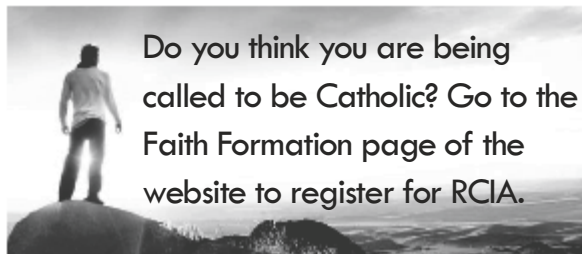

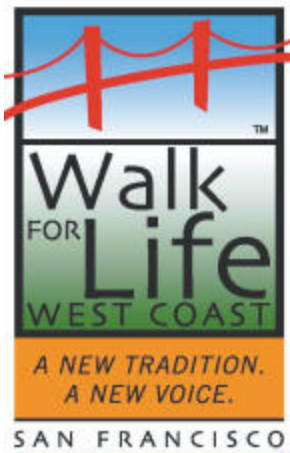

Journey of faith ... walk for life



One of my favorite moments with the Cathedral Young Adults happened almost exactly a year ago at the Walk for Life in San Francisco. The walk had ended and the Young Adults were spending the evening in fellowship as we explored the city together, eating ice cream, playing mini golf, and walking along the piers. The night was electric and we were talking and laughing as we trekked along. At one point we found ourselves along a quiet street uphill, with the city lights glimmering beneath us. The conversation and laughter died down for a moment as we were overcome with silence. I don't remember who started it, but someone began humming the Salve Regina. Before we knew it, all of us were singing the Salve Regina from the top of our lungs as we continued walking along the lamplit city streets in the night. It was such a spontaneous joyful moment. Afterwards we all laughed and the conversations picked up right where they left off.



The year since then has been marked with unprecedented dark nights as it seems the whole world has been torn asunder. There have been more tears this year than I can count. But there has also been laughter. In this past year I have seen the Cathedral Young Adults mobilize for the



homeless, give countless hours for the livestream, celebrate the birth of new life, mourn the loss of loved ones, pray together for hours on end, and gather virtually for evenings of joyful fellowship. I am grateful to be united with a community rooted in the hope of Christ, a light unto the world submerged in darkness. I often think back on that night in San Francisco with our merry group, singing Salve Regina in the dark. I pray that we as a Cathedral community may be able to

We are currently entering the season of Ordinary Time. So far, in the secular world, 2021 is turning out to be anything but ordinary. Much of what we see and hear in our world can be overwhelming. This present day “chaos” can be very disturbing and create feelings of loss, unbalance, depression, and isolation. These challenges to our society and culture certainly impact our spiritual world as well. We know that in many ways it is impossible to separate our lives into a spiritual side and a secular side. God doesn't want us to live out this kind of separation either. So, how does one grapple with the challenges we are experiencing in politics and pandemics while still maintaining a balanced spiritual life?

I always find a healthy dose of a broad perspective to be helpful. In the big scheme of things, many of our current day challenges will soon be forgotten or simply written up in a few paragraphs in tomorrow's history books. We turn off the television and social media, drink a glass of water, take a deep breath, open our bibles and realize that the clanging cymbals of man are simply noise and distractions that keep us from trusting in “God-with-us.”



We Catholics have so much to offer the world simply by being the spiritual amidst the secular. Our faith, love, hope, and trust in God will make 2021 not ordinary but extraordinary!

Lección 6:

Jesus: El Camino, la Verdad y la Vida

Who is Jesus?

This is our study this month. That we might know with certainty that: Jesus means in Hebrew: "God saves." Since God alone can forgive sins, it is God who, in Jesus his eternal Son made man, "will save his people from their sins". (CCC430)

SANTO del MES: San Pablo

A San Pablo se le conocía originalmente como Saulo, y era un ciudadano romano y fariseo. Incluso presidió las persecuciones de los primeros cristianos y estuvo presente en el martirio de San Esteban.

Sin embargo, Saulo experimentó una visión poderosa que lo llevó a convertirse al cristianismo mientras se dirigía a Damasco. Fue debidamente bautizado y tomó el nombre de Pablo.

Fue el máximo misionero, viajó por muchos países y tierras, predicando el Evangelio de Jesús. Estableció numerosas iglesias durante sus viajes e incluso fue encarcelado varias veces. San Pablo murió en el año 67.



SAINT of the MONTH: St. Paul

St. Paul was originally known as Saul, and he was a Roman citizen and a Pharisee. He even presided over the persecutions of the early Christians and was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen.

However, Saul experienced a powerful vision that caused him to convert to Christianity while on the road to Damascus. He was duly baptized and took the name Paul.

He was the ultimate missionary, traveling throughout many countries and lands, preaching the Gospel of Jesus. He established numerous churches during his travels and was even imprisoned several times. St. Paul died in the year 67.

Christ Is Anything but Ordinary

We're about to dive headlong into week two of Ordinary Time, and we need to admit, after the hustle and bustle of the holidays, things are indeed looking more ordinary, at least in our spiritual lives.

The transcendent highs of the Christmas season are flatlining a bit and the vivid imagery of the Nativity scene has faded. The solemn anticipation of the Advent season is by now a distant memory. Are you bored yet? Here's a secret: I think that Ordinary Time can actually be quite extraordinary, if we're really living out our baptismal call.

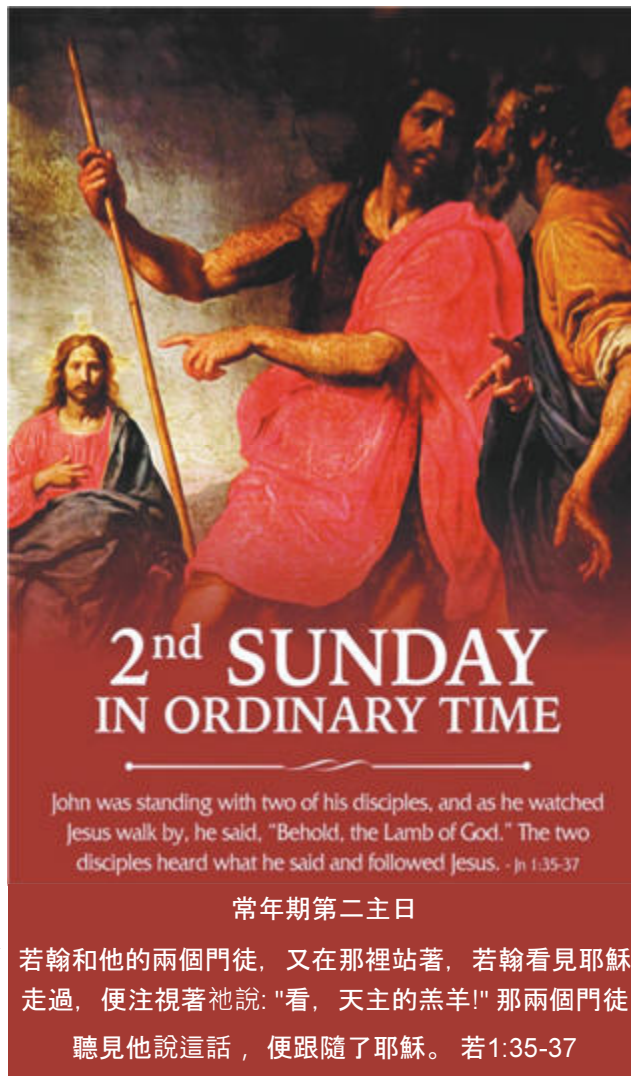
In today's Gospel, Jesus point-blank asks Andrew, who is following him after hearing John the Baptist's testimony: "What are you looking for?" He's asking us the same question. What are you looking for? Why are you following me? Is it for the Christmas cookies and the Advent carols? Is it for the King's Cake on the Epiphany? Is it for the feeling we get on Christmas when we just know God has done a wondrous thing?

None of those things are bad, but they are not what Andrew was looking for, and they were not what Christ promised him when he said, "Come, and you will see." Andrew was looking for the Messiah — the One who makes even Ordinary Time extraordinary. The One who can sanctify the longest and dullest of to-do lists, on the longest and dullest of days. The One whose peace can reign in our homes on January 25, not just December 25. Remember what you are looking for. Come, and you will see.

今天的福音中，在聽了洗者若翰見證耶穌之後，而跟隨耶穌的人，耶穌就直接的問安德肋：你們找甚麼？祂也問了我們同樣的問題，你在找甚麼？為什麼要跟隨我？是為了聖誕節點心和將臨期的頌歌嗎？還是為了主顯節的國王蛋糕？還是在聖誕節時，當我們知道上主為我們賜下美好救恩的感覺？

這些都不是壞事，但這不是安德肋所要尋找的，這也不是基督表面所回應他們的：“你們來看看吧！”安德肋是在尋找默西亞，能讓平常日子都可以與眾不同的那位。能聖化那漫長而緩慢的日子，

和聖化冗長而遲鈍的工作列表的那位，不僅是在十二月二十五日，也在一月二十五日，以和平統治我們家園的那位。請記住你們要尋找的東西。你們來看看吧！

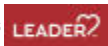

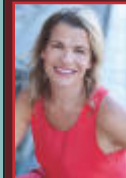
