STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



Today's Gospel presents Jesus' teachings on the two greatest commandments. Love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. And love your neighbor as yourself. Let's consider these "greatest commandments" as they relate

to three aspects of a Christian steward's daily life — the giving of our time, talent, and treasure.

The use of time refers primarily to our relationship with the Lord — in other words, our prayer life. It is vital to talk to God throughout the day, but if I really want to love Him with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength, shouldn't I make time for God "first" on my agenda each day? Not as an afterthought, but as a time I have intentionally chosen to spend only with Him.

The use of talents refers to the way I offer the abilities, skills, and interests the Lord has given me for the good of those around me. Doing so is a practical way to "love my neighbor as myself." At the same time, it is also a way to love the Lord with all that I am and have, since He has told us that whatever we do for others we are also doing for Him.

The use material gifts — or treasure — likewise demonstrates both love of God and of neighbor. When I trustingly offer a sacrificial gift to God through the offertory collection, I am showing Him in a very tangible way that He comes before all else in my life and I am putting my material resources at the service of my neighbor in the parish community and beyond.

When we live for God and others, we are living a stewardship way of life. And like the wise scribe in today's Gospel, we are moving closer to the kingdom of God, our ultimate destination.

ALL HALLOWS EVE (HALLOWEEN)

The Church's All Hallows Eve traditions are at best confused in the United States. Originally celebrated in the 4th century as the Eastern Church's Feast of Martyrs around Eastertide, Pope Gregory IV established the commemoration of All Saints Day in 835 in May. Later in the 9th century, it was moved to November 1 to counter the Celtic pagan feast of Samhain, the Druid's New Year. Part of the confusion over All Hallows Eve is that some of the traditions of the Druids are still in use today (Jack-O-Lanterns, black cats, ghostly costumes). *Halloween can still be a Christian celebration, kept as the Vigil of All Saints Day.* Halloween costumes should reflect gospel values. Trick-or-treat is just good, old fashioned hospitality; in Christ's name, we welcome all who knock. Walking on the streets in masks reminds us of our journey to heaven. Once our journey is done, we will take off our masks and see ourselves as we truly are—the beloved Children of God, the saints in glory.

On All Saints Day, we celebrate the countless saints who have shown us the wisdom and grace of God taking on flesh in people who have gone before us and in the people around us. As disciples we are called to follow Jesus where he leads us and, like the saints, to see the world with God's eyes. EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP- RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENT - The Daily Examen of Stewardship

“Stewardship” can get a bum rap these days. When folks hear the term “stewardship” from the pulpit, their eyes tend to kind of glaze over. “Here’s Father asking for more money,” they groan inwardly, “Get ready for the passing of the pledge cards.”

Christ refutes this idea when he gives us what he calls the greatest commandments — instructing us to love God and to love our neighbor. Now, Christ is a man who chose his words carefully. He meant exactly what he said — and he didn’t say that the greatest commandments were to tithe and to give money to charity. If he had wanted stewardship to be only about money, he would have said so.

Sometimes we are indeed called to show our love for God and neighbor in the form of a financial gift. But the concept of Everyday Stewardship — living mindfully in prayer,

grateful for our blessings, and gracious to our neighbors, committed to God, and accountable to each other — is about so much more.

I propose a twist on the long-held practice of the “Daily Examen” — a pious devotion wherein, at day’s end, we go over the events of the last 24 hours and discern God’s will. A Daily Examen of Stewardship might contain questions like this:

How did I love God today? In whom did I love Him? What did God give me today? With whom did I share it? What did I give to Him?

To whom did I reach out today? Who reached out to me? Where was God on my list of priorities today? First? Second? Third, fourth? — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS


還有更多遠不止於此可行的聖善生活。

我提議進行一個長期實行的轉變，就是“每日考驗” - 一種虔誠的奉獻，在當日結束時，我們回顧過去的二十四個小時的事情，去分辨上主的旨意，每日聖善生活的考驗可能包含以下問題：

我今天如何愛天主？在誰的身上我愛著祂？今天天主賜予我甚麼？我與誰分享了它？我為祂奉獻了甚麼？今天我聯繫了誰？誰又向我伸出手？今天的明細單上，天主排在哪個優先位置？第一？第二？第三或四？
