and symbolism. In it, we see the Advent wreath shining in an empty church. Just off to the left we can see one of our AV members preparing for the Vespers livestream. In this year, how many feel as if you are alone and are overwhelmed by the stress-

es of this year? How many have experienced death in your families? Have you experienced a job loss? Do you worry about how you will survive? Have you been forced to live on the streets? Are you suffering in silence? Do you grapple and struggle with asking for help?


I look at this picture and imagine that this AV member walking in the empty Cathedral represents a multitude of people who are hurting deeply, yearning for answers, for reconciliation, for all sorrows and tears to be wiped away. The picture of the empty church, the stillness, the coldness, evokes an eerie feeling...a feeling

of uncertainty. Remember that the church is not merely an edifice...the church transcends the walls of the Cathedral. The church is the Body of Christ with all of us members of the greater Church...the Church Universal, the Church triumphant! We are all connected by our faith in Christ Jesus. For those of you walking alone...remember that you have a family here who loves you and supports you. Not just our Cathedral parish, our Diocese, but the Church Universal! And just as that AV member was walking towards the candle...towards the Blessed Sacrament behind the camera view...pushing forward...do the same...remain vigilant...

and continue in pursuit of the light...stay affixed on the Lord...continue to pray even if it hurts...always give thanks...remember that you are not alone.





As Christians, we are called to a life of prayer. This is not just during seasons like Advent, but all year long. When we talk about being prayerful everyday stewards, we are speaking about cultivating an awareness of God being with us at all times. Each day we begin by offering God the entirety of our day. Each night we rest in Him and hope that the hours that passed gave Him glory

During this busy time of Advent, it is hard to cultivate this life of prayer, but without it, we can too easily lose sight of the reason for the season. It is during this time of year we need to heed the words of St. Paul more than ever when he wrote to the Thessalonians, "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing." This is how we will be able to avoid the pitfalls of consumerism and secularism and keep our eyes fixed on Jesus.

Bring Jesus with you into the office Christmas party. Take him with you shopping for gifts in the department store. Be aware of him when you sit down to watch television specials you have seen every year of your life. Give him all your time and let his presence fill your every moment. By striving to be

connecting with Jesus at all times, you will bear greater fruit and the joy you experience will be much greater than you could imagine. You might even spend fewer dollars and spend more time with those you love, particularly the one who loves you the most, the Incarnation himself.
