Among the more difficult experiences that Covid-19 has plagued us with, such as death and a failing economy, is the turning up-side-down of our daily routine. The inability to live life-as-usual creates anxiety and a sense of losing one's anchor. I believe many of us today feel a little adrift. The Church, for us believers, is one of the great foundations that give us the stability to endure the trials of life. The Church also helps in directing us to offer our lives for the needs of those we love. Some today feel that the Church is not responding to the essential needs of the people. This feeling is understandable, because the Church is so important. But, rather than getting upset or frustrated, it is better to examine what our true foundation is. The Church is a good source for strength and guidance, but our foundation is Christ. In fact, the Church could never be our foundation, because we are the Church. We must be founded upon something else: Christ.

Of course, Christ is not made adrift by the commotions of the sea, so we must make the effort to place our lives in His. As we make it through these difficult times, normalcy will begin to take shape. Even though we are still in full social-distancing mode, the Cathedral is beginning to steady itself. The many babies waiting to be baptized have begun their initial stages in their life in the Church. We are baptizing now, one baby at a time, with only parents and god-parents present. It makes for a beautiful, simple sacrament. As well, our Elect who had been waiting for the Easter Sacraments since April have finally celebrated their sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Eucharist. It was a beautiful ceremony even in the heat of our outdoor worship space. The first Eucharist for our children has also been calendared as well as the dates for our youth getting confirmed. These have been difficult adjustments, getting dates, limiting numbers of the faithful, and setting the rituals and symbols outdoors, but hardly anything impossible.

As we all try to stand on solid ground, we remind ourselves of the One who endured great moments of loss, loneliness, sacrifice and pain. Jesus, in his great desire to heal us and give us life, revealed the Father's love which both transcends our fears and anxieties while also being intimately in union with them. As we continue to adjust to the rises and falls of life, we must stand on the one foundation of Christ while raising Him up for the world to see.

Entre las experiencias más difíciles con las que nos ha plagado Covid-19, como la muerte y una economía en decadencia, se encuentra el cambio de nuestra rutina diaria. La incapacidad de vivir la vida como de costumbre crea ansiedad y una sensación de perder el ancla. Creo que muchos de nosotros hoy nos sentimos un poco a la deriva. La Iglesia, para nosotros los creyentes, es uno de los grandes cimientos que nos dan la estabilidad para soportar las pruebas de la vida. La Iglesia también ayuda a orientarnos a ofrecer nuestra vida por las necesidades de aquellos a quienes amamos. Algunos sienten hoy que la Iglesia no responde a las necesidades esenciales de la gente. Este sentimiento es comprensible, porque la Iglesia es muy importante. Pero, en lugar de enojarse o frustrarse, es mejor examinar cuál es nuestro verdadero fundamento. La Iglesia es una buena fuente de fortaleza y guía, pero nuestro fundamento es Cristo. De hecho, la Iglesia nunca podría ser nuestro fundamento, porque somos la Iglesia. Debemos basarnos en otra cosa: Cristo.

Por supuesto, Cristo no se queda a la deriva por las conmociones del mar, por lo que debemos hacer el esfuerzo de poner nuestras vidas en la suya. A medida que superemos estos tiempos difíciles, la normalidad comenzará a tomar forma. A pesar de que todavía estamos en plena modalidad de distanciamiento social, la Catedral comienza a estabilizarse. Los muchos bebés que esperan ser bautizados han comenzado sus etapas iniciales en su vida en la Iglesia. Estamos bautizando ahora un bebé a la vez, con solo los padres y padrinos presentes. Es un sacramento hermoso y simple. Además, nuestros elegidos que habían estado esperando los sacramentos de Pascua desde abril finalmente han celebrado sus sacramentos del bautismo, la confirmación y la primera eucaristía. Fue una ceremonia hermosa incluso en el calor de nuestro espacio de adoración al aire libre. También se ha programado la primera Eucaristía para nuestros niños, así como las fechas de Confirmación de nuestros jóvenes. Estos han sido ajustes difíciles, conseguir fechas, limitar el número de fieles y adecuar los rituales y símbolos al aire libre, pero casi nada imposible.

Mientras todos tratamos de mantenernos firmes, recordamos a Aquel que soportó grandes momentos de pérdida, soledad, sacrificio y dolor. Jesús, en su gran deseo de cuidarnos y darnos vida, reveló el amor del Padre que trasciende nuestros miedos y ansiedades y al mismo tiempo está íntimamente en unión con ellos. A medida que continuamos adaptándonos a los ascensos y caídas de la vida, debemos estar firmes en el único fundamento de Cristo mientras lo levantamos para que el mundo lo vea.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

Sinking in the Water

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone.

Matthew 14:22-23

How beautiful is that? After feeding the people Jesus went up the mountain to pray by Himself. Being involved in various ministries at the Cathedral such as the Youth Group, Young Adults, the Welcoming Committee and, during the pandemic, a lector, it seems sometimes I forget that I cannot give from an empty cup. I cannot give what I do not have. Jesus gives a great example. Once He was done ministering to His people, He went to pray and refilled himself with God. Spending time with God is the most peaceful and re-energizing way that I am able to continue to do His work. Whether it's in a moment of prayer, conversation, silence, or worship, it is so refreshing to spend time with the Lord. In my happy, sad, angry, or even tired emotions, I lift it all in prayer. In the little moments during the day or in ministry work when it feels overwhelming I remind myself that in the end it is all for His glory.

Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it.

Matthew 14:24

I am the boat and the waves are my emotions and thoughts that are being tossed around in my mind

when I do not know how to express my feelings. The ministries that I am involved in can be one after the other. Don't get me wrong, I love being involved in parish life. It gives me purpose and provides me a sense of belonging. Getting to meet and know the people of the Cathedral parish over the years has been a blessing. I would like to take some time to slow down and reflect on the different ministries and events. If I continue to "get up and go," I might miss the message that is there: to see the beauty that Jesus has created. Life also plays a role in rocking the boat. I personally have not been affected by the pandemic as some have. I pray for those who have lost their homes, jobs, loved ones and are struggling to get by.

When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Matthew 14:26-27

Jesus can be scary at times. He knows us better than we know ourselves. He knows what we are capable of. I have mentioned that during this pandemic I have become a lector. Although this was not by choice, it is a ministry that I am starting to appreciate and like. Lectoring for Mass is something I never saw myself doing, let alone in Spanish. I am not as confident in my Spanish as I would like to be. Lectoring for the Spanish live-streamed Masses at the Cathedral has helped improve my Spanish and pronunciation. It has

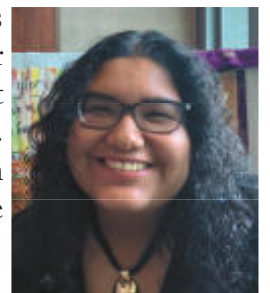
also helped me fall more deeply in love with scripture. Jesus is telling me to take courage and not to be afraid. He is pushing me out of my comfort zone to do what He knows I can do.

Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

Matthew 14:28-31

Peter started to sink because he was consumed by his surroundings and lost sight of what was in front of him, Jesus. I too lose sight of Jesus at times. When He calls out to me, I get consumed by the wind that causes the waves to become more visible. The waves of the world and society that fog up my view of the true meaning of life. Jesus is always there to catch me when I fall and get frightened. I shouldn't doubt the Lord either. He has placed me where I need to be even though at times I question His plans for me. Let us not be like Peter. Let us trust in the Lord for He knows all.



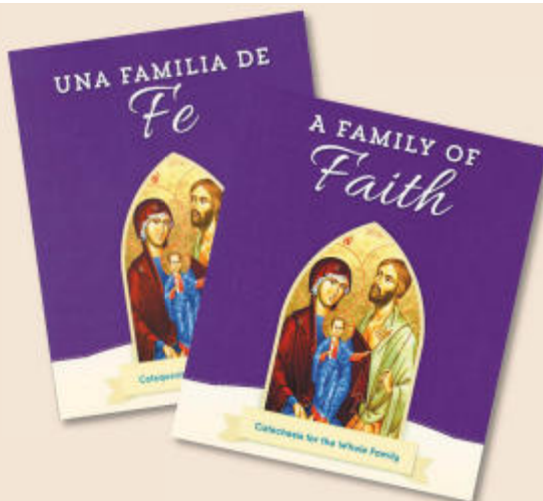
