STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today's Gospel reading from John recounts the familiar story of the wedding feast at Cana when Jesus launched His public ministry by performing His first miracle at his mother's request.

In the midst of the feast, the Blessed Mother noticed that the wine had run out and pointed out the problem to Jesus. Then, she gave the servants instructions that are equally applicable to us modern-day stewards, saying, "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus gives the servants a simple and seemingly mundane task, telling them to fill some stone jars with water. They did what He told them to do. And Jesus used their obedience in the accomplishment of that simple task to perform His first miracle, turning the water into the choicest wine.

Our Lord didn't have to include those servants in order to perform this miracle — He chose to. And today, 2,000 plus years later, He still chooses to include us in the performance of His miracles through our cooperation with Him in using the gifts and talents He has given us. What a privilege! Let us take care to listen to our Blessed Mother: let's examine our lives this week to see if we really are "doing whatever He tells us," cooperating with God to make the best use of the gifts He has given us for the benefit of those around us. If we all take this call seriously, He will perform miracles in our families and our parish.

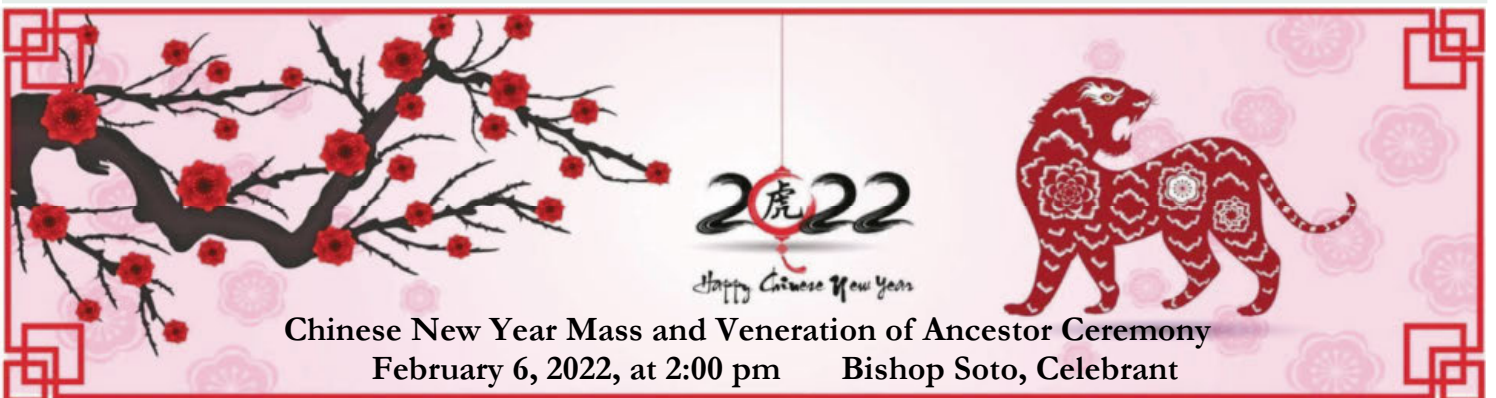
The Christmas season is now past, and we are already into Ordinary Time. I pray everyone has had a blessed and joyous Christmas and New Year. Although Christmas itself centers around Christ (as all times and seasons do) it's possible that we were overly busy, anxious, or in a dark space to truly appreciate Christ and Christmas time. Now that things are quieting down, it's a good time to take a quiet break, maybe for just one hour, and once again take stock of the many blessings in our lives.

So much of recognizing our blessings depends on our perspective and attitude. We can approach life and Jesus (Jesus is Life) as entities designed to increase pleasure in our lives. Things are good when that approach is satisfied by our expectations (we feel blessed), but when things don't go as planned, we become frustrated, angry, despondent, depressed, and dull. Or we can approach Life and Jesus with the awareness that they are not commodities to be gained, they are existence itself. God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is the entire meaning of everything. We are blessed because our existence finds its meaning in simply knowing that God made us and lovingly invites us to participate in His existence. We did not create God, nor do we invite Him to participate in our existence.

St. Paul reminds us in the second reading to realize that the Spirit has given us many gifts. He names off the big gifts like the gift of faith, or mighty deeds, or healing. As stewards of these great gifts, and all others, we are meant to share them so that everyone comes to know Jesus the Christ. We are encouraged as we begin Ordinary Time, to examine our gifts and see if our approach in using these gifts has been to simply increase our pleasure or to enter more deeply into God's existence. The first approach will always lead us to anxiety, disappointment, and loneliness while the second approach will always lead us to peace, joy, and blessedness.

El tiempo de Navidad ya pasó y ya estamos en el Tiempo Ordinario. Ruego que todos hayan tenido una Navidad y un Año Nuevo bendecidos y gozosos. Aunque la Navidad misma se centra en Cristo (así como lo es en todos los tiempos y estaciones), es posible que estuviéramos demasiado ocupados, ansiosos o estar en un espacio oscuro para que deberas apreciemos verdaderamente a Cristo y la Navidad. Ahora que las cosas se están calmando, es un buen momento para tomar un descanso tranquilo, tal vez solo por una hora, y una vez más hacer un balance de las muchas bendiciones en nuestras vidas.

Al comenzar el Tiempo Ordinario, se nos anima a examinar nuestros dones y ver si nuestro enfoque al usar estos dones ha sido simplemente aumentar nuestro placer o entrar más profundamente en la existencia de Dios. El primer enfoque siempre nos llevará a la ansiedad, la desilusión y la soledad, mientras que el segundo enfoque siempre nos llevará a la paz, la alegría y la bienaventuranza.

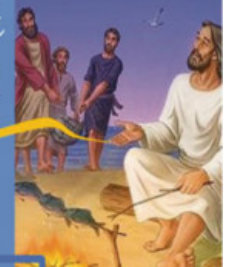

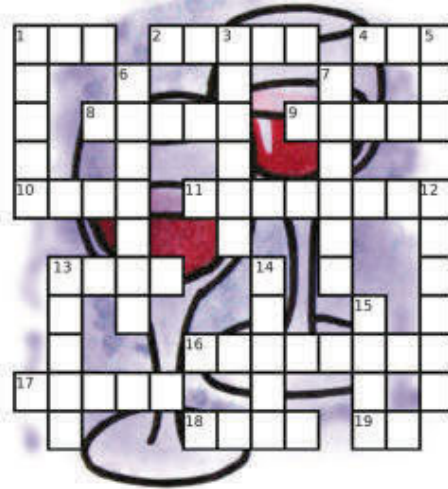

A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 6 Fr. Abraham Chiu (趙必成神父)

Concerning evangelization, Jesus never had to coax people to join the church. Regarding vocation, Jesus did not only report the good and avoid the bad to the disciples. He, in addition to all good things, he also manifested the cross to the disciples.

About entering the kingdom of heaven, Jesus clearly said: "the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and men of violence take it by force." (Matt 11:12)

The literal translation of "suffered violence" (biazetai) is "obtained by violence." The kingdom of heaven, in fact, is not a violent group. What Jesus called "suffered violence" refers to the individual's determination to repent. It is not easy to go back from a sinful life to the eternal. The process might go through tearing, sweating, and even bleeding. This strong force is the repentance of facing one's sinful life.

Faith is not used to coax people, but to live out the death and resurrection of the cross event.

「猛力奪取」biazetai) 直譯是“以暴力獲得”。天國並不是一個暴力團體，耶穌所說的“猛力奪取”是指個人悔改決心。

從有罪的生活邁進永恆並不容易。這個過程可能會經歷流淚、流汗或甚至流血。這股強大力量，就是面對罪惡生活的悔改。信德不是用來哄人的，而是活出十字架事件的死亡復活。

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.
