STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



Today's First Reading from the First Book of Kings, as well as the Gospel passage from Mark, both center on the actions of two seemingly poor and helpless widows who show themselves to be faith-filled and generous stewards.

In the eyes of the world, particularly in biblical times when there was no life insurance or Social Security, these widows were weak and dependent on others to take care of them. They each found themselves in desperate situations — one in the midst of famine with a child for which to care, and the other clearly impoverished. Yet, each demonstrated strength and generosity that distinguished them from those around them. From where did this strength come?

It came from knowing who they are, and Whose they are. These women must have known their security would not come from a good life insurance policy or connections to someone with a hidden storehouse of flour.

No, their security came from knowing they were daughters of the Most High God and from putting their faith in Him. They had no need to panic during a natural disaster or cling desperately to their menial resources. Their faith in God set them free to trust Him when all seemed hopeless. Their faith kept them detached from material possessions. Their faith allowed them to be brave and generous, to think of others despite their own trials.

These women saw themselves as stewards, not owners, of the resources God gave them, regardless of how much or how little they had. And acting as stewards made them gracious, generous, and mighty indeed.

I probably don't show it, but I spend a lot of time trying to figure out the best way to catechize people and help them to understand what I believe to be the most important parts of our faith. Some days, it seems that none of us are really getting to the core of what we are all about. I do take consolation when reading the great spiritual fathers and mothers, many of whom have trouble putting into words their own experiences of the Divine. After all, trying to make concrete and human the infinite mystery of the Divine will lead one to grasp for words that simply don't exist.

I often wait, hoping I'll hear something significant in different books, essays and talks that cross my path. I am often disappointed. Most of us are simply going around in circles trying to sum up the meaning of our lives by rationalizing why we do the things we do. As we get older, we feel the imposing pressure of our hypocrisy that we know who "Caesar" is better than who Jesus is.

Over the years, I find the greatest thinkers involving Christianity will lead me to the one simple truth that my encounter with Jesus the Christ is the one true path to understanding the mystery of the Divine. I can look for meaning and identity and comfort in the words and thoughts of many people, but ultimately the only true source of knowing God comes from the person of Jesus. Not only the actual Man/God but His words found in scripture. No one person or group of people will ever reveal God as clearly as Jesus, ever.

I know this is true and seems so obvious, yet I realize how little we struggle with trying to be friends with Jesus. I encourage every one of us to please pick up our Bibles and read from the Gospels the words of Jesus and how He lives and moves and has His being. The truth to everything we need is in that encounter with Jesus as He walked 2000 years ago, and how He walks with us today. It is the same encounter that brought joy and sorrow to our Mother Mary and all the disciples.

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Probablemente no lo demuestre, pero paso mucho tiempo tratando de encontrar la mejor manera de catequizar a las personas y ayudarlas a comprender lo que creo que son las partes más importantes de nuestra fe. Algunos días, parece que ninguno de nosotros está realmente llegando al núcleo de lo que somos. Me consuela leer de los grandes padres y madres espirituales, muchos de los cuales tienen problemas para poner en palabras sus propias experiencias Divinas. Después de todo, tratar de hacer concreto y humano el misterio infinito de lo Divino lo llevará a uno a captar palabras que simplemente no existen.

A menudo espero, con la esperanza de escuchar algo significativo en diferentes libros, ensayos y charlas que se cruzan en mi camino. A menudo me decepciono. La mayoría de nosotros simplemente estamos dando vueltas en círculos tratando de resumir el significado de nuestras vidas racionalizando por qué hacemos las cosas que hacemos. A medida que envejecemos, sentimos la presión imponente de nuestra hipocresía de saber quién es el "César" mejor que quién es Jesús.

A lo largo de los años, encuentro que los más grandes pensadores relacionados con el cristianismo me llevarán a la única verdad simple de que mi encuentro con Cristo Jesús es el único camino verdadero para comprender el misterio de la Divinidad. Puedo buscar significado, identidad y consuelo en las palabras y pensamientos de muchas personas, pero en última instancia, la única fuente verdadera de conocer a Dios proviene de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. No solo el Hombre / Dios real, sino Sus palabras que se encuentran en las escrituras. Ninguna persona o grupo de personas revelará jamás a Dios tan claramente como Jesús, jamás.

Sé que esto es cierto y parece tan obvio, pero me doy cuenta de lo poco que nos cuesta tratar de ser amigos de Jesús. Animo a cada uno de nosotros a que tomemos nuestras Biblias y leamos de los Evangelios las palabras de Jesús y cómo Él vive, se mueve y tiene Su ser. La verdad de todo lo que necesitamos está en ese encuentro con Jesús mientras caminaba hace 2000 años, y cómo camina con nosotros hoy. Es el mismo encuentro que trajo alegría y dolor a nuestra Madre María y a todos los discípulos.

NUESTRA VOCACIÓN CRISTIANA Comienza con el Bautismo

La semana pasada consideramos cómo los sacramentos de iniciación son el fundamento de la vocación cristiana. Esta semana nos enfocamos en la “puerta” a todos los sacramentos: **el Bautismo**. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica ofrece una explicación simple de lo que Jesús hace por nosotros en el Bautismo: “El santo Bautismo es el fundamento de toda la vida cristiana, el pórtico de la vida en el espíritu y la puerta que abre el acceso a los otros sacramentos. Por el Bautismo somos liberados del pecado y regenerados como hijos de Dios, llegamos a ser miembros de Cristo y somos incorporados a la Iglesia y hechos partícipes de su misión: El bautismo es el sacramento del nuevo nacimiento por el agua y la palabra” (CIC 1213). El bautismo es necesario para la salvación y ha sido prefigurado a lo largo de la historia de la salvación, para prepararse para su institución mediante el bautismo de Cristo y su mandato a sus apóstoles. Por bautismo, nos hacen nuevas creaciones, y con el apoyo de toda la comunidad cristiana, avanzamos en el camino hacia la salvación.

OUR CHRISTIAN VOCATION Begins with Baptism

Last week we considered how the Sacraments of Initiation are the foundation of the Christian vocation. This week we focus on the “doorway” to all of the Sacraments: **Baptism**. The Catechism of the Catholic Church provides a simple explanation for what Jesus does for us in Baptism: “*Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word*” (CCC 1213). Baptism is necessary for salvation and has been prefigured throughout salvation history, to prepare for its institution by Christ’s own Baptism and His command to His Apostles. By Baptism, we are made new creations, and with the support of the whole Christian community, we advance on the journey toward salvation.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS - The Look

Have you ever made the mistake of telling your spouse that you're out of something — only to see them respond with The Look? Then you realize it: of course, he or she knows you're out of butter. They knew it before a butter shortage was even a blip on your radar. We might go to the fridge and lament the complete lack of ketchup. Then someone moves a couple items and show us the ketchup that so savagely eluded us just moments before.

Sometimes, we all have “the look” when dealing with God. We tell Him our stores are empty. “I'm out, God! I can't do anymore! Can't give any more. Can't take any more. It's all gone.” But we forget: God is the keeper of our stores. He is the one who fills

them, and the one who watches as they empty. See, we don't know how much we are capable of loving. We don't know how much we are capable of serving. We don't know how much we are capable of hope. We see everything with our spouse's eyes. Only our Creator truly knows the limits of His creation.

Do you ever make the mistake of telling God “I'm done”? Be careful the next time you do. Chances are, He's far from finished working.
